This Policy does not limit any provisions of the Cajun Commissary L3C Web/Online “Sites, Services, and/or Materials” Notice and Disclaimer.

This Privacy Policy also does not supersede or affect the terms of any policy or agreement between you and any third-party (for example, Amazon, Google, Facebook®, etc.). Please make sure that you read and understand the terms of any privacy policies that you enter into with parties other than the Cajun Commissary, as those policies – and not this Policy – explain how your personal information is used by such other third-parties.

This Policy does not apply to any information you may provide to us through other means (for example, at a live event, via mail, or via telephone). Likewise, this Policy does not apply to information collected directly or indirectly by our third-party service providers, such as credit card processors.

PLEASE READ THIS CAREFULLY. THIS DOCUMENT IS LEGALLY BINDING AND IMPACTS YOUR RIGHTS.

Information We Collect

We may collect personal data that you provide to us. This may include your contact information, such as your name, email, and/or address, as well as demographic information such as your geo-location, age, sex, and marital status. We will only collect credit card information when you elect to purchase goods or services.

We may also collect information about your system and devices and how you use our web/online Sites, Services and/or Materials. We use analytic and reporting technologies to record non-personal information such as domain and host names, browser software, operating system types, page views, clickstream patterns, and the dates and times you access our sites. We may use a variety of methods for automatically collecting such “passive” information.

We sometimes supplement the information that we collect with information from other sources. Such outside information includes (but is not limited to) updated delivery and address information from carriers, page-view information, search term and search result information, site usage, credit history and information from credit bureaus. We may also collect personal information you choose to make available through social networking sites including, but not limited to, Amazon, Google, Facebook, etc.

We may contract with third-party vendors to help manage, monitor and optimize the data collected on our sites and through our services as well as and to help us measure the effectiveness of our services. To do this, we may use log files, web beacons and cookies. We may obtain information about the Internet protocol (IP) address from which you access our Sites, Services and/or Materials. Your IP address does not tell us who you are. If you have the settings on your browser set accordingly, we will use cookies to track some of your information from your browser or mobile device. We may link personal information with cookies. Our advertisers and third-party service providers may also assign their own cookies to your devices, a process we do not control. You have the option to set your web browser to reject cookies; if you do so, some

features of our web/online Sites, Services and/or Materials will not work. You should check the documentation of your browser to learn how to disable cookies.

We do not knowingly collect or solicit personal information from anyone under the age of 13 or knowingly allow such persons to register. If you are under 13, please do not attempt to register or send any information about yourself to us. In the event that we learn that we have collected personal information from a child under age 13 without verification of parental consent, we will delete that information as quickly as possible. How We Use the Information We Collect

We may disclose information (including personally identifiable information) about you to our affiliates. We may use aggregated personal information to determine the demographic composition of our user base and to distribute statistics and general marketplace information. We may disclose aggregated user statistics in order to describe our services to prospective advertisers and other third parties, for lawful purposes.

We may send you service-related announcements; from time to time we may also use your name and email address to deliver notifications and advertising regarding services (both ours and those provided by others) that we think you may find valuable. If you do not wish to receive them, you have the option to “op-out.”

As needed we may also disclose information we collect to third-party service providers we retain to provide goods and services to us, including but not limited to reports, analyses, technical support, hosting and maintenance, credit card processing, sending emails on our behalf, fraud screening and developing applications. We cannot guarantee that such third parties will not disclose your personal information.

This Privacy Policy does not cover the use of cookies or other tracking technologies by any of our advertisers. Advertisements are sometimes delivered directly by third-party advertisers. They automatically receive your IP address when this happens. These third-party advertisers may also upload cookies to your computer or use other technologies such as JavaScript to measure the effectiveness of their ads and to personalize advertising content. Doing this allows the advertising network to recognize your computer each time they send you an advertisement in order to measure the effectiveness of their ads and to personalize advertising content. In this way, they may compile information about where individuals using your computer or browser saw their advertisements and determine which advertisements are clicked. The Cajun Commissary does not have access to or control of the cookies that may be placed by the third-party advertisers.

We may sell information we collect in conjunction with the disposition of assets in bankruptcy and/or through merger or acquisition. In the event Cajun Commissary goes through a business transition, such as a merger or acquisition by or with another company, or sale of all or a portion of our assets, your personal information will likely be among the assets transferred.

We reserve the right to disclose your personal information if required to do so by law or in the good faith belief that such action is necessary to: (a) comply with the law or with legal process or government request served on us; (b) protect and defend our rights or property; or (c) act under exigent circumstances to protect the personal safety of a user of the Site, or the public.

Obligations and Remedies

The Cajun Commissary will keep your data for as long as necessary to fulfill business-related purposes, unless a longer retention period is required or permitted by applicable law. In some cases, we may need to retain data for a period of time after the termination of your relationship with the Cajun Commissary in order to comply with legal or contractual obligations.

You have the right to contact us and request to access the data that we process and use about you.

You may request that inaccurate, outdated or no longer necessary information be corrected, erased or restricted. Where required by applicable law, you may ask for your data in a format that allows you to transfer your data to a service provider as appropriate in the circumstances. Where the processing of your data is based on consent, you have the right to withdraw such consent any time.

You acknowledge that the complete privacy of your data transmitted cannot be guaranteed. The security of your personal information is important to us. We follow reasonable industry standards to protect the personal information submitted to us, both during transmission and once we receive it. However, people who try and bypass security systems; “hackers” are often very skilled at breaking through security systems, and therefore we can make no guarantee that your information will be 100% safe.

For your own information and protection on the Internet in general, please keep in mind that whenever you voluntarily disclose personal information, that information can be collected and used by others. Similarly, if you post personal information in public places, you may receive unsolicited e-mail messages.

The Cajun Commissary reserves the right to modify this Policy as needed, for example, to comply with changes in laws, regulations, Company practices and procedures, or to respond to new threats or new requirements imposed by data protection authorities.

Where there is a breach of any personally identifiable information, the Cajun Commissary will make its best effort to notify affected party/parties, any business associates, regulatory agencies, or any other required entity without undue delay in order to carry out data protection impact assessments as well as any necessary mitigating measures.
