

The Lorenzo Driving Competition, Inc., the show committee, and the owners of property used for the Sunday Town & Country Pleasure Drive Pace, will not be responsible for any claim resulting from injury or injuries to any person, horse or pony or loss or damage to property incurred on the grounds, staging area or on the course of the Town & Country Pleasure Drive-Pace.

2.Entries close June 17, 2024. Closing date means entries must be postmarked on or prior to this date. *Due to scheduling constraints, entries may be limited in some divisions*. Late entries will not be listed in the program.

a. An ENTRY is defined as a combination of a horse/pony or horses/ponies, vehicle and driver, which has been assigned a specific entry number. Any change in this combination will be considered as a new entry.

b. Competitor packets may be picked up in South Cottage from the Secretary on Thursday 7/18 from 2 p.m. - 5 p.m., or Friday 7/19 through Sunday 7/21, 7:30a.m. to 4:30 p.m., ringside at the Secretary's Tent. Proof of negative Coggins certificate within two years of show date is required for NYS horses, within one year of show date for out of state horses; Proof of rabies vaccination within one year of show date is mandatory for each horse and/or pony entering the competition grounds. Proof of Flu/Rhino vaccination within six months of show date is required for each horse and/or pony entering the competition grounds. ADS Pony and VSE measurement cards required. (ADS 2024, Appendix GR-B)

c. The American Driving Society Disclaimer (provided in Prize List) must be signed by every competitor/participant including the driver and each person who rides with a driver on a carriage not only during the actual competition but including any time from arrival at the competition to departure. See Show Secretary for additional copies.

d. Every participant in the Lorenzo Driving Competition is responsible for having a knowledge of, and is subject to, the current ADS Rulebook. **All current ADS members will be required to pay a \$5 competition fee; non-members must pay a \$30 non-member fee.**

e. In case of horses/ponies being entered and not exhibited, entry fees will be forfeited unless a veterinary certificate is submitted prior to the start of the competition on July 19, 2024. **STALL FEES ARE NOT REFUNDABLE.**

f. The Show reserves the right to decline any entry and to return any fee before or during the competition without being liable for compensation. The Show reserves the right to combine, divide or cancel classes at its discretion.

g. The entry fee will be refunded if a class is canceled.

h. An entry MAY NOT switch from single to pair/tandem after July 1, 2024.



GENERAL RULES & REGULATIONS

(continued)

3. Any question or dispute not covered by these Rules and Regulations will be referred to the Technical Delegate and brought to the Judge or Show Manager for a decision.

4. A bridle with reins attached and passed through the saddle turrets must be in place when a horse is put to a vehicle. Failure to comply will incur elimination or disqualification (ADS 2024, GR Article 6.1)

5. Outside assistance is forbidden under penalty of elimination except in the case of an accident or to prevent an accident.

6. Wire-wheel vehicles are prohibited. However, with prior approval of the Show Committee, antique type vehicles equipped with wheels having long wire spokes and hard rubber tires may be used (ADS 2024, PD Article 206.2).

7. Golf Carts and ATVs may be operated ONLY by a person with a valid Driver's License.

8. All horses/ponies must be at least 3 years of age on January 1, 2023 to compete. All equines over 148 cm (149 cm with shoes) are considered horses. A registered horse of a breed permitting horses to be 148 or under may show as a horse, but not as a horse and a pony at the same show. Multiple turnouts must be shown in the class or division which accommodates the tallest equine.

9. Very small equine classes are open to any equine under 99 cm.

10. Pony classes will be divided such that those 99 cm to less than 120 cm will be considered small ponies and those 120 cm to 148 cm will be considered large ponies.

11. Mules and draft horses will be placed in horse or pony classes according to size and must be shown in Pleasure Harness and the driver is responsible for having the knowledge of ADS Pleasure Driving rules (not ADS Draft rules).

