# A NOTE FROM OUR DIRECTORS

16 years ago, I helped out with my first adult panto, Jack and his Big Stalk at The Little Theatre in Dunstable. Working backstage for that show made me fall in love with Adult Pantomimes. A year later, Richard asked me if I would be interested in writing the next adult panto with him and my dad, Trevor. We started writing the script for Scroode and it was such a fun process. In January 2010, The Griffin Players staged our little show, and the rest is history. I have been involved in all but one adult pantos since then, and now 15 years later we have decided to bring Scroode... The Naughty Christmas Carol back, new and improved. With a new storyline, lots of incredible new songs and another fantastic cast, this has been a joy to be a part of. I would like to say a massive thank you to Katy for creating some amazing dances for us to perform, including a first in Adult Panto, a Tap routine. I would also like to say a huge thank you to Ellie. It was a pleasure to work with you 15 years ago the first time Scroode came around. This time has been even more joyful than last time and the behind the scenes work you have put in have helped to elevate this show. And finally, to my partner in crime, Richard, thank you for letting me join you on this journey once again. You are and always will be Mr Adult Panto. Over the years, I have learnt so much from you and I will be forever grateful.

And so, all that is left to say is thank you to our audience and enjoy the show!!

While I appreciate Joshua's enthusiasm and heartfelt thanks, I must set the record straight on a few things. Adult pantos aren't just about fun and nostalgia, as Joshua suggests. They're about pushing boundaries and making a statement, not simply rehashing the same experience year after year. Joshua makes it sound like the process was all smooth sailing, but I remember plenty of heated discussions and disagreements before we landed on the final script for Scroode. It wasn't always easy, but that's the creative process. As for bringing Scroode back, it's not just a "new and improved" version. It's a radical reimagining, with an entirely new storyline and songs. We've taken risks and made changes to elevate the show, something Joshua doesn't fully acknowledge. Joshua's thanks to Katy and Ellie are deserved, but I think it's important to note that this production has been shaped by a broader vision. The tap routine may be a first, but that's just a small part of the much bigger changes we've made to the show. And while Joshua mentions me as "Mr Adult Panto," it's not about titles—it's about the work. I definitely do agree though that you have learnt a lot more from me than I ever will from you! So, yes, enjoy the show—but understand that this isn't just a revival; it's something new, daring, and challenging. And yes, I did just get AI to write my director's note, and ask it to completely disagree with everything above!

### CAST BIO'S



#### **Rodney Scroode - Laurence Sims**

Known for his unique ability to forget his lines while simultaneously ad-libbing entire new plotlines, Laurence has been a staple of amateur dramatics since that unfortunate incident with the prop sword in Romeo and Juliet: The Musical. When not on stage, Laurence enjoys long walks to the bar, teaching others how not to deliver a monologue, and his ongoing quest to find a costume that doesn't split during Act One. He'd like to thank his family, his fans, and the bloke who invented sequins—because, let's be honest, he really owns them.

#### Dame Fanny Fuzziwig - Richard Alexander

Since then, she's honed her craft in everything from Shakespeare (where she added her own expletives) to pantomime (where she swears they were scripted). When she's not sprinkling fairy dust and delivering questionable advice, Allanah can be found perfecting her side-eye and avoiding costume fittings. She'd like to thank the cast and crew for putting up with her, but mostly she'd like a standing ovation—and she's not leaving until she gets one.

#### Bob Catshit and Wailer 4 - Nico Whitney-Bamford

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
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

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
