Sears, in her article "Thomas Frederickszen and Maritje Adriaens: Origins of the Cadmus Family in Amsterdam Revealed," in the October 2006 issue of *The New York Genealogical and Biographical Record*, [vol. 137 pp. 179-187], we now know that Catharina's husband Frederick Thomase was baptized in Amsterdam on 1 Sep 1647 as Fredrick, son of Thomas Fredericktsz and Marritte Arijaens; wit. Hilletje Frerickts [Amsterdam Zuider Kerk, DTB 93:173].Descendants of the Cadmus family should definitely check this article for more information on the European roots of the family. . . . 59 GERRIT A. HOPPE(R) He was likely the Garret Hopper who was taxed in Sep 1779 and Dec 1780 (though that would be his estate that was taxed as he died in April 1780) in Harrington Twp. Bergen County for 240 acres and 5 horses 10 cows and 6 pigs (1780 was similar with 4 horses and no pigs). He was listed on a page with other residents known to have owned property in what is now Upper Saddle River NJ. His son Andries G. Hopper, a grist mill owner was enumerated on the line after Garret. (GMNJ) His sons Andries and Stephen are both buried in Upper Saddle River. (See #213 and #216). Cornelius' mother it would seem was *Cathryna (Catrijntie) Huyken* daughter of William Huyken and Annetje Andreias Willjard not Cathryna (Catrijntie) Van Duyn. 156 ANDREW (ANDRIES) HOPPE(R). Although he was declared intestate, two wills and a draft of a third were presented at the administration of his estate, which were all rejected. From those wills **Elizabeth Guest Earl was his third wife and his second wife was a woman named Mary _____**. From the *New York Gazette* of 6 July 1811, "Died at Bloomingdale on Monday last [1 July 1811] Mrs. Mary Hopper, in the 61st year of her age, wife of Mr. Andrew Hopper. 219 ANDREW D. HOPPER . . . He may had died shortly before 1825 when Letitia and her daughter moved to NY City (1855 census lived in city 30 years), and long before "Letitia Hopper, widow of Andrew" is listed living at the rear of 271 Spring St. in the 1841 *American Almanac Directory of New York City*.

. . . NY City death record register has Letitia Hopper age 93, b. NJ, died of pneumonia at 145 Hammond St. [Manhattan] on 1 Dec 1860 (or 1861) bur. Patterson. She was actually bur. in Wyckoff, NJ, as "Letitia Hopper, wife of Andrew Hopper, died Dec 1, 1861 aged 93y." Wy.RDChyd(p. 103). with their dau. Rachel. From her age at death and census records she would have been born 1868-1871 in NJ. No record of her birth or baptism has been found and her parents remain unidentified.

Aaltje ,later know as Letitia or Letty, and her daughter Rachel likely moved to New York city about 1825 to live with her. son David, who had relocated to NY City as early as 1815. David was enumerated as the head of household in the 1820 and 1830 censuses in the 8th Ward of New York City. No women of Letitia and Rachels ages were living in David's household in 1820, but there were two women of their ages living with him in 1830 (see #537) By 1840 again in the 8th Ward, probably on Spring St. "Leita Hopper" appears as the head of household likely with her dau. Rachel (female 30-39) and possibly her son David (male 40-49) and three young men of the ages to be the the Fulton brothers.*

. . . In the 1855 NY State Census there were six families enumerated in the same building. The first was Andrew D. Hopper 39 his wife and seven children, the second was Rachel Hopper 45 a dressmaker and her mother Letitia 84 (both b. in NJ and had lived in New York City for 30 years); and third was John Fulton 29 his wife Catherine 32 (b. NJ) and his brother Isaac Fulton 33, both brothers born in NY City and had lived their since birth.. In 1860 Letty Hopper 91, (b. NJ) was living in the household headed by John Fulton 35 ,(b. NY)a brassturner, with \$200 in personal estate; and Cath Fulton 37 (b. NJ) in the 9th Ward of the City of Brooklyn Kings County, NY