12. Driving aprons, hats, gloves and whip in hand are mandatory. Protective headgear is acceptable in all classes. "Period" attire is discouraged. (ADS 2024, GR Article 11)

13. Protective headgear is acceptable in all classes for adults. This applies to whips, groom, and passengers.

14. A Junior Whip is one who will not reach his/her 19th birthday during the current calendar year. The competition age of an individual will be the age reached during the current calendar year (ADS 2024, GR Article 2.7).

a. Due to the absence of a secure ring, only "Junior B" Drivers (NOT driving a VSE) or "Junior C" Drivers are allowed to compete. Consult ADS 2024, GR Articles 2.7c and 2.7d for Junior Driver details. There are no entry fees for Junior Drivers at this show.

b. Grooms must have reached their 14th birthday during the 2024 calendar year to assist in this competition.

c. While on the show grounds, whether competing or not, a Junior Whip or groom who has not reached the age of 16 during the 2024 calendar year must be accompanied by a knowledgeable adult horseman who is capable of rendering assistance at all times.

d. Protective headgear (ASTM-approved) is required for ALL Junior Whips at all times.

e. A Junior Whip may drive the same horse/pony/vehicle as an adult but must have a separate entry number.

f. A Junior Whip may not drive a stallion.

g. Juniors can only show in Junior Whip division.



a. Points will be awarded as follows: 1st place, 6 points; 2nd place, 5 points; 3rd place, 4 points; 4th place, 3 points; 5th place, 2 points; 6th place, 1 point. In classes with fewer than six (6) entries, all placing points will be adjusted for the size of the class. Five entries: 1st place, 5 points, 2nd place, 4-points, 3rd place, 3-points, and so on. Four entries: 1st place, 4 points, 2nd place, 3 points, 3rd place, 2-points, etc. Three entries: 1st place, 3 points, 2nd place, 2 points. Two entries: 1st place, 2-points, 2nd place, 1-point. One entry is 1 point.

b. To be eligible for Division Championships and Awards, a competitor must enter and be judged in every class of that division. Note that participation in the Sunday Town & Country Pleasure Drive Pace IS REQUIRED for eligibility for division championships.

c. Eligibility for the Jane Sadoff Memorial Trophy requires that an entry MUST ENTER and COMPLETE the Sunday Town & Country Pleasure Drive Pace.

d. No Championship Points will be awarded for entries in the Carriage Dog Class, Grooms Class, Drive & Ride Class, Costume Class, Ladies to Drive Class, or Gentlemen to Drive Class.

17. Novice Whip classes: Entries are ineligible for Novice classes after winning at least one first place ribbon in each of three ADS-recognized and/ or USEF licensed Carriage Pleasure driving competitions. Wins in ADS and/or USEF Carriage Pleasure Driving classes and high-point championship awards of fewer than three entries will not affect Driver or Horse status. A Novice Whip may not drive a stallion. Any Novice Whip driving a VSE will show in pony section of Novice Whip Division. (ADS 2024, PD Articles 214.2 & 214.5)

18. Obstacle Classes: see Rules for Pleasure Driving Competitions, Chapter 7, 2024 ADS rulebook.

- a. There will be no schooling on any obstacle course under penalty of elimination.
- b. Participation: ADS 2024, PD Articles 234.1 & 234.2.
- c. In the event of a tie, reference ADS 2024, PD Article 244.
- d. Cantering is not permitted in any obstacle class.
- 19. Stabling:

a. High quality stalls will be available on the Show Grounds at \$250.00 each. The full stall rental fee must be included with your entry. For safety purposes, all horses/ponies stabled on the Show Grounds must use these facilities.

b. A \$40 SEPARATE REFUNDABLE STALL DEPOSIT CHECK IS REQUIRED. When leaving, if stalls are determined to be clean, checks will be destroyed unless competitor asks stable manager for check prior to departure. Should a stall be found unclean, or if a competitor chooses to donate their stall deposit, proceeds will be donated to the Limestone Pony Club.

c. There will be no dismantling, cutting, marking, taping or otherwise damaging stalls. Nothing is to be hung from the stall overhang.

d. Damaged stalls will be the responsibility of the competitor and will be so charged.

e. The number of available stalls may be limited. Send entry and stall requests by June 17 deadline.

f. Indicate on the entry form if you plan to stable your horse(s) over until Monday, July 22, 2024. All stalls must be totally empty and cleaned by 8:00 a.m., Monday, July 22, 2024.

h. Please indicate if stall is for a stallion and, if needed, bring your own plywood reinforcement.

