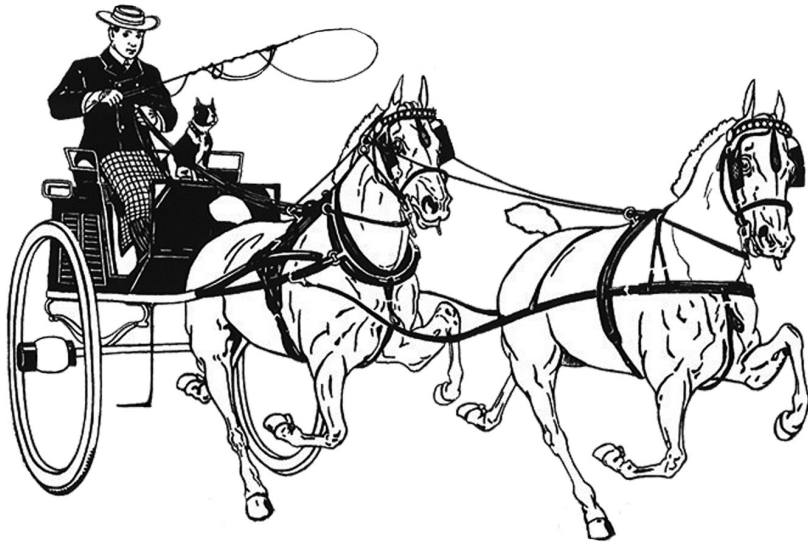

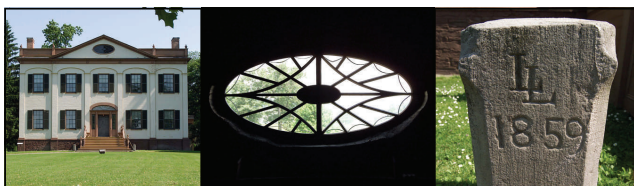

GENERAL RULES & REGULATIONS

The Lorenzo Driving Competition is recognized by the American Driving Society (ADS) and is conducted under the rules as published in the current 2019 ADS Rule Book.

1. The Lorenzo Driving Competition, Inc., the show committee, and the owners of property used for the Pleasure Drive-Pace, will not be responsible for any claim resulting from injury or injuries to any person, horse or pony or loss or damage to property incurred on the grounds, staging area or on the course of the Pleasure Drive-Pace.
2. Entries close June 21, 2019. *Due to scheduling constraints, entries may be limited in some divisions.* Late entries will not be listed in the program.
 - a. An ENTRY is defined as a combination of a horse/pony or horses/ponies, vehicle and driver, which has been assigned a specific entry number. Any change in this combination will be considered as a new entry.
 - b. Competitor packets may be picked up on Thursday, 7/18/19 from 2:00-5:00 p.m. in South Cottage; Friday, 7/19/19 from 8:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. in South Cottage; or on show days at the Show Secretary's Tent. Proof of negative Coggins certificate within two years of show date is required for NYS horses, within one year of show date for out of state horses; Proof of rabies vaccination within one year of show date is mandatory for each horse and/or pony entering the competition grounds; Proof of Flu/Rhino vaccination within six months of show date is required for each horse and/or pony entering the competition grounds.
 - c. *The American Driving Society Disclaimer* (provided in Prize List) must be signed by every competitor/participant including the driver and each person who rides with a driver on a carriage not only during the actual competition but including any time from arrival at the competition to departure. *See Show Secretary for additional copies.*
 - d. Every participant in the Lorenzo Driving Competition is responsible for having a knowledge of, and is subject to, the current ADS Rulebook. **All current ADS members will be required to pay a \$5 competition fee; non-members must pay a \$30 non-member fee.**
 - e. In case of horses/ponies being entered and not exhibited, entry fees will be forfeited unless a veterinary certificate is submitted prior to the start of the competition on July 19, 2019. **STALL FEES ARE NOT REFUNDABLE.**
 - f. The Show Committee reserves to itself the right to decline any entry and to return any fee before or during the competition without being liable for compensation.
 - g. The Show Committee reserves the right to combine, divide or cancel classes at its own discretion.
 - h. The entry fee will be refunded if a class is canceled.
 - i. An entry MAY NOT switch from single to pair/tandem after July 1, 2019.