251 CATHERINE (TRIENTJE) HOPPE . . .

She was believed to be the Catherine Hopper who m. second on 26 May 1797, by Rev. Harmenus Van Huysen, as "**Jacobus De Clark**, widr. of Paramus, NJ, to Catherine Hopper wid.” Marriages of RDCh. of Helderbergh, Jerusalem, New Salem (Albany Co.), and Princetown (Schenectady Co.), NY” (Record 94:86). If she was married to a Jacobus De Clark he must have died before Jul 1812, when "Thomas Banta and Catrina Hopper, his wife" were founding members of the S.R.RDCh.(p. 1) **She was not married to the Jacobus De Clark whose will was dated 2 Nov 1800 and probated 1 Sep 1808 in Rockland County and 21 Sep 1808 in Bergen County, as previously thoughts as he made no mention of a wife in his will. (Brg.Co. Will C-24/NJ Rockland County copy of will online@ancestry). Nor was she married to the Jacobus De Clark II b. 16 Nov 1745 who d. in 1823 and is bur. Oak Hill Cem. in Nyack Rockland County with his wife Antje Van Osstrum even though his FindA Grave memorial links Catherine as his second wife (though her place of burial is unknown..**

Since they were married in either Albany or Schenectady Counties in NY it is likely it was another Catherine Hopper who married a Jacobus De Clark. As was said she married "Thomas Banta before July1812 and after 22 Aug 1808 when Thomas Banta wrote his will. He mentioned only his late wife Charity, two sons Thoma and John and two daus. Charity and Eve. His will was not probated in Bergen County until 6 Jul 1824...(Brg.Co. C-41). He was the son of Wiert Banta, and Geertruy Van Boskerk. Thomas m 1) Gerritie (Charity) Terhune. She died 20 Nov 1807. During the Rev. War he was capture by three Tory neighbors and imprisoned in the old sugar-house in New York City for a little more than a year. . . . *The Minutes of the Council of Safety for New Jersey* refer to efforts made to effect an exchange for him. Their daughters Mary (#719) and Margaret (#723) who married Nathaniel Sanford can now have pluses in front of their names.** [See their entries]_____

312 Rev. LAMBERT HOPPER . . . On closer examination of the actual newspaper death notice of Abbey Hopper in the *Plattsburg Republican* of 18 Sep 1813 his first wife **Abbey was 54 when she died on 13 Sep 1813 not 53** as reported in *10,000 Vital Records* - entry #4328) **so she was born abt. 1758-59.**

On 18 Jun 1814 in the *Plattsburgh Republican* Lambert Hopper offered for sale “an excellent farm of 150 acres in the fourth town in Plattsburgh, . . . with a good framed house, painted inside an out; a good framed barn an excellent young orchard of one thousand trees just beginning to bear . . . For \$2,000, \$1,000 now and the other half in 3 years. 16 Dec 1815 - Same property advertised price now \$2,500. [By 1820 he had migrated to Erie Co., NY.]

From his pension record, his second wife's name looked like Lovica Moore. **Her tombstone in the Peru Village Cemetery reads: “Lovisa / Wife of / Lambert HOPPER / died Apr. 12, 1855 / AEd 86 Y'rs 9 Mo. / Dear Mother thou hast gone to the mansions of rest. / Where sickness and sorrow and death are no more. / Thou hast gone to enjoy thy God and the blest. / And I trust I shall meet thee on that happy shore.”** Buried next to her was “Rebecca / daughter of / John & Lovisa / MOORE / died March 10, / 1859 / AEd 50 Y'rs 10 M (NNY transcriptions). Since Rebecca Moore was 42 and living with Louisa Hopper in 1850, she was more than likely her unmarried daughter. Therefore Lovisa's first husband was John Moore, and her maiden name is unknown.

