

Page 9 COMING ATTRACTIONS – Make Your Plans ROAD TRIP TO HOMOSASSA, FLORIDA OCTOBER 11-14, 2022

Terry & Kay and Butch & Merrilyn are hosting a three-night trip to the Homosassa River staying at Florida Cracker Riverside Resort <u>www.floridacrackerriversideresort.com</u> (352) 628-2474. We leave on Tuesday, October 11, 2022 and come home on Friday, October 14, 2022. Our plans are to leave from the old Lake Square Mall parking lot at 9:30 A.M. on Tuesday, October 11th . It's about one hour and 15 minutes to Homosassa. We will launch our boats and plan to go to lunch by water to a local waterfront restaurant.

Rooms may or may not be ready when we arrive. Room rates vary from \$105 standard hotel room per night off the water to riverview or waterfront one bedroom with full kitchen from \$135 to \$150. If you have trouble with stairs, be sure you reserve a first floor room. If you plan to eat in, upgrade to a unit with full kitchen. There is a new restaurant on property for breakfast and lunch. There are many waterfront restaurants nearby.

We will make several runs out to the Gulf of Mexico and we will also be going inland to the Springs. If there is enough interest, we can set up a group airboat ride. (SUPER FUN!).

It is \$30 per day for boat launch, slip rent and trailer parking. Rental boats are available. Make your reservation now! Call (352) 628-2474 and let them know you are with the PYC Boat Club to receive our special hotel rates. There is no room deposit. You must cancel 72 hours before arrival or you will be charged for one day room rate. We are looking forward to spending time with you on the Homosassa River!

A Look Back in Time by Kay Weaver, Historian

March 20, 2004 Champagne Brunch on Lake Eustis: Twentytwo boats rafted up on Lake Eustis out from Sinbad's now known as the Pontoon Saloon.

Our hosts had plenty of champagne for everyone. A lot of visiting back and forth between the boats and a great variety of food was provided by all of our members. No one went away hungry!



I am sure we were seen by many passing cars and made quite an impression. A stiff breeze was blowing on Lake Eustis so we anchored on the far side of the lake to get out of the wind. Because there were not enough anchors out, we were blown away from the shore and it became very rough.

Lesson learned — when rafting our boats together, it is **required** that you throw your anchor out. At least two of our members' boats (and maybe more) were damaged at this outing and we were very lucky no one was hurt. The wind blew the boats in a semicircle causing the ropes at the front of the boats to become very tight and spread apart and this caused the rear of the boats to grind against each other thereby causing the damage.
