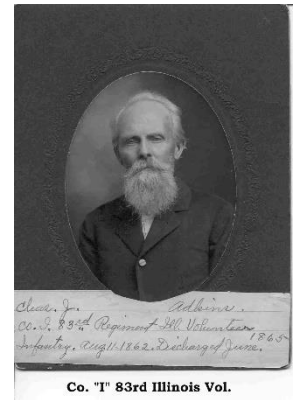

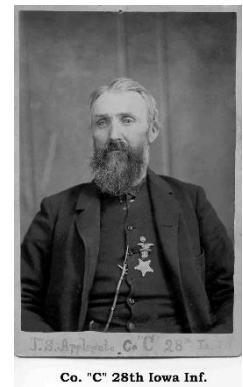
Adams, John Walter, born August 24, 1848 in Nashville, Indiana and died April 18, 1916 in Montezuma, Iowa. He enlisted in the Union Army January 30, 1865 and served until after the close of the war as Sergeant in Company K 145th Indiana Volunteers. John was discharged January 2, 1866. He was the youngest member of the Wisner Post, G. A. R.

Adkins, Charles J. born in Gala County, Ohio, November 4, 1833 and died May 15, 1905. He moved to Knox County, Illinois in 1840. In response to President Lincoln's call for soldiers, Charles enlisted in Company I, 83rd regiment Illinois Volunteer Infantry, August 11, 1862, at Abingdon, Illinois and served his country for nearly three years being discharged in June 1865. Mr. Adkins joined the Wisner Post 127, G. A. R., by muster Jan 19, 1884.



Applegate, Ira born near Eminence, Morgan County, Indiana, March 12, 1839 and departed this life at the soldiers home at Leavenworth, Kansas March 11, 1924. In August 1862, he enlisted in Company C 28th Iowa Voluntary infantry under Captain J. W. Carr. Ira is a brother to Thomas S. Applegate, they enlisted together. Catherine "Matilda" (White) Applegate, born October 3, 1843, Perquiman County, North Carolina and departed this life in Norton County, Kansas, May 7, 1907. Mathilda is the wife of Ira and daughter of Timothy and Martha Reed White.

Applegate, Thomas S., was born in Morgan County, Indiana, December 3, 1834 and departed this life October 10, 1920, at Montezuma, Iowa. When the Civil War endanger the union Thomas and his brother Ira enlisted at Camp Pope, Iowa City, Iowa, August 11, 1862, in Company C., 28th Iowa Infantry under Captain J. W. Carr. They took part in all the engagements of the regiments until Thomas S. was wounded in the last fight at Cedar Creek, Virginia, October 19, 1864. He was honorably discharged January 5, 1865, Davenport, Iowa.

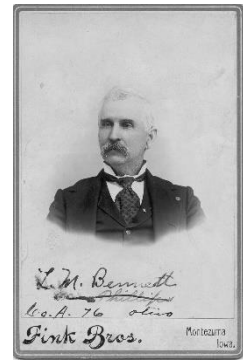

Atherton, John H. born at Chester County, Pennsylvania, November 14, 1835 and departed this life at Guernsey, Iowa, January 21, 1911. He enlisted in Civil War with Company F. 20th Iowa Infantry at Camp Fremont, Iowa City, Iowa on August 22, 1861. John was discharged September 28, 1864 in Kingston, Georgia. Margaret F. (Morgan) Atherton, born near Sterling, Illinois, April 24, 1845 and departed this life at her daughters, Mrs. J. S. Gillaspie in Deep River, Iowa, August 16, 1929. John is Margaret's soldier sweetheart. Margaret F. (Morgan) Atherton his wife was born in Sterling, Illinois, April 24, 1845 and died at the home of her daughter, Mrs. J. S. Gilaspie, August 15, 1929 at Montezuma, Iowa

Bennett, Leonida "Lawrence" Marshall, born November 19, 1836, Frazeyburg, Ohio and departed this life February 19, 1921 in Tulsa, Oklahoma. He enlisted in the Civil War in 1861, served with Company A. 76th Ohio Regiment and was injured at Fort Donaldson. Lawrence was discharged September 17, 1862, for disability at Helena, Arkansas.

