A BRIEF GRIFFIN HISTORY

The Griffin Players began life in 1934, as the Theatrical Section of Vauxhall Motor Group. Not much is known about the early productions, other than information found on a single page of a programme from a 1936 Variety Show.

Only five years into the running of the group, the world was at war and the first of many challenges to face the society began. Vauxhall Motor Group began manufacturing tanks, armoured vehicles and the first 12 jet engines to be manufactured in the UK.

To keep up morale, the Theatrical section partnered with the Male Voice and Girls Choirs and the Concert section to form 'The Wyverns', an entertainment society that performed throughout the local area, as well as performing at Service Camps and Hospitals to over 3000 service men and women.

After the War, the society went from strength to strength, earning accolades and awards, with many of their productions being highly

popular with critics. In 1971, the society was running out of personnel and ideas, and in 1972 decided to take an extended hiatus.

It was to be 4 years before the Theatrical Section was to be reborn. In 1976, after gaining traction from the Vauxhall Mirror, Tom Redfearn, Steve Morris and Bryan Millin reignited the Theatrical section, and in 1977 produced William Douglas Home's "Lloyd George knew my Father". After a few more productions and once again gaining more loyal members, it was decided a rebranding was required. In 1979, The Griffin Players performed their first production under this new name. Agatha Christie's "And Then There Were None".

In 1980, Vauxhall Motors announced that they were unable to fund a trip to a local pantomime for the employees and families to enjoy, so The Griffins took on the challenge, first producing Alice in Winter Wonderland, a mini panto, before producing their first traditional pantomime, Cinderella, in 1981. This is a tradition that The Griffins still have to this day!

1983 saw the societies first foray into Musical Theatre with the hit show, Grease. This began a long standing love of musical theatre, which we are celebrating in this concert.

In 2017, The Griffins departed from Vauxhall Motors and became a completely separate entity. This meant losing our fabulous workshop area, affectionately known as 'The Shed of Dreams'. Many of our incredibly high quality sets were built and painted by Gary Nash in that workshop. The society briefly moved to a new home at Heathfields School in Caddington, where again The Griffins had a wonderful workshop area as well as rehearsal venue. However after a few years, the society were to rehome once again, losing the workshop spaces completely and having to store all set within a Garage area.

During the COVID pandemic, due to theatres not being open and the society needing to reduce outgoings, a more economical storage unit was discovered and The Griffins once again moved to their current storage area during the summer of 2020 (socially distanced of course)!

The rehearsal home of The Griffins became Bushmead Community Hub, who have been amazing to work with. They always ensure a clean suitable work space for rehearsals, and The Griffins are incredibly grateful for the support that Bushmead Community Hub have provided over the years.

The Griffins always aim to be a society for the community and are honoured to work alongside Active Luton and Epic Luton to provide theatre for families that would not usually be able to attend, as well as providing a relaxed performance for their family panto.

"Far too many to choose from: Stapling my finger to a plastic urinal just before the opening performance of a Slice of Saturday night springs to mind. Building the set for Sweeney Todd with Debbie Cheshire and Steve Wilson and making Audrey II puppets from scratch for the first Little Shop of Horrors were extremely challenging, rewarding and immense fun."




