

8/22/19 Thursday: Arrive at Riviera Resort, 2760 Botts Landing Road, Deland, FL, (386) 822-5662, launch boats at Riviera Resort, and check into your room. Eight boat slips will be included with our rooms at no charge. Boat to Shady Oaks Restaurant for lunch. Restaurant is just off Route 44 at Whitehair Bridge. After lunch, we boat into Lake Beresford and stop by Hontoon Island State Park before returning to Riviera Resort for R&R. Dinner by car at Emmy's Time Out Restaurant (German/American &Thursday night special is Prime Rib).
8/23119 Friday: Breakfast in your room or Big Rig on the truck route. Leave by boat at 10:30 AM going north on the St. Johns River to Astor. Lunch at Williams Landing at Blackwater Inn. After lunch return to Riviera Resort or continue north into Lake George to Silver Glen Springs for a dip in 72 degree fresh water before returning to Riviera Resort. Friday night is fried chicken and fixings under the pavilion at Riviera Resort.
8/24119 Saturday: Leave by boat at 10:30 AM going south on St. John's River to Blue Spring State Park. Continue south to Swamp House Grille for lunch. Saturday night is pizza under the pavilion at Riviera Resort.
8/25/19 Sunday: At 8:00 AM go by car for Breakfast at De Leon Springs Old Sugar Mill. After breakfast back to Riviera Resort for boats and then take your tired, sun burned body's home!

Room Rates: 15 Standard rooms have been reserved and will be held until May 1, 2019. PYC members should call before that date to reserve a room with a \$50 deposit. All rooms have cable TV, full kitchen and WiFi.

Reminder to all captains: Please do not overload your boat with too many passengers. Most standard boats are only safe with four to six total on a boat. Just because a sticker on your boat says you can carry 12 to 14 passengers, that is not realistic. It makes your boat slow and unsafe. The St. John's River is a commercial river with large boats that create large wakes.

Boat captains call or email Hosts with names of members you have invited on your boat and how many seats left to be filled with PYC members with no boats on this trip.