3. Any question or dispute not covered by these Rules and Regulations will be referred to the Technical Delegate to be brought to the Judge or Show Manager for a decision.
4. The judges' decision shall be final.
5. A bridle with reins attached and passed through the saddle turrets must be in place when a horse is put to a vehicle. Failure to comply will incur elimination or disqualification (ADS Article 6.1).
6. Outside assistance is forbidden under penalty of elimination except in the case of an accident or to prevent an accident.
8. Wire-wheel vehicles are prohibited. However, with prior approval of the Show Committee, antique type vehicles equipped with wheels having long wire spokes and hard rubber tires may be used (ADS Article 206.2).
9. Golf Carts and ATVs may be operated ONLY by a person with a valid Driver's License
10. All horses/ponies must be at least 3 years of age on January 1st, 2019 to compete. All animals over 14.2 hands are considered horses. A registered horse of a breed permitting horses to be 14.2 or under may show as a horse, but not as a horse and a pony at the same show. Multiple turnouts must be shown in the class or division which accommodates the tallest horse.
11. Very small equine classes are open to any horse or pony 39 inches and under (9.3 hands)
12. Pony classes will be divided such that those under 12.2 hands (50 inches) will be considered small ponies and those 12.2 hands (50 inches) and over not to exceed 14.2 hands will be considered large ponies.
13. Horses may be shod with any type of shoe; borium or caulks are recommended for the Pleasure Drive-Pace.
14. Mules and draft horses will be placed in horse or pony classes according to size and must be shown in Pleasure Harness and the driver is responsible for having the knowledge of ADS Pleasure Driving rules (not ADS Draft rules).
15. Dress of driver and passengers: consult ADS Article 11. Driving aprons, hats, gloves and whip in hand are mandatory. "Period" attire is discouraged.
16. Protective headgear is acceptable in all classes for adults. This applies to whips, groom, and passengers.
17. A Junior whip is one who will not reach his/her 19th birthday during the current calendar year. The competition age of an individual will be the age reached during the current calendar year (ADS Article 2.7).
 - a. Only "Junior C" Drivers (ADS Article 2.7d) are allowed to compete in this competition due to the absence of a secure ring.
 - b. Grooms must have reached their 14th birthday during the 2018 calendar year to assist in this competition.
 - c. While on the show grounds, whether competing or not, a Junior whip or groom who has not reached the age of 16 during the 2019 calendar year must be accompanied by a knowledgeable adult horseman who is capable of rendering assistance at all times.