Bernard, William H., Born June 7, 1840 at Hillsboro, Ohio and died March 18, 1923, Montezuma, Iowa. In the sixties when the call came for volunteers, he enlisted in the short term enlistment July 28, 1862, in the 3rd Iowa Regiment. During the war he enlisted two more times, once being at Camp Pope, Iowa City, Iowa with Company C. 28th Iowa Infantry, in which he did the most service, attended its reunions and claimed as his own. William was discharged August 25, 1863 in Carrollton, Louisiana.

Berstler, Samuel C. Age 18, residence of Millersburg, nativity Ohio. Enlisted August 15, 1862. Mustered September 17, 1862. Mustered out July 31, 1865, Savannah, Georgia. He was with Company "I" 28th Iowa Infantry. Not much here on this young man.

Binegar, George W., was born in Guernsey County, Ohio, June 20, 1844 to James and Elizabeth (Farmer) Binegar. He departed this life at his home in Montezuma, Iowa on May 21, 1916. George was inducted February 27, 1867 at Camp Pope, Iowa City, Iowa with Company C. 28th regiment Iowa Volunteer Infantry under Captain J. W. Carr, for three years or during the war. He was discharged January 30, 1865, Davenport, Iowa. Binegar, Hulda (Sheley), born in Guernsey County, Ohio, February 14, 1849 and departed this life August 15, 1912 in Montezuma, Iowa. She is the wife of George W. Binegar.

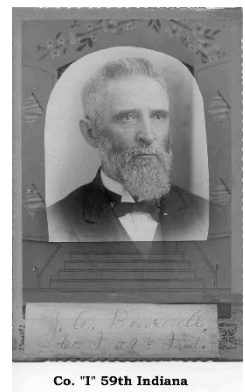


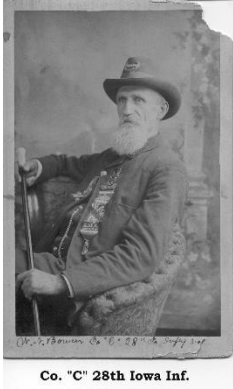
Bogard, Jacob S., born in Rose County, Ohio, December 11, 1847 and departed this life September 25, 1934 in Montezuma, Iowa. Jacob was with Logan's 15th army corps, composed as unseasoned men, so they never engaged in any major battles but served at guard and scout work, which led them into frequent skirmishes with the "Johny Rebs." He was discharged in Aug 1864.



Bone, Thomas, born near Jamestown, Ohio, February 11, 1832 and died at Excelsior Springs, Missouri, May 6, 1905. Thomas enlisted in the service of his country early in the war of the Rebellion, with Company I 35th Iowa Infantry, August 14, 1863. He was wounded severely and had his arm amputated, July 14, 1864 and he was discharged February 7, 1865 at Keokuk County, Iowa.

Bonewell, John Andrew, born in Worchester County, Maryland, May 25, 1832 and departed this life October 18, 1901 in Montezuma, Iowa. John enlisted in the civil war with Company I 59th Indiana Volunteers, October 15, 1861 and was honorably discharged July 20, 1862.





Bowen, William Nichols, born near Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, September 9, 1835 and departed this life on January 8, 1904 at Montezuma, Iowa. William enlisted with Company C 28th Iowa Infantry, August 7, 1862 and served until July 31, 1865, discharged in Savannah, Georgia.

Bowman, James A., at the age of 18 he enlisted with Company C. 28th Iowa Infantry, February 1, 1864 and mustered out July 31, 1865, Savannah, Georgia. Not much here on this young man.



Breniman, Rudolph "Ruben," born in Zimmerwald, Berne, Switzerland, March 23, 1843 and departed this life May 21, 1933 Los Angeles, California. Ruben is the son of Christian and Barbara Duerig Breniman. He enlisted with his brother Fred and was placed with Company H 28th Iowa Infantry. He was made the drummer boy and his drum is in the Historical Museum in Des Moines, Iowa. Ruben was discharged July 31, 1865, Savannah, Georgia.

Bryan, Alanson, born April 27, 1843, near Jamestown, Green County, Ohio and passed away at his home east of Montezuma, Iowa, June 4, 1923. At the call for volunteers he enlisted in Company B 40th Iowa Infantry, August 22, 1862 at Camp Pope, Iowa City, Iowa and served until the close of the war. Alanson was honorably discharged August 2, 1865 at Fort Gibson, Nation Cherokee.





