

1093a GEORGE HENRY HOPPER, son of son of Henry Van Emburgh Hopper (#550) and Tabitha Hunt, b. abt 1850-51 in CT (9 in 1860; 21 in 1870 a soldier Omaha Barracks, NE). He d. 1 Aug 1895, in Orange, TX. Bur. Oakland Cem. St. Paul, MN. George Henry Hopper m. **Martha Ann Mead** on 4 Sep 1879 in St. Paul, Ramsey, MN.[MN Marriage Index]. From her 1900 census Martha was b. Sep 1854 in IN. She was the dau. of Joshua Meads and Sophrona Jane Johnson with whom 5 year old Martha was living in 1860. Her parents are bur. in Fairview Cem. Deer Creek, Otter Tail Co., MN. Martha Ann d. 6 Mar 1939 Stark County ND, and is bur. with her husband in St. Paul, Ramsey, MN.

In 1885 G. H. Hopper, 33 a machinist (b. CT as were parents) was in Fargo Cass Co, Dakota Territory, with Martha 29 (b. IN as were parents) Chas T. 5 and Ruth J. 10 mos. old (b. Aug) both born MN, father b. CT, mother b. IN. The 1890 Veterans Schedule Eau Clair WI show George H. Hopper enlisted 2 Aug 1870 discharged 2 Aug 1875 from Co. G. 14th US. Inf. (a private). From an obituary notices "George H. Hopper a native of this city [New Haven] and brother of Mrs. H. E. Gamsby of Westville [CT] died recently in Orange, TX where he was on a business trip for an Eau De Claire, WI company. His wife was at his bedside, cause of death was liver complaint. Mr. Hopper was a former mayor of Eau De Claire. [in 1894] funeral St. Paul, MN."

Martha widow of George H. Hopper, lived Eau Claire WI (Directories from 1897-1908). In 1900, Martha Hopper, 45, a widow b. IN (parents b. IN) no occupation given, was at 538 Menomonie St., Eau Claire, with her two children Charles 19 and Ruth 15 (she had borne four children but only two were living). In the 1908 City Directory of Eau Claire Martha widow of George and Miss Ruth Hopper were at 615 Niagara St. In the 1910 census of Township 143, Billings ND, Martha A. Hopper 55 (b. IN as were parents) was the head of the household occupation farmer, with dau. Ruth 25, and single b. MN (both parents b. IN) Martha was the owner of the property.

Although her census said Martha had given birth to two children only one of whom was living; son Charles was found living in Minneapolis, MN in 1910.

1093b JULIA B. HOPPER, dau. of Henry Van Emburgh Hopper (#550) and Tabitha Hunt was b. Sep 1854, in CT (1900 census and 6 in 1860; 16 in 1870; 20 in 1874) and d. 5 Apr 1937; bur. with husband Evergreen Cem., New Haven, New Haven Co., CT. On 25 Mar 1874, in Newark, Essex, NJ, Julia B. Hopper 20, m. "Herbert E. Jamsby" 27. His name was misspelled he was **Herbert E. Gamsby**, likely the son of Albert Gamsby and his wife Adaline, with whom 24 year old Herbert was living in New Haven, in 1870. He was b. in CT, abt. 1845-1846 (27 in 1874; 34 in 1880) and d. 15 Feb 1893 (gs.) likely in New Haven.

In 1870, Julia was 16 and single living with her sister Rebecca and her husband Spencer Carter in Washington, Warren Co., NJ. In 1880 they were living in New Haven, Herbert E. Gamsby was 34, a joiner, with Julia B. 25, their two children and his mother-in-law Tabitha Harper [sic] 65. All were born in CT as were their parents except for Julia whose father was b. in NJ and her mother who was listed as born in NJ as were her parents. In 1900 Julia Gamsby, a widow, 54 and dressmaker, was the head of the household in New Haven, having borne four children three of whom were living and were with her. Julia was born in CT, father b. NJ and mother b. CT. She was living there in 1910 with her two sons and in