336d EDWARD HOPPER - His second marriage to **Hannah Sirrine, widow of Henry Entrott, and sister of his first wife Abigail Sirrine, was reported four months after Abigail's death. “Edward Hopper of Phillipstown married Miss Antrot (sic) of Putnam Valley (by Rev. D.D. Tompkins) on Feb 1841”** [*Westchester Republican*, Peekskill, February 23, 1841. Additional References: Find a Grave #33799235 (Edward), #33799232 (Abigail), #33799268 (Hannah)

363 MARYTJE (POLLY) HOPPER, . . . wife of Barzilla Dusenbury (Dusenberry). He was born 20 Aug 1762. . . . 365 RACHEL HOPPER- A summary of the inventory and final accounting of the estate of her husband Thomas Newcomb, of Clinton, Dutchess Co., NY farmer reveals the inventory taken by her brother Jasper Hopper and Zaccheaus Newcomb administrator and two appraisers on 8 Sep 1812. There was a room by room inventory - items of interest were: a horseman's sword, pair of pistols, a bullet mould (\$8), a military coat and cap (\$10), and three negro slaves valued at \$275. 372 ELIZABETH HOPPER . . . Her death was reported in the *Weekly Herald* on 28 Oct 1854. “At Harlem on Monday October 23, Elizabeth Keeley age 78, wife of Joseph Keeley deceased, and daughter of Yellas Hopper.” She was mentioned in her father’s will as the wife of Joseph Kelly and is assumed to be their daughter Elizabeth bapt. 6 Nov 1768. However she would have been 85 when she died and not 78. The child bap. in 1768 may have died young and a subsequent child born say 1776 also named Elizabeth may have been the one that married Joseph Kelly. She was not found in the 1850 census. [

374 DEBORAH HOPPER . She d. 16 Apr 1812 (Wade), a month after the birth of twin daughters .. On 4 Aug 1792, at NY RDCh.(p. 267), "Deborah Hopper m. Robert Wade." According to the Wade Genealogy he was the son of James Wade and Hannah Hinman b. 6 Jan 1771 and d. 15 or 25 Mar 1829. He married 2) Elizabeth Davidson on 3 Oct 1817; she was b. 17 Jul 1775.

In her father's will dated 13 Jan 1825, she was his deceased dau. Deborah, wife of Robert Wade . Her surviving children were mentioned in the proving of her father’s will on 23 August 1828 as James Wade, Hannah wife of Bush Reynolds, Deborah wife of John Addeonas, Mary Wade and Hopper Wade.

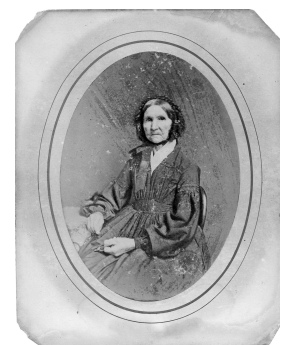

Passed down through the Van Horn-Tice family to descendant Joan Hagel, was information gathered by Margaret and Abraham's grandson Abraham Terwilleger in 1907 on the Van Horn family. The dates are very specific and for the most part agree with baptismal and cemetery records and may have come in part from a family Bibles. According to that information the following addition and corrections can be assumed. See also their Find a Grave heir Memorial #6216704 (both names and full dates on one gravestone) with links to th burials of their ten children. (p.272 -3rd/4th)

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His original marriage record has been transcribed twice as David Hopper who m. Mayntye Vanvalen on 20 Oct 1810 at Par.RDCh.(II p. 11), also in Bergen County Marriages (p. 72), where she is "Meyntye Van Alen"). It is likely she was known by the nickname Meyntje, short for Jacomyntje, which was usually converted into Jemima in English. Their son Andrew D. and their daughter Letitia were named for his parents. When their daughter Letitia Curren Mc Creery died her death certificate gave her parents as David and Jemima Hopper. Also of interest both Letitia's brother Andrew and her first husband James Curren were stonecutters. "Jemima Hopper, born in Bergen died 10 Dec 1820 at Bedford St., Manhattan of dropsy at the age of 23y-8m-7d. bur Bethel Baptist." No baptismal record has been found for a Jacomyntje, Meyntye or Jemima Van Alen or Vanvalen b. abt 3 Apr 1797 (from age at death) in Bergen County, so her parents are not known,

