



TOON TIPS FROM CRUISE MASTER BUTCH

Are your fenders dirty, scuffed up while your boat is clean and shiny, then try the following solution.

Scrub your fenders clean and then coat them with the same vinyl protectent you use on your seats. Doing this will keep



them clean and shiny. I also suggest that you use dark colored (black, blue or green) fenders as they will not show scuffs and dirt like white ones.

As always, it is very important to have good communicatons while we are on the water. If you do not have a marine VHF radio I recommend that you get one ASAP. Information on the water about where we are going, where we are docking, staying in line or a mechanical breakdown, etc. is a crucial part of the Pontoon Yacht Club safety program. Radios can be purchased for \$100 or less on Amazon. Pleae get yours today.

Do you or anyone you know take their dog(s) on their boat when enjoying a cruise? Do you or they have a dog life jacket? If you have ever had your dog jump overboard you know the panic feeling you have in trying to rescue your best friend. I suggest that anyone who takes a dog on a boat should purchase a size appropriate lift jacket for thier dog. When properly installed, the jacket has a handle on the top middle of back so you can easily retrieve them from the water, Jim Clarke has a brand new, in the package, a large size, that he will give to anyone who contacts him. 