**GENERAL RULES & REGULATIONS (continued)**

- d. Protective headgear (ASTM-approved) is required for ALL Junior whips at all times.
- e. A Junior Whip may drive the same horse/pony/vehicle as an adult but must have a separate entry number.
- f. A Junior whip may not drive a stallion.
- g. A Junior Whip may enter Novice classes; if Junior whip is driving a utility vehicle he/she must show in the Utility Division.
18. Awards and Championships
- a. Points will be awarded as follows: 1st place-6 points; 2nd place-5 points; 3rd place-4 points; 4th place-3 points; 5th place-2 point; 6th place-1 point.
- b. In classes with fewer than six (6) entries, all placing points will be adjusted for the size of the class. 5 entries: 1st place-5 points, 2nd place 4-points, 3rd place 3-points, and so on; 4 entries: 1st place-4 points, 2nd place-3 points, 3rd place 2-points, etc. 3 entries: 1st place-3 points, 2nd place-2 points; 2 entries: 1st place 2-points, 2nd place 1-point, and 1 entry is 1 point.
- c. See championship descriptions for eligible classes.
- d. To be eligible for Division Championships and Awards, a competitor must enter and be judged in every class of that division. Note that participation in the Pleasure Drive-Pace IS REQUIRED for eligibility for division championships.
- e. All multiple classes: If entries warrant may be scored separately or classes may be divided.
- f. Eligibility for the Concours d'elegance and the Jane Sadoff Memorial Trophy requires that an entry MUST ENTER and COMPLETE the Pleasure Drive-Pace.
- g. No Championship Points will be awarded for entries in the Antique Vehicle Turnout Class, Carriage Dog Class, Grooms Class, Drive & Ride Class or Picnic Class.
19. Novice Whip classes (ADS Article 214.2): Entries are ineligible for Novice classes after winning at least one first place ribbon in each of three ADS-recognized and/or USEF licensed Carriage Pleasure driving competitions. Wins in ADS and/or USEF Carriage Pleasure Driving classes and high-point championship awards of fewer than three entries will not affect Driver or Horse status (ADS Article 214.5).
- a. A Novice Whip may not drive a stallion.
20. Obstacle Classes: see Rules for Pleasure Driving Competitions, Chapter 7, 2019 ADS rulebook
- a. There will be no schooling on any obstacle course under penalty of elimination.
- b. Participation: ADS Articles 234.1 and 234.2.
- c. In the event of a tie, reference ADS Article 244.
- d. Canterng is not permitted in any obstacle class.
21. The House Rules Pleasure Drive-Pace to follow Chapter 8, 2019 ADS rulebook.
- a. Competitors will be permitted to use, at their discretion, an alternate vehicle for the pleasure drive. This alternate vehicle must conform to traditional type and design. The use of alternate vehicle must be indicated on the entry blank at time of entry. Absolutely NO marathon/utility type vehicles will be permitted to be named as alternate vehicle. Any competitors wishing to compete with a marathon/utility vehicle are instructed to enter the Utility Division. Decisions regarding alternate vehicles will be at the management's discretion.
- b. The MANDATORY Pleasure Drive whips meeting will be at 7:00 am, Sunday, July 21. Course maps will be available.
- c. Spares (ADS Article 255) will be inspected prior to start of Pleasure Drive-Pace Sunday morning July 21.
- d. No junior whips are permitted to drive Pleasure Drive-Pace.
22. Stabling:
- a. High quality stalls will be available on the Show Grounds at \$155.00 each. The full stall rental fee must be included with your entry. For safety purposes, all horses/ponies stabled on the Show Grounds must use these facilities.
- b. A \$50 **SEPARATE REFUNDABLE STALL DEPOSIT CHECK IS REQUIRED**, refunded when stall is determined to be clean.
- c. There will be no dismantling, cutting, marking, taping or otherwise damaging stalls. Nothing is to be hung from the stall overhang.
- d. Damaged stalls will be the responsibility of the competitor and will be so charged.
- e. The number of available stalls may be limited. Send entry and stall requests by June 21 deadline.
- f. Indicate on the entry form if you plan to stable your horse(s) over until Monday, July 22, 2019.
- g. All stalls must be *totally empty* and *cleaned* by 8:00 am, Monday July 22, 2019.
- h. Please indicate if stall is for a stallion and, if needed, bring your own plywood reinforcement.
23. All waste material must be removed from trailer/stabling area.
- a. The Lorenzo State Historical Site is NOT responsible for cleanup.
- b. There will be a grounds and environmental fee of \$20 per Turnout. **with the exception of a separate entry in the antique vehicle and grooms classes.*
- c. Identified manure stations will be available on the grounds.

NOTICE: All dogs on the show grounds must be properly supervised and restrained by a leash. You must pick up after your dog.

The public offering of vehicles, horses, equipment or other materials for sale (except on Market Lane) is prohibited by State Park Regulations.

This form must be signed by every Competition participant or if a minor, their consenting parent, including each person who rides with a driver on a carriage not only during the actual Competition but including any time from arrival at the Competition to departure. I understand and agree that neither the American Driving Society ("ADS") and its officers, the Driving Event Competition ("Competition"), Competition judges, officials, workers, volunteers or organizing committee nor the property owners accept or shall have any responsibility of any nature whatsoever for accidents, damage, injury or illness to the horses, owners, riders, drivers, grooms, passengers, attendants, spectators or any other person or property in connection with this Competition.

I hereby expressly agree without any limitation or condition for myself and my principals, representatives, employees and agents: (1) to be bound by the rules and by-laws of the ADS and any local rules of this Competition; (2) that every horse, driver, attendant, groom and/or passenger is eligible as entered; and (3) to accept as final any decision of the Competition officials on any question arising under the ADS rules and by-laws or any local rules of the Competition. I also agree, without any limitation or condition, to hold the ADS, its officers, directors, employees and agents, and Competition judges, officials and organizing committee, harmless from any and all liability, loss, claims or actions, causes of action, judgments or demands of any nature whatsoever. I am fully aware and appreciate that equine sports, including driving in this particular Competition involve inherent dangerous risk of serious injury or death. By participating I do so voluntarily and expressly assume any and all risks of injury to me or loss of my horse(s) or equipment. I agree to release and voluntarily waive the right to sue the ADS, its officers, directors, employees, and agents, stewards, Competition judges, personnel, volunteers, officials, and organizing committee, including their agents and employees from and against all claims for damages, including money damages, for any action taken or otherwise any harm caused by me or my horse to others, including whether arising from directly or indirectly from the negligence of the ADS or the Competition.

