CAPT. JIM'S







Is your playpen cover or bimini top dirty, leaking, or looking bad. Then you need to renew it. Two products are required: 303 Fabric Cleaner and 303 Fabric Protectant.

Remove the bimini top from the frame and take the bimini and playpen cover to your driveway. Hose driveway off and lay out the fabrics on the driveway. I suggest doing one at a time. Wet the fabric with the hose or pressure washer, then spray fabric cleaner over the <u>BACKSIDE</u> of cover first. Let it sit for several minutes then take a soft brush and scrub over the entire top. Then rinse with a hose or pressure washer (use white tip); then turn cover over and repeat on the other side. Make sure to rinse thoroughly. Let cover dry completely (I hang mine over my golf cart). When dry, lay back on dry driveway and spray one to two coats of 303 Fabric protectant on <u>OUTSIDE</u> of cover. Again, let dry thoroughly before reinstalling on boat. This will make your top look new and will remain waterproof 3-4 years.

Caution!!! If using a pressure washer, hold nozzle approximately 2-3 feet above fabric. A very high pressure, sprayed close to fabric, could damage the fabric.

BOATING TIPS FROM YOUR CRUISE MASTER

For those of you who have boat trailers, or plan to purchase one, here are some tips to make your boat towing a more pleasurable and safe venture. For pontoons up to 20 feet, a single axle trailer is fine. With any boat length above 20 feet, a tandem axle is necessary. When purchasing a trailer make sure you have E or F load rated tires on the trailer. These provide very safe and cool running on the highway. To properly place your boat on the trailer (either single or tandem axle) measure the distance from the front of the deck to the weld on the end cap at stern of the pontoon. Subtract one inch from this measurement and adjust the winch stand as necessary. Set the distance from the rear of the bunks to the stops on the winch stand with the measurement that you have minus one inch. Next, measure center to center of front nose cones and adjust the bunks inward or outward as needed. You should mark the center line of the trailer so bunks are set evenly from the center. This will place your boat properly on the trailer. The next step is to use a hitch on your vehicle that will make the trailer ride level. Place a scale under the jack stand and crank it up to measure tongue weight. For a car or light SUV you should have approximately 250 pounds. A pickup truck can handle more. If you follow these parameters and you have too much or too little tongue weight, you must move the axel assembly forward or backward to achieve your proper tongue weight. All the above procedures are imperative on a tandem axle trailer. Without this procedure the trailer will have uneven weight distribution between the front and rear axle and therefore will tow erratically and cause severe wear of the tires.

If you have canvas on your boat with snaps and they have come off or come apart this is a simple repair you can do yourself. You can buy a kit to do this repair with snaps and tools from West Marine, Overton's or your local marine supplier and you can replace those snaps very quickly, easy fix, easy repair.


