Joining the CT River Area Health District (CRAHD)

Town of Killingworth proposal

Killingworth Population: 6,364

CRAHD per capita rate: \$11.40 per capita.

Yearly cost to Killingworth: $6,364 \times 11.40 = $72,550$

Hiring and retaining a highly qualified Health Director/ Sanitarian has been a continuing challenge. Amy Scholz, upon her resignation, indicated Killingworth needed at least a full-time resource.

To maintain Killingworth's high level of service and uninterrupted coverage, Killingworth entered into a Memorandum of Agreement for 90 days with:

CRAHD serves 5 member towns, offering multiple service efficiencies:

- Chester
- Clinton
- Deep River
- Haddam
- Old Saybrook

CRAHD creates stability, continuity and consistency of service to Killingworth residents:

- Full access to a team of qualified professionals
- 24/7 availability vs. a single part-time employee

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Current contract with CRAHD: $6,045 per month
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2021 Budget for part time Health Director / Sanitarian: \$51,750 <1,560 hrs.

5 Year Running Average for Revenues:

\$13,381

Joining CRAHD \$72,550/ yr. for full range of services *

* 2022 Budget for full time Health Director / Sanitarian, including benefits, would exceed the cost for joining CRAHD even after considering lost revenues

To date, CRADH has been providing:

- Public health monitoring, including PFAS remediation, weekly COVID-19 updates
- On-site sanitarian resources: inspections, plan review and code enforcement

Feedback to date:

- Turnaround time is excellent
- Contractors pleased with the process

2. An ordinance which would allow the Board of Selectmen to appoint additional members to the Board of Assessment Appeals.

Ordinance

 In addition to the regular members of the Board of Assessment Appeals elected pursuant to the Killingworth Town Charter, the Board of Selectmen may appoint additional members to the Board of Assessment Appeals in any assessment year when the Board of Selectmen deems such appointments are necessary or appropriate, as provided under Connecticut General Statute Section 9-199 (c). Each additional member so appointed shall be sworn within 30 days of appointment, and before taking office, or their office will be deemed vacant. The officer administering the oath shall record such fact in the Town Clerk's office. Each additional member shall serve until the expiration year of their appointment. Appointments under this section shall be made in compliance with minority representation rules as set forth in the Killingworth Town Charter. This ordinance expires June 30, 2022.

Rationale

 In anticipation of a high volume of appeals, BAA requests additional staffing to accommodate increased number of meetings. 2. An ordinance which would allow the Board of Selectmen to appoint additional members to the Board of Assessment Appeals.
