#### The American Driving Society, Inc. Code of Sportsmanship



Our sport of Carriage Driving has the valuable reputation of being welcoming to all, a sport where the welfare of the horse is foremost, and the thrill is in the partnership with our equines (regardless of the results). Protecting these ideals is of paramount importance to the health of driving.

In order for the sport of driving to prosper, our expectation is that every participant knows the rules, plays fairly, graciously accepts the final results, and always conducts themselves in a composed manner. It is the duty of all to behave in a manner that creates a positive environment.

Therefore, any infringement of the common principles of good behavior, fairness or good sportsmanship will result in disciplinary action. Sportsmanship infractions include, but are not limited to, the following:

- a) Abusive, or intimidating language at ADS Recognized Events.
- b) Refusal to accept Officials' final decisions.
- c) Intentional circumventing of the rules.
- d) Unsafe behavior while on event grounds.
- e) Damaging land or property.
- f) Actions detrimental to the welfare of the horse.
- g) Negative interaction with volunteers.

h) The use of social media, or any public platform, to personally attack the character or reputation of fellow competitors, organizers, volunteers, or Officials.

We all have a duty to each other and to our sport to display good sportsmanship.

When our members display good sportsmanship, it not only makes driving more enjoyable for all, but presents a positive impression of the driving community to the general public.

Let us always do the right thing for our equine companions, our sport, and our fellow ADS members.

## **General Rules & Regulations**

#### The Lorenzo Driving Competition is recognized by the American Driving Society (ADS) and is conducted under the rules as published in the current 2025 ADS Rule Book.

1. The Lorenzo Driving Competition, Inc., the show committee, and the owners of property used for the Sunday Drive, will not be held responsible for any claim resulting from injury or injuries to any person, horse or pony or loss or damage to property incurred on the grounds, staging area or on the course of the Sunday Drive.

2.Entries close June 17, 2025. Closing date means entries must be postmarked on or prior to this date. *Due to scheduling constraints, entries may be limited in some divisions*. Late entries will not be listed in the program.

a. An ENTRY is defined as a combination of a horse/pony or horses/ponies, vehicle and driver, which has been assigned a specific entry number. Any change in this combination will be considered as a new entry. If showing the same turnout in a regular division and the antique division, one entry is required.

b. Competitor packets may be picked up in South Cottage from the Secretary on Thursday 7/17 from 1 p.m. - 5 p.m., or Friday 7/18 through Sunday 7/20, 7:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., ringside at the Secretary's Tent. Proof of negative Coggins certificate within two years of show date is required for NYS horses, within one year of show date for out of state horses. Proof of rabies vaccination within one year of show date is mandatory for each horse and/or pony entering the competition grounds. Proof of Flu/Rhino vaccination within six months of show date is required for each horse and/or pony entering the competition grounds. ADS Pony and VSE measurement cards required. (ADS 2025, Appendix GR-B)

c. The American Driving Society Disclaimer (provided in Prize List) must be signed by every competitor/participant including the driver and each person who rides with a driver on a carriage not only during the actual competition but including any time from arrival at the competition to departure. See Show Secretary for additional copies.

d. Every participant in the Lorenzo Driving Competition is responsible for having a knowledge of, and is subject to, the current ADS Rulebook. **All current ADS members will be required to pay a \$5 competition fee; nonmembers must pay a \$30 non-member fee.** 

e. In case of horses/ponies being entered and not exhibited, entry fees will be forfeited unless a veterinary certificate is submitted prior to the start of the competition on July 18, 2025. **STALL FEES ARE NOT REFUNDABLE.** 

# **General Rules & Regulations (continued)**

f. The Show reserves the right to decline any entry and to return any fee before or during the competition without being liable for compensation. The Show reserves the right to combine, divide or cancel classes at its discretion.

g. The entry fee will be refunded if a class is canceled.

h. An entry MAY NOT switch from single to pair/tandem after July 1, 2025.

3. A grounds fee of \$20 per turnout is required with the exception of entries in the Grooms Class, Junior Drivers division, or a turnout competing in more than one division.

