INTO THE SNOW BANK. THE FRONT END ALSO SION OF THE LICENSE PLATE, WHICH APPEARS

COLLECTING EVIDENCE VISIBLE ON AND AROUND THE BODIES. ST. LANCE WAS SUMMONED. CAPT. BLANKENSHIP AND I PLACED EACH CEAN WHITE SHEET. THEN INTO A PLASTIC BODY BAG. WHICH WAS ZIPPED HUT. THE CARPET WAS THEN PULLED UP AND WE RECOVERED BULLET FRAGMENTS FROM UNDER THE CARPET NOT SEEN FROM ONTOP OF THE CARPET. WE ALSO ULTIMATELY HAD TO CUT OPEN THE LARGE LIVINGROOM COUCH AND RECOVER BULLET FRAGMENTS FROM INSIDE AFTER FINDING ENTRANCE HOLES. PHOTOS OF THE EVIDENCE WERE OBTAINED AS EACH WAS FOUND.

LT. DAYNE AND HICKMAN RETURNED TO THE SCENE. THEY ADVISED THEY HAD WENT TO THE HOSPITAL AND SPOKEN TO RUDEL, WHO WAS STILL THERE, BUT READY TO LEAVE AND GO INTO HIDING. RUDEL TOLD THEM THAT RODNEY MELTON HAD COME TO THE HOSPITAL AND TOLO RUDEL INFRONT OF OTHER FAMILY MEMBERS THAT THIS HAPPENED BECAUSE RUDEL NARCING ON THE PEOPLE IN CRESTLINE.

THE OFFICERS ADVISED THE CASE INVOLVING SUDET TOURS OF THEY STATE THEY ADVISED THAT GENERAL BEST HAD TOLD SOMEONE THAT THEY WERE "GOING TO WHACK FAMILIES" IN RETRIBUTION FOR THEIR ARRESTS.

FINISHED PROCESSING THEN SCENE, LEFT AND SECURED THE DOOR AT

#2 QUANITA M. REEVES, DOB:11/27/86, AGE 7. SHE WAS TRANSPORTED BY HELICOPTER TO CHILDREN'S HOSPITAL IN COLUMBUS, OHIO. NOTES INDICATED AN TRANCE WOUND TO THE LEFT BUTTOCK AND ARM, AND EXIT WOUNDS TO BELLY OIN AREAS (2).

TON M. REEVES, DOB:06/17/89, AGE 4. HE WAS TRANSPORTED BY TER TO CHILDREN'S HOSPITAL IN COLUMBUS, OHIO. NOTES INDICATED E WOUND TO RT. FLANK, AND ENTRANCE WOUND TO RT. BUTTOCK, EXIT O LEFT UPPER ABDOMEN.

!ARD A. WARREN, DOB:07/03/70, AGE 23. HE WAS TRANSPORTED BY ER TO GRANT HOSPITAL IN COLUMBUS, OHIO. NOTES INDICATED WOUND TO LEFT CHEEK W/ EXIT TO RT. CHIN, ENTRANCE WOUND IN ST W/EXIT TO RT. SHOULDER, ENTRANCE AND EXIT WOUNDS TO LOWER MEN, AND ENTRANCE TO LEFT BUTTOCK W/EXIT TO LEFT GROIN.