Bryan, Andrew Alanson born April 27, 1843, Green County, Ohio and died February 23, 1917. July 8, 1861 he enlisted for service in the civil war in a company organized by Captain Albert Head. This Company was taken to Iowa City, Iowa where it became a part of the 10th Iowa Infantry and designated Company F. Andrew was wounded in the left limb at the siege of Vicksburg in April 1864. This injury was of such a nature that he was incapacitated for further service and was honorably discharged.

Bryan, Neri lived in Montezuma from 1870 until 1887 when he moved to Watsonville, California. He enlisted in Company F 10th Iowa Infantry. He died January of 1927 in California.



Bryan, Silas born in Ohio. He enlisted in Company F. 10th Iowa Infantry And mustered in September 7, 1861. He was killed in action May 16, 1863 at Champion Hills, Mississippi.

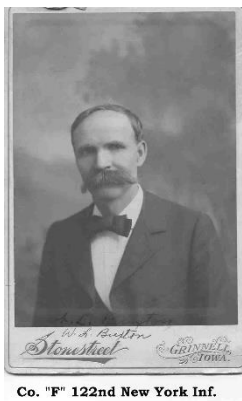
Bunnell Sr., Jesse I. was in Pennsylvania, April 13, 1835 and departed this life in Montezuma, Iowa, March 7, 1893. When the civil war came on he responded to the call for troops and went out in defense of his country. Jesse joined Company H 93rd Illinois Infantry at Mineral, Illinois, on August 14, 1862 and continued in the army until the close of the war.





Bushong, George W. born June 15, 1834 in Logan County, Ohio and died April 23, 1909 at Morris Company Kansas. He enlisted Aug. 22, 1861 in Company F. 10th Iowa Infantry He was promoted to Sixth Corporal in 1862 and Fourth Corporal May 1863.

Bushong, Samuel born Dec. 30, 1841 and died Jan. 17, 1925 at Cloud County, Kansas. He enlisted in Company F. 10th Iowa Infantry and mustered in Sept. 7, 1861. He was slightly wounded in the head May of 1863 and mustered out September 28, 1864.



Buxton, William born March 31, 1841 in Wells, Somersetshire, England and died January 1925 at Los Angeles, California. He enlisted August 28, 1862 in Company F 122nd New York. He was wounded in 1864 and spent sixteen months in the hospital in Washington D.C. and mustered out in October of 1865. He was elected Auditor of Poweshiek County in 1892.

Byers, John Thomas born August 15, 1830 in Lawrence County Pennsylvania and died Nov. 23, 1915 at Osceola, Polk County, Nebraska. He entered the service in Company I. 13th Iowa Infantry in 1861 and remained in the service until 1865. He participated in the battle of Shiloh. He lived in Poweshiek County from 1855 until 1892.

Campbell, Frank T. born May 8, 1830 in Ripley, Brown County, Ohio and died March 1907 at Lima Ohio. Enlisted in Company C 28th Iowa Infantry in 1862. A few months later he transferred to the Fortieth Regiment and later to Company B 40th Iowa Infantry.

Carr, John born April 26, 1839 in Illinois and died in Montezuma, Iowa on April of 1929. He enlisted in Company F 10th Iowa Infantry and was breveted a major by President Andrew Jackson for exceptional bravery in the war.

Crego, Stephen B. born March 12, 1836 in Guernsey County, Ohio and died in Montezuma, Iowa on February 28, 1913. Enlisted May 2, 1864 at Camp Chase, Ohio and was discharged September 2, 1864

Dailey, Daley, or Daly, Oliver born in 1839 in Vermont. Enlisted in Company B 40th Iowa Infantry in October of 1862. He was discharged for promotion as First Lieutenant of Company H 4th Arkansas Colored Infantry March 12, 1864 at Little Rock, Arkansas.

Dalby, Simon J. born October 15, 1834 in Green County Ohio and died December 31, 1919 in Pottawattamie County, Iowa. Enlisted in Company B 40th Iowa Infantry. He was appointed Second Lieutenant August 22, 1862 and discharged February 27, 1864.

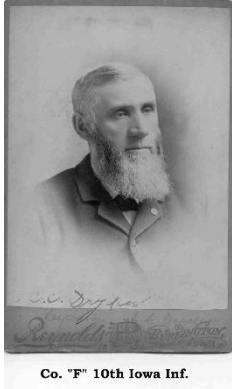
Darnell, James A. born in Indiana in 1843. Enlisted September 22, 1862 in Co. C 28th Iowa Infantry. Mustered out July 31, 1865 at Savannah, Georgia. He moved to Winterset, Iowa but could not find any death for him.