David apparently moved to New York City shortly after his two known children were born in New Jersey. Probably the David Hopper, age 30 a cartman, who was enumerated in the New York City on Spring St in 1816 (though David would have been 24). In the 1819 census he was at Thompson St. West Side; no age or occupation listed. He appears infrequently in New York City Directories, he was however in the 1820-1821 directory as David Hopper cartman, Bedford St. In the 1820 federal census David Hopper was the head of the household in the 8th Ward of New York City. From the ages of the six people listed they would likely represent David (male 26-44) his wife (female 16-26) [Jemima was 23] son Andrew (male under 10) and dau. Letitia (female under 10) there was also a second female child under ten (possibly a second daughter) and an unknown male 45 and over. In 1830 he was again in the 8th Ward, but this time there were 12 people in the household, likely David (30-39), a possible second wife (female 30-39), son Andrew (15-19), and daughter Letitia and possibly another daughter both 15-19. the other seven people were a male 20-29, a female 15-19, a male 15-19, a male under 5 and a male 5-9 probably an additional family. There was also a female 60-69 and a female 20-29; since the 1855 NY City Census stated his mother Letitia and her daughter Rachel had lived in NYC for 30 years, (since 1825) and his mother would have been about 60, and his sister Rachel about 27, it was likely them. He was not a head of household in 1840 census, but was likely living with his mother who was listed as a head of household.

[See her record.] In 1835 he was admitted to the New York City Alms house, he was — years old and a cartman. It is possible since he was admitted to the alms house in 1835 and not the head of a household in 1840, or listed in NY City Directories in later years that he was ill or incapacitated for a long period of time.

From the 1855 marriage record of her son John we know her first husband was *James Fulton*. John's death certificate in 1915 said he was the son of Andrew Fulton and Mary Hopper. Since John himself was the informant on

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his own marriage record [only father's name was asked for], and the death certificate information was second hand it is more likely their father was Jams Fulton.

There was no record found of a Mary Fulton marrying a John Rutan, however, there is a record in the Bank St. Dutch Christian Reformed Church in New York City, for a marriage of Maria Hopper to a John Rutan on 29 Nov 1828. If this is the Mary who was the mother of the three Fulton brothers, perhaps it was why she could no longer care for her three sons, as by 1830 they were probably living with their grandmother Letitia and her son David. It could also be that she had other children to care for, as there is a seven year gap between the birth of Andrew and Isaac and or John Rutan was a widower with children. No census records have been found for John or Mary (Maria) Rutan.

From the census records of John Fulton in 1880 , and 1910 his father was born in NY and mother in NJ. Isaac's 1880 census where ditto marks were used said both parents b. NJ, but on Isaac's death certificate his father was b in Scotland and mother in NY (names of his parents not asked for) Perhaps they had been told the family was Scottish.

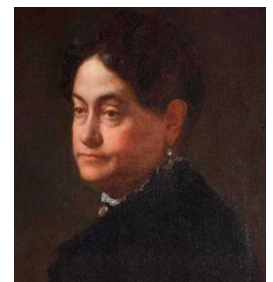

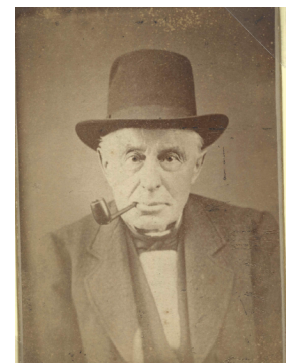

Thanks to Jim Estes who found the article in *Genealogical and Family History of the Wyoming and Lackawanna Valleys Pennsylvania vol. II*, on Frank Hopper, son of John Dobb Hopper, and grandson of John Hopper. Though "mug books" are often unreliable, and this article was in error as it said John was of German background and was born in Pennsylvania, the dates in the article appear to have come from a reliable sources, perhaps a Bible or other family records. From information in the article, compared with census and other sources, we have been able to identify seven additional children for John Hopper and now know the names of both of his wives. (p.271 -3rd)

His married first on 28 Mar 1803 "*Elizabeth Mertz*." She was born b. 16 May 1780 and died in 1820. (W & L p. 424.) She was probably Elizabeth Martz as his daughter Catherine's middle name was Martz, and in 1800 there were seven families with the Martz surname living in Northumberland Co., PA and no Mertz family, and in 1810 there were twelve Martz families and only two Mertz families. From the census records of her children, who were living in 1880. Elizabeth was born in PA and would have died on or after 20 Nov 1820 when their youngest son John Dobbs was born. According to the biography, John married second on 23 Jan 1821 *Mary Peet*. (W & L p. 424.) Marrying so soon after his first wife died seems rather quick, on the other hand he had at least seven possibly nine children under 15, including a tiny infant, at the time. Mary Peet was born about 1789-1790.