20. All waste material must be removed from trailer/stabling area.

a. The Lorenzo State Historic Site is NOT responsible for cleanup.

b. There will be a grounds and environmental fee of \$20 per Turnout with the exception of the grooms class and junior whips division.





GENERAL RULES & REGULATIONS (continued)

CLASS SPECIFICATIONS: Friday Timed Country Drive with Cones Course

Designed over land suitable for antique vehicles as well as modern marathon and utility carriages.

1. Clean and tidy dress. ASTM/SEI approved helmets are required. A halter and lead rope must be carried on the vehicle at all times.

2. The distance of timed country drive not to exceed 4.0 miles or 5.0 kilometers. Course will include a bridge.

3. No cantering allowed. If cantering occurs it will be penalized with 5 penalties added to score for each occurrence. (ADS 2024, PD Article 257)

4. There will be a cones course incorporated in the drive with 8-12 sets of cones, including a possible zigzag or wave and/or oxer. The Whip will NOT halt and salute when entering the cones course. Cones widths will be set at 2 meters for every turnout. Possibility of a few sets of cones being set at a narrower width of 190 cm. No separate time for cones will be recorded, but knocking down a ball will incur 5 penalty points for each occasion. These penalties will be added to the score at finish of the country drive. Elimination will occur if cones are driven backwards or out of order.

Scoring:

Winner determined by the Whip who comes closest to the ideal time regardless of being over or under time. Cones penalties converted to seconds and added to time at end of drive. All parts of the Friday Timed Country Drive are to be driven blind with exception of cones course.

The class will be judged by the overall impression throughout the show; no entry fee will be charged. The winner will be the turnout which, in the opinion of the judge, presents the most elegant effect.

<u>Costume Class</u>: Entries are judged primarily on overall creativity of the costume.

To be judged: 25% on overall impression of the turnout, performance manners, and way of going of horse/pony, 75% on the overall creativity of the costume.

<u>Antique Vehicle Division</u>: Open to vehicles built prior to 1940, vehicles can be restored, conserved or original condition. Drivers may cross enter to other divisions.

<u>Utility Division</u>: Open to horses and ponies put to a 2 or 4 wheel marathon or utility type vehicle not suitable for any other division or class. Hard type pneumatic wheels are acceptable in this division, no bicycle tire wire wheels. Class may split into singles and multiples if entries warrant. Attire should be appropriate for a pleasure show (hat, apron, gloves, whip). No cross entries with other divisions will be allowed.

Drive & Ride: Open to single horses and ponies to be shown in two sections.

- 1. In Harness: To be shown to a suitable pleasure driving vehicle, both ways of the arena at a walk, slow trot, working trot, and strong trot. To stand quietly and rein back.
- 2. Under Saddle: To be shown both ways of the arena at a walk and trot (jog) only. To stand quietly and rein back.

To be judged: 50% on performance, manners, way of going and suitability in harness, 50% on performance, manners and way of going under saddle.

Grooms Class: (house rules) Open to all grooms, who shall be dressed as a driver for this class. To be shown both ways of the arena at a walk, slow trot, working trot and, at judges discretion, strong trot. Must rein back and stand quietly. LDC will cover any ADS non-member fees for grooms participating in this class. *Only those juniors acting as grooms qualifying as "Junior C" may compete in Grooms Class.*

To be judged: 50% on reinsmanship, 50% on performance.

Grooms may also drive in Double Jeopardy on Friday.



