

Mission

Inspired by the charism of Regnum Christi to equip and send out Apostles, the National Vocation Summit gathers Christian leaders with a heart for vocations and a desire to help the next generation become vocation apostles. Rooted in the holy Eucharist and working effectively in teams, the Summit communicates to the younger members of the Church this message: God has a plan for you, and we want to help you discover it!

The National Vocation Summit seeks to build a true vocation culture in any Christ centered community in the Church, building leadership teams of committed Vocation Apostles. We aspire that all participants to the Summit leave with a greater dependence on the Lord of the Harvest (Lk 10:2), a renewed love for the Church, zeal for our common mission, and an ever deeper hope in Christ and his grace for our lives.

VISION

Over the next years, we envision the National Vocation Summit uniting, forming, and sending out hundreds of priests, consecrated, and lay vocation apostles to impact the culture in five specific areas:

- 1) Focusing every form of vocational discernment on Eucharistic Adoration and an authentic sacramental life.
- 2) Elevating the gravitas of the universal call to holiness for all baptized (Lumen Gentium Ch. 4:39-41).
- 3) Making the topic of one's vocation a mainstream conversation.
- 4) Accompanying and equipping leaders to help young men and women to discern and fulfill God's plan in their lives.
- 5) Bringing greater unity in vocation work across all sectors of Church life, resulting in a vocational plenitude of holy Catholic priests, consecrated, and marriages.

Stephen D. Minnis, President Benedictine College An Experience of Building a Vocation Culture

Biography

A native of St. Joseph, MO, Stephen D. Minnis graduated from Benedictine College in 1982. He obtained his Juris Doctorate degree from Washburn University in 1985 and Master of Business Administration degree in 1993 from Baker University. He served as

an Assistant District Attorney and as General Attorney, Director, regulatory policy at Spirit Corporation before becoming President of Benedictine College in 2004. He was a contributing author to Inside the Mind: Achieving Success as a CEO (©2008 Thomson Reuters/Aspatore) and has given numerous talks on spirituality in the workplace and academic freedom to groups across America, including the Heritage Foundation, Legatus, and Catholic Charities. He was one of only five college presidents to be included on the Committee on Catholic Education Ex Corde Ecclesia Working Group and he was invited by the Vatican to participate in the 2012 Pontificia Comisión Para América in Rome. In November of 2021, Caritas in Veritate (CiV) honored him as a distinguished leader in the international community and in the Church with the organization's Papal Award.

Talk Overview

"There are varieties of gifts but the same Spirit." The Church's marvelous unity in spite of the diversity of vocations is a fruit of the gift of the Holy Spirit that raises up prophets, teachers, apostles and evangelizers each with his own task and gift for the good of the whole Church. Understanding the gift that is the personal vocation of each member brings out the joy and richness of belonging to Christ and working to spread his Kingdom. Thus, the diversity of callings does not create a power differential, but each is called to serve according to his own gifts, charisms and state in life. If all are united to Christ the Head, then "those parts of the body which we think less honorable we invest with the greater honor" (1 Cor 12).

Dr. Andrew Lichtenwalner, Director of the Office of Evangelization and Discipleship Archdiocese of Atlanta

Pursued by Love: Rediscovering the Universal Call to Holiness and the Beauty of Vocations in the Church

Biography

Andy is the Director of the Office of Evangelization and Discipleship in the Archdiocese of Atlanta. He serves on the Family

Rosary board of Holy Cross Family Ministries, the board of Life-Giving Wounds, and the advisory committee for Newman Ministry. He was also a member of the advisory committee for Chesterton Academy of Atlanta. His faith was nurtured through family life and the love of his parents and siblings, with the support of Catholic schools, campus ministries, and parish life in the Archdiocese of Atlanta. After taking time in college (University of Georgia) to discern the Lord's call, Andy married his college sweetheart, earned an MA and PhD in theology (University of Dallas and The Catholic University of America, respectively), and worked for the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops for twelve years before returning home to Georgia. Andy and his wife are blessed with four living children, with three little ones entrusted to the Lord.

Talk Overview

Clericalism is a direct result of looking at the vocation and authority of priests from a secular point of view. For the Secular mind, power and prestige are the marks of authority. Only when we remember Christ's words "the greatest among you must be your servant" can the authority of the clergy be correctly understood. This understanding also frees the lay faithful to exercise their true role as followers of Christ without seeking to supplant or act as substitute clerics.

Father John Van Dorpe, LC Regional Vocation Director Discernment for Action: Docility to the Holy Spirit

Biography

Fr. John is from a large Catholic family from Dayton, OH. He felt the call early on, and decided to leave home for a pre-seminary high school in New Hampshire for his freshman year. After graduating, he joined the novitiate of the Legionaries of Christ and was sent to Dublin, Ireland where he made his first vows in 2009. His studies have

brought him to Connecticut, New York, and a total of six years in Rome. He also had the chance to do three years of apostolic internship at another pre-seminary high school in Guadalajara, Mexico. He serves as the regional vocations director for the Legionaries in Atlanta, Georgia. He enjoys cheering for his favorite sports teams (all the ones from southern Ohio) playing sports, the outdoors and a good read.

He has also published: Ten Reflections on the Kingdom, Reclaiming Love: Connecting the Head and Heart, and the Dating Booklet for Young Adults.