In 1810 William was also there aged 26-44 with 1 female under 10. In 1820 he was in Upper Mahoney also in Northumberland Co. age 26-45 with a female 26-45 and 1 male 0-10, and 1 male 10-16, and 2 females 0-10. In 1850 he was in Congress Twp., Morrow Co., OH, age 64 a farmer born in NY with no land valuation, with him were Elizabeth 52, Lucy 22, Hetty 20,

Elizabeth 18, and William 21 (all b. PA.) In the next house was their son Elias Hopper 23, his wife Mary and dau. Martha E. 1. As all except William were born in PA they must have just recently moved to OH. In 1850 their son John Hopper was in Lincoln from the birthplace of his children he had been in OH at least 4 years. In 1860 William was 85 (a hotel keeper) and Elizabeth was 69 liv. with Lucy Ann 30 in Congress, William had \$1,500 in real estate and \$100 in personal account. According to an e-mail posted to the Morrow Co. Mailing list he was the proprietor of the Williamsport Hotel.

***109) On this December 5 N.S., 1665** appeared before me, Mattheus Capito, Secretary of the village of Wildwyk [Kingston] the worthy Christoffel Davids, who in the presence of the afternamed witness declares, in my secretary's hand, that he has never ordered, either *the widow of the deceased Andries Hop* nor anybody else, to be at liberty to sell his half and ownership in the Broncken land lying through Hellgate, but only gave order to Simon Harmensen Cort when, at the time, the appearer was in arrest on the Manhatans which order to the aforesaid Simon Harmensen Cort was not executed at the time. And therefore the appearer, besides Roelof Swartwout and Albert Jansen Van Steenwyck, both residing at Wildwyck, as witnesses invite and requested for the purpose, has signed the present with his own hand at Wildwyck on the day in the year named above. (signed) The mark C D of Christoffel Davids. (Signed) Roelof Swartwout, Albert Jansen Steenwyck. In my presence (signed) Mattheus Capito, Secretary. (NYHM; Kingston, Vol. II. Secretary's Papers p. 595)

***110) Wednesday, April 28, 1666** - Extraordinary Session at Wildwyck [Kingston]. Present: William Beeckman, Schout: Evert Pels, Jan Joosten, Commissaries,

Christoffel Davids, appearing before the hon. court, shows an account he has kept in the transactions between him and *Andries Hop, deceased*, in regard to the payment of his half for the "Bronckenland" situated through the Hellgate: "Account of what I, Christoffel Davids, have paid on the one-half of 'Bronckenlant through the Hellgate,' amounting to one thousand gldrs, as per bill of sale or deed. 1) Assigned *Andries Hop, deceased*, upon Jacob Jansen Stol, and also received through him 800 gldrs.; 2) Have once paid into the hands of *Andries Hop*, at Fort Orange 5 1/2 beavers, in the presence of *Jacob Coppen*, 44 gldrs.; 3) Have further paid into *Andries Hop's* own hands, 26 pieces of cloth at four for one beaver, makes 6 1/2 beavers, 52 gldrs.; 4) Have still paid to *Andries Hop* two pairs of woollen stockings, at 1 1/2 beavers, 12 gldrs.; 5) Further two roughly cured deer skins, int the hands of the same, at 1/2 beaver, four gldrs.; 6) Further a foxcoat of nine foxs into the hands of *his wife*, for two beavers, 16 gldrs. Amounts to a total of 928 gldrs." Which above named amount of 928 gldrs. appearer [Christoffel Davids] declares to have thus paid on the aforesaid 'Bronckenlant,' and consequently has judicially affirmed the same under oath.