4. Any question or dispute not covered by these Rules and Regulations will be referred to the Technical Delegate and brought to the Judge or Show Manager for a decision.

5. A bridle with reins attached and passed through the saddle turrets must be in place when a horse is put to a vehicle. Failure to comply will incur elimination or disqualification (ADS 2025, GR Article 6.1)

6. Outside assistance is forbidden under penalty of elimination except in the case of an accident or to prevent an accident.

7. Wire-wheel vehicles are prohibited, with the exception of VSEs entered in the Junior Drivers Division. With prior approval of the Show Committee, antique type vehicles equipped with wheels having long wire spokes and hard rubber tires may be used (ADS 2025, PD Article 206.2).

8. Golf Carts and ATVs may be operated ONLY by a person with a valid Driver's License.

9. All horses/ponies must be at least 3 years of age on January 1, 2025 to compete. All equines over 148 cm (149 cm with shoes) are considered horses. A registered horse of a breed permitting horses to be 148 or under may show as a horse, but not as a horse and a pony at the same show. Multiple turnouts must be shown in the class or division which accommodates the tallest equine. Very Small Equine classes are open to any equine under 99 cm. Pony classes will be divided such that those 99 cm to less than 120 cm will be considered small ponies and those 120 cm to 148 cm will be considered large ponies.

10. Driving aprons, hats, gloves and whip in hand are mandatory. Protective headgear is acceptable in all classes. "Period" attire is discouraged. (ADS 2025, GR Article 11)



# **General Rules & Regulations (continued)**

11. A Junior Driver is one who will not reach their 19th birthday during the current calendar year. The competition age of an individual will be the age reached during the current calendar year (ADS 2025, GR Article 2.7). There are no class fees for the Junior Drivers Division at LDC.

a. Due to the absence of a secure ring, only "Junior B" Drivers (NOT driving a VSE) or "Junior C" Drivers are allowed to compete. Consult ADS 2025, GR Articles 2.7c and 2.7d for Junior Driver details.

b. A Junior Driver that has not reached the age of 16 during the 2025 calendar year must always be under the guidance of a knowledgeable horseman during the show. If deemed appropriate, this person should accompany their Junior Driver in the carriage.

c. A Junior Driver may drive the same horse/pony/vehicle as an adult as a separate entry.

d. A Junior Driver may not drive a stallion.

e. Junior C Drivers driving a VSE are allowed to drive vehicles with wire wheels.

f. Junior Drivers can only show in the Junior Driver Division.

g. Junior Grooms must have reached their 14th birthday during the 2025 calendar year to assist in the competition.

h. Protective headgear (ASTM-approved) is required for ALL Junior Drivers and Junior Grooms at all times while riding on a carriage or horse.

12. Awards and Championships

a. Points will be awarded as follows: 1st place, 6 points; 2nd place, 5 points; 3rd place, 4 points; 4th place, 3 points; 5th place, 2 points; 6th place, 1 point.

b. To be eligible for Division Championships and Awards, a competitor must enter and be judged in every class of that division. Note that participation in the Sunday Drive IS REQUIRED for eligibility for division championships, except for the Novices.

c. Eligibility for the Jane Sadoff Memorial Trophy requires that an entry must enter and complete the Sunday Drive.

13. Novice Driver classes: Entries are ineligible for Novice classes after winning at least one first place ribbon in each of three ADS-recognized and/ or USEF licensed Carriage Pleasure driving competitions. Wins in ADS and/or USEF Carriage Pleasure Driving classes and high-point championship awards of fewer than three entries will not affect Driver or Horse status. A Novice Driver may not drive a stallion. The Novice Division may be split if entries warrant. (ADS 2025, PD Articles 214.2 & 214.5)

a. Due to the terrain and line of sight issues, Novice Drivers are NOT ALLOWED to participate in the Sunday Drive.

14. Obstacle Classes: see Rules for Pleasure Driving Competitions, Chapter 7, 2025 ADS rulebook.

15. An Informational Whips Meeting will take place on Thursday evening at 5:30pm in the Welcome Tent, light food and beverage provided.