CLASS SPECIFICATIONS: Sunday Town & Country Pleasure Drive-Pace (House Rules)

Review ADS 2024, Chapter 8

Participation is required to qualify for a division championship.

<u>Purpose</u>: To test the whip's skill in negotiating a country drive at a prescribed pace while also encountering items one might see while driving in the country or through town.

1. Competitors are allowed to use an alternate vehicle for the Sunday Town and Country Pleasure Drive-Pace. This alternate vehicle must conform to traditional type and design and be indicated on the entry. Absolutely NO marathon/utility type vehicles will be permitted to be named as alternate vehicle. Any competitors wishing to compete with a marathon/utility vehicle are instructed to enter the Utility Division. Decisions regarding alternate vehicles will be at the management's discretion.

a. The MANDATORY Town & Country Pleasure Drive Pace whips meeting will take place Saturday, 7/20, at 6:00 p.m., in the Formal Garden, prior to the competitors' pizza party.

b. Spares are required, but will not be checked. A halter and lead rope must be carried on carriage. (ADS 2024, PD Article 255)

c. Junior Whips are not allowed to compete in this class.

2. Course information and course distances

a. The course will be run primarily on Lorenzo site property. Some hills and fields will be utilized. There will be a wooden-deck bridge with no alternative route.

b. All equines will run the same course, distance approximately 3k or less.

c. Exact course distances and calculated times will be available prior to Sunday morning and/or announced at the mandatory whips meeting.

d. Order of go will be posted on Saturday prior to end of the day's classes.

e. A course map will be posted with the numbers, descriptions and locations of the town and country elements.

3. Drivers are to pace their equines so that they will arrive at the finish line closest to the ideal time. Course speeds as follows:

a. Horses: 13kph b. Large Ponies: 12kph c. Small Ponies: 11kph d. Very Small Equine: 9kph

4. There will be no mandatory trot section at end of course. Circling, deviating and stopping are not permitted and may be penalized by elimination.

5. The entire course and/or only the town and country elements may be inspected on foot or by bicycle before the start of the class (Sunday morning at 7 A.M.) NO motorized vehicles will be allowed on the course.

6. Those competitors and equines entered in more than one division have no restrictions on ability to drive the course more than once. However, they must adhere to the order of go time table. No guarantee that schedule will allow for twice around.

7. The ADS insurance will not cover anyone driving on the course at any time other than during the actual Town and Country Pleasure Drive Pace.

8. Scoring and placings: See ADS 2024, PD Articles 257, 260.5, 260.7, 260.8. Review Article 211 for canter penalties.

9. A required Vet Check will occur at the finish line. Penalty points may be assessed if an equine is deemed in distress.





Our sport of Carriage Driving has the valuable reputation of being welcoming to all, a sport where the welfare of the horse is foremost, and the thrill is in the partnership with our equines (regardless of the results). Protecting these ideals is of paramount importance to the health of driving.

In order for the sport of driving to prosper, our expectation is that every participant knows the rules, plays fairly, graciously accepts the final results, and always conducts themselves in a composed manner. It is the duty of all to behave in a manner that creates a positive environment.

Therefore, any infringement of the common principles of good behavior, fairness or good sportsmanship will result in disciplinary action. Sportsmanship infractions include, but are not limited to, the following:

- a) Abusive, or intimidating language at ADS Recognized Events.
- b) Refusal to accept Officials' final decisions.
- c) Intentional circumventing of the rules.
- d) Unsafe behavior while on event grounds.
- e) Damaging land or property.
- f) Actions detrimental to the welfare of the horse.
- g) Negative interaction with volunteers.

h) The use of social media, or any public platform, to personally attack the character or reputation of fellow competitors, organizers, volunteers, or Officials.

We all have a duty to each other and to our sport to display good sportsmanship.

When our members display good sportsmanship, it not only makes driving more enjoyable for all, but presents a positive impression of the driving community to the general public.

Let us always do the right thing for our equine companions, our sport, and our fellow ADS members.