I agree to indemnify and hold harmless the ADS its officers, directors, employees, clinicians, members, volunteers, coaches, representatives, assigns, Competition judges, officials and organizing committee, their agents and employees from any and all claims for loss or injury caused by me or my horse that occur during or in conjunction with this Competition.

I also agree that as a condition of and in consideration of acceptance of entry, the ADS and/or the Competition may use or assign photographs, videos, audios, cable - casts, broadcasts, internet, film, new media or other likenesses of me and my horse taken during the course of the Competition for the promotion, coverage or benefit of the Competition, sport, or the ADS. BY SIGNING BELOW, I AGREE to be bound by all applicable ADS rules and all the terms and conditions of this AGREEMENT.

Timed Country Drive: Designed over land suitable for antique vehicles as well as modern marathon and utility carriages.

1. Helmets required for timed country drive
2. A halter and lead rope must be carriage on the vehicle at all times
3. The distance of timed country drive not to exceed 3.0 miles or four kilometers.
4. Course may include a bridge.
5. No cantering allowed. If cantering occurs it will be penalized with 5 penalties added to score each occurrence.
6. There will be a cones course at roughly the halfway point of course with 8-12 sets of cones, including a possible zig zag or wave and/or oxer.
7. The driver will NOT halt and salute when entering the cones course.
8. Cones widths will be set at 80 inches (205 cm) for every turnout. Possibility of a few sets of cones being set at a narrower width of 70 inches (177 cm).
9. No separate time for cones will be recorded, but knocking down a ball will incur 5 penalty points for each occasion. These penalties will be added to the score at finish of the country drive.

Scoring: one penalty for every second over or under ideal time for distance of county drive. All parts of country drive to be driven blind, with the exception of the cones section which may be walked prior to the start of dressage.

1. Hard type pneumatic wheels are acceptable in this division, no bicycle tire wire wheels.
2. Class may split into singles and multiples if entries warrant.
3. Attire should be appropriate for a pleasure show (hat, apron, gloves, whip).
4. No cross entries with other divisions will be allowed.

Drive & Ride: Open to single horses and ponies to be shown in two sections.

1. In Harness: To be shown to a suitable pleasure driving vehicle, both ways of the arena at a walk, slow trot, working trot, and strong trot. To stand quietly and rein back.
2. Under Saddle: To be shown both ways of the arena at a walk and trot (jog) only. To stand quietly and rein back.

To be judged: 50% on performance, manners, way of going and suitability in harness, 50% on performance, manners and way of going under saddle.

Grooms Class: Class is judged under "house rules". Open to all grooms/ attendants that are entering only this class during this competition. The groom/ attendant shall be dressed as a driver for this class.

1. Only those juniors acting as grooms/ attendants qualifying as 'junior C' may compete in Grooms Class.
2. To be shown both ways of the arena at a walk, slow trot, working trot and strong trot.
3. Must rein back and stand quietly.

To be judged: 50% on reinsmanship, 50% on performance.

**CLASS SPECIFICATIONS: PLEASURE SHOW** (continued)

Antique Vehicle Turnout Class: Local Class. Open to all who wish to enter their antique vehicle, not a reproduction or modern vehicle. Vehicles must have been built before 1940.

2. A Pleasure driving class in which entries are judged primarily on the performance and quality of each turnout.
3. All appointments of the turnout will be considered in judging. Vehicle and harness may be inspected to ensure thoughtful restoration and careful maintenance.
4. Period costumes are not permitted.
5. Turnouts are to be shown both ways of the arena at a walk, slow trot, working trot, and strong trot, to stand quietly and to rein back.

To be judged: 70% on the condition, fit and appropriateness of harness and vehicle, neatness and appropriateness of attire, and overall impression.

30% on performance, manners and way of going.

**CLASS SPECIFICATIONS: House Rules
PLEASURE DRIVE-PACE**

*Review Chapter 8, 2019 ADS Rule Book and especially Article 260
Participation is required to qualify for a division championship.*

Purpose: To test the driver on his or her skill in negotiating a cross-country drive at a prescribed pace (similar to a hunter pace).