#### 16. Stabling:

a. High quality stalls will be available on the Show Grounds at \$300.00 each. The full stall rental fee must be included with your entry. For safety purposes, all horses/ponies stabled on the Show Grounds must use these facilities. **Electricity will not be available!** 

b. A \$50 SEPARATE REFUNDABLE STALL DEPOSIT CHECK IS REQUIRED. When leaving, if stalls are determined to be clean, checks will be destroyed unless competitor asks stable manager for check prior to departure.

c. There will be no dismantling, cutting, marking, taping or otherwise damaging stalls. Nothing is to be hung from the stall overhang.

d. Damaged stalls will be the responsibility of the competitor and will be so charged.

e. The number of available stalls may be limited. Send entry and stall requests by June 22 deadline.

f. Indicate on the entry form if you plan to stable your horse(s) over until Monday, July 21, 2025. All stalls must be totally empty and cleaned by 8:00 a.m., Monday, July 21, 2025.

h. Please indicate if stall is for a stallion and, if needed, bring your own plywood reinforcement.

# **Class Specifications: Friday Combined Test**

## Review ADS 2025, Chapters 11 and 12

1. The show is offering a Combined Test (CT) following CDE-style rules, with dressage tests driven first followed by the CT cones course held in the Main Ring.

a. If scheduling allows, competitors will have the option to drive an additional dressage test immediately following their CT dressage test.

b. Cones course settings will use standardized settings.

c. Protective headgear (ASTM-approved) is required when driving the CT cones course.

# **Class Specifications: Friday Non-Divisional Cones**

1. Scurry Obstacles will include up to 10 unnumbered sets of cones.

a. Location and time TBD, depending on CT entries and scheduling.

Turnout: ADS 2025, PD Article 217 Working: ADS 2025, PD Article 218 Reinsmanship: ADS 2025, PD Article 222 Gambler's Choice Obstacles: ADS 2025, PD Article 249.3 Pick Your Route Obstacles: ADS 2025, PD Article 248.5 Scurry Obstacles: ADS 2025, PD Article 248.1 Carriage Dog Class: ADS 2025, PD Article 231 Ladies' Driving Class: ADS 2025, PD Article 219 Gentlemen's Driving Class: ADS 2025, PD Article 220 Concours d'Elegance: ADS 2025, PD Article 230

The class will be judged by the overall impression throughout the show; no entry fee will be charged. The winner will be the turnout which, in the opinion of the judge, presents the most elegant effect.

#### Picnic Class: ADS 2025, PD Article 232

<u>Antique Vehicle Division:</u> (House Rules) Open to vehicles built prior to 1940, vehicles can be restored, conserved or original condition. Drivers may cross enter to other divisions.

**Utility Division:** (House Rules) Open to horses and ponies put to a 2 or 4 wheel marathon or utility type vehicle not suitable for any other division or class. Hard type pneumatic wheels are acceptable in this division, no bicycle tire wire wheels. Class may split into singles and multiples if entries warrant. Attire should be appropriate for a pleasure show (hat, apron, gloves, whip). No cross entries with other divisions will be allowed.

**Drive & Ride:** ADS 2025, PD Article 227- Open to single horses and ponies to be shown in two sections.

- 1. In Harness: To be shown to a suitable pleasure driving vehicle, both ways of the arena at a walk, slow trot, working trot, and strong trot. To stand quietly and rein back.
- 2. Under Saddle: ADS 2025, PD Article 227.1b- To be shown both ways of the arena at a walk and trot (jog) only. To stand quietly and rein back.

**To be judged:** 50% on performance, manners, way of going and suitability in harness, 50% on performance, manners and way of going under saddle.

**Grooms' Class:** (House Rules) Open to all grooms, who shall be dressed as a driver for this class. To be shown both ways of the arena at a walk, slow trot, working trot and, at judges discretion, strong trot. Must rein back and stand quietly. LDC will cover any ADS non-member fees for grooms participating in this class. Only those juniors acting as grooms qualifying as "Junior C" may compete in Grooms' Class. Entries in this class are not allowed to drive in any other class during the pleasure show.

