This is a good time of year to review your tie-up procedures and the condition of the lines you are using. I suggest that you have two sets of boat lines. One set to carry on your boat at all times. The second set affixed to your dock.

Your attached dock lines should be tied to cleats on the dock and have clips on the end to hook to your boat. This way when you come back from a cruise your boat can be secured properly and quickly without the tying and untying of your lines.

The second set remains in a locker on your boat for use when you dock away from home. These lines should also be equipped with a clip on the end to attach to your boat.

Mounting cleats on the side of your boat will assist in attaching a spring line to control forward and aft movement at a dock. Ace Hardware has a great line of non-stainless-steel clips that work very well and resist rust. You will find this will create an easy and simple way to moor your boat at home and away. The side cleat can also be a U-bolt that is bent outward or a heavy duty eye-bolt. I personally mount two bent U-bolts

on each side (one forward and one aft) of my boat which seems to fit any scenario for mooring. I will be glad to assist anyone who needs help. Contact me at 352-343-9113 or <u>iclarke529@gmail.com</u>.

Covid-19 has changed the format of our traditional Christmas Banquet. This year we will meet at the Eustis north docks for a catered luncheon. Those who wish to bring their boats and eat on their boats will be able to

do so. We have also reserved the Eustis Community Center. It will be set up with 6' round tables (2-4 people per table) following social distancing. The room is very large and the tables will be spaced far apart. This is to accommodate those who do not wish to boat that day along with associate members. Some of the 2021 Board members will serve from the buffet to minimize contact with serving utensils. Masks should be worn inside the building except when eating. Masks are required as you go through the buffet line.

If the weather cooperates, we are planning on installing the Board outside on the docks and serving the food on tables outside the center. You can stay outside the whole time if you wish.

Members should bring their masks, eating utensils, plates, and drinks. NO ALCOHOL is allowed inside the building or on its grounds. You may also wish to bring disinfectant wipes.

Due to Covid-19, the Board has come up with some guidelines to ensure our members safety and comfort. Instead of "rafting up" we will now "anchor up". Boats will not be connected to each other. 1. We will drop our anchors and float at a safe distance from each other – a minimum of 6' between boats. 2. We strongly encourage our members to wear masks at events where we may need to get off the boat or when boats are less than 6' apart. It's a good idea to have disinfectant wipes or hand sanitizers on board. 3. June and July events will follow social distancing and minimize contact between boats. 4. While under way, boats will remain 50' apart. 5. Until further notice, there will not be a 50/50. 6. To avoid the contact with paper money, payments for the events will be handled by checks sent to 7. Carol Clarke.