1. Competitors will be permitted to use, at their discretion, an alternate vehicle for the pleasure drive. This alternate vehicle must conform to traditional type and design. The use of alternate vehicle must be indicated on the entry blank at time of entry. Absolutely NO marathon/utility type vehicles will be permitted to be named as alternate vehicle. Any competitors wishing to compete with a marathon/utility vehicle are instructed to enter the Utility Division. Decisions regarding alternate vehicles will be at the management's discretion.
2. Course information and course distances
 - a. The terrain will include hills and trails through woodlands and fields. There will be a wooden-deck bridge with no alternative route. A marker indicating the half-way point will be provided.
 - b. Horses and large ponies single or multiples course distance will be 5-6 miles (8-9.6 Km) and a water crossing will be optional.



- c. VSEs and small ponies single or multiples course distance will be 2-3 miles (3.2-4.8 Km) and there will not be a water crossing.
 - d. Exact course distances and the calculated times will be available prior to Sunday morning and/or announced at the mandatory whips meeting before the start of the pleasure drive.
 - e. Show officials may modify the course if hazardous conditions exist.
3. Order of go: In the interest of preserving the footing on the course, the order of go will first be small ponies and very small equines, followed by horses and large ponies as listed in the class schedule. Specific order of go by competitor number will be posted on Saturday prior to the end of the day's classes.
 4. There is no mandatory walk section. Drivers are to pace their horses so that they will arrive at the finish line at exactly the correct time. Due to the uneven terrain, the course speeds are as follows:
 - a. Horses: 8 mph; 12.9 kph
 - b. Large ponies (12.2 – 14.2 hands): 7 mph; 11.2 kph
 - c. Small ponies (12.2.hands and under): 6 mph; 9.6 kph
 - d. Very Small Equines: 5 mph; 8 kph
 5. "Mandatory Trot". Circling, driving serpentines and walking or stopping are not permitted and may be penalized by elimination. Breaks of pace will be penalized by 5 penalties for each break in gait for 1st, 2nd, and 3rd breaks, 4th break will result in elimination (as defined in ADS Article 211).
 6. Since the Pleasure Drive-Pace is "BLIND." Absolutely no competitors, horses/ponies, grooms or passengers are permitted on any part of the course at any time prior to the event. No driver or horse may compete more than once on the Pleasure Drive-Pace. **At the discretion of and with permission of the Judge, exception may be made for a professional trainer to accompany more than one of his/her clients. This is solely for issues of safety and there may be no verbal instructions or handling of whip or reins by the professional, under penalty of elimination.*
 7. **The ADS insurance will not cover anyone driving on the course at any time other than during the actual Pleasure Drive-Pace.**
 8. Pleasure Drive-Pace Penalties : See ADS Article 257
 9. Slow moving vehicles must make way for passing vehicles when requested. Rules of the road must be obeyed unless directed otherwise by an official. Proper signals must be made for turns and stops.
 10. Spares (ADS Article 255) must be carried on each vehicle to be inspected before the start, and will be randomly inspected at the end of the Pleasure Drive-Pace. See ADS Article 255.2 for penalties assessed for omission of spares. Slow-moving vehicle (SMV) signs are not required, as there is no part of the Pleasure Drive-Pace on public roads.
 11. Placings: See ADS Article 260.5, 260.7, 260.8. Review ADS Article 211 for penalties assessed for cantering.
 12. The Vet Check will occur at the finish line. Penalty points may be assessed if a horse is deemed in distress.

From the North or West: Exit the NYS Thruway (I-90) at Exit 34A (I-481). Take ramp for I-481 S. to Exit 3E (Rts. 5 & 92 E.). Follow signs for State Rt. 92 E. toward Cazenovia. Make a left at intersection of US-20. At first light, turn right onto State Rt 13 S. Entrance will be on your right (approx. 1/4 mile).

From the East: Exit the NYS Thruway (I-90) at Exit 34 (Canastota, Rt. 13). Follow signs for Rt. 13 S. through Chittenango to Cazenovia. In Cazenovia, make a right onto US-20. At the second light, make a left. Continue straight through the next light (Rt. 13 S.). Entrance will be on your right (approximately 1/4 mile).