**To be judged:** 50% on skill of driver, 25% on performance, 25% on overall impression.

### Class Specifications: Sunday Drive (House Rules)

#### *Review ADS 2025, Chapter 8* Participation is required to qualify for a division championship.

**<u>Purpose</u>**: To test the whip's skill in negotiating a cross-country drive at a prescribed pace.

1. Competitors are allowed to use an alternate vehicle for the Sunday Drive. This alternate vehicle must conform to traditional type and design and be indicated on the entry. Absolutely NO marathon/utility type vehicles will be permitted to be named as alternate vehicle. Any competitors wishing to compete with a marathon/utility vehicle are instructed to enter the Utility Division. Decisions regarding alternate vehicles will be at the management's discretion.

a. If necessary, an informal Q & A will take place prior to Saturday evening's pizza & ice cream party. Informational Whips Meeting will take place on Thursday evening at 5:30pm.

b. Spares are required, but will not be checked prior to start. Random spares checks may happen upon completion. A halter and lead rope must be carried on carriage. (ADS 2025, PD Article 255)

c. Junior Drivers and Novice Drivers are not allowed to compete in this class.

2. Course information and course distances

a. The course will be run on Lorenzo site property, as well as neighboring properties. Some hills/ slopes, as well as fields, will be utilized. There will be a wooden-deck bridge with no alternative route.

b. All equines will run the same course, distance approximately 5k or less.

c. Exact course distances and calculated times will be available prior to Sunday morning. Be sure to check official board.

d. Order of go will be posted on Saturday prior to end of the day's classes.

3. Drivers are to pace their equines so that they will arrive at the finish line closest to the ideal time. Course speeds as follows:

- a. Horses: 13kph
- b. Large Ponies: 12kph
- c. Small Ponies: 11kph
- d. Very Small Equine: 9kph





4. There may be a mandatory trot section at end of course. Circling, deviating and stopping are not permitted and may be penalized by elimination.

5. The entire course may be inspected on foot or by bicycle before the start of the class (Sunday morning at 7 A.M.) The course will be well marked, so it is not necessary to inspect. NO motorized vehicles will be allowed on the course.

6. Those competitors or equines entered in more than one division may drive the course more than once. However, there are no guarantees the schedule will allow for more than once around and there will be no violations to the Order of Go Time Table.

7. The ADS insurance will not cover anyone driving on the course at any time other than during the actual Sunday Drive.

8. Scoring and placings: See ADS 2025, PD Articles 257, 260.5, 260.7, 260.8. Review Article 211 for canter penalties.

9. A required Vet Check will occur at the finish line. Penalty points may be assessed if an equine is deemed in distress.



# Notice:

All dogs on the show grounds must be properly supervised and restrained by a leash, and have proof of current rabies vaccination. You must pick up after your dog.

The public offering of vehicles, horses, equipment or other materials for sale (except on Market Lane) is prohibited by State Park Regulations.

#### You must enter the Lorenzo State Historic Site from Rippleton Road

**From the North or West:** Exit the NYS Thruway (I-90) at Exit 34A (I-481). Take ramp for I-481 S. to Exit 3E (Rts. 5 & 92 E.). Follow signs for State Rt. 92 E. toward Cazenovia. Make a left at intersection of US-20. At first light, turn right onto State Rt 13 S. Entrance will be on your right (approx. 1/4 mile).

**From the East:** Exit the NYS Thruway (I-90) at Exit 34 (Canastota, Rt. 13). Follow signs for Rt. 13 S. through Chittenango to Cazenovia. In Cazenovia, make a right onto US-20. At the second light, make a left. Continue straight through the next light (Rt. 13 S.). Entrance will be on your right (approximately 1/4 mile).

**From the South:** Take I-81 North to Cortland. Take Exit 11 (Rt. 13). Follow signs for Rt. 13 N. Lorenzo State Historic Site entrance will be on your left just a short distance before the traffic light at US-20.