Dean, Daniel R., born in Fulton County, Illinois, February 17, 1839 and died at his home in Montezuma, May 21, 1913. Daniel enlisted with Company C 98th Illinois, August 14, 1862 and was mustered into the U.S. service October 13, 1862, serving his country faithfully for about a year when he was honorably discharged for disability. He was an honor member of the G.A.R.

Dorrance, Orange Fuller, born in Starke County, Illinois, August 28, 1838 and departed this life at his daughter, Florence McCandless at Perry, Oklahoma, January 26, 1924. Orange enlisted with Company C 28th Iowa Infantry, July 29, 1862 in Iowa City, Iowa and was in the service until the close of the war, July 31, 1865 in Savanna, Georgia





Dryden, Carlton C, according to Find A Grave Memorial #115084408, was born March 6, 1842 in Highland County, Ohio and departed this life at his niece Mary Vinton in Burlington, Iowa, June 29, 1931. Carlton enlisted with Company F 10th Iowa Infantry. Promoted as a Captain, January 4, 1864, he mustered out August 15, 1865 in Little Rock, Arkansas.

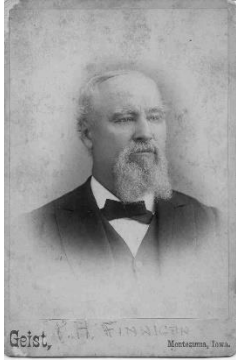
Dryden, John F., born September 25, 1841 in Adams County, Ohio and died July 26, 1921, at his home in Montezuma, Iowa. John enlisted with Company A 2nd Ohio Heavy Artillery, June 30, 1863. He received his discharge May 12, 1865 at Camp Denison, Ohio.



Emery, David Henry, according to Find A Grave Memorial #24866304 was born in Fulton County, Illinois, December 4, 1837 and departed this life on January 12, 1918 in Ottumwa, Iowa. David enlisted in Company F 10th

Farmer, John Wesley, born in Pickway County, Ohio, December 22, 1833 and died July 14, 1900 in Big Rock, Illinois. On August 15, 1862, he enlisted in Company B 40th Iowa Infantry in Iowa City, Iowa and mustered out of the service as 1st Lieutenant August 2, 1865 at Fort Gibson, Nation Cherokee.

Finnigan, Patrick H., born County West Meath, Ireland on April 1, 1831 and departed this life on July 23, 1896 in Montezuma, Iowa. Patrick enlisted with Company I 2nd Pennsylvania Infantry in Harrisburg Pennsylvania on April 20, 1861 and was discharged July 26, 1865

Garing, John was born in Wurttemberg, Germany, February 23, 1838 and died in Montezuma, Iowa, November 14, 1893. John enlisted in Company F 10th Iowa Volunteer Infantry on August 1, 1861. His regiment was in some of the hardest battles of the war and he was always at the front doing his duty with bravery and heroism. John was discharged October 1, 1863 in Memphis, Tennessee. John married Mary Malinda Johnson, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Lynch Johnson. She was born in Highland County, Ohio, November 26, 1845 and died April 27, 1928 at Fruita, Colorado.

Garnett, William J., born July 31 1837 in Ross County Ohio and died June 8, 1891 in Montezuma, Iowa. He served in Company H 16th Iowa Infantry, October 1, 1864 and was discharged May 30, 1865.

Garvin, Samuel W., according to Find A Grave Memorial #54863992, Samuel, born, January 18, 1843 and died January 4, 1912. He served with Company F 64th Illinois.

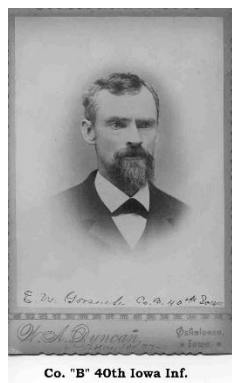

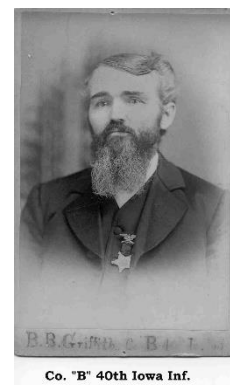
Gilmore, William H., the son of William and Susanna Gilmore. He was born in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania and departed from this life March 2, 1926 in Montezuma, Iowa. He enlisted with Company A 9th Illinois Cavalry, September 15, 1861 and was discharged September 12, 1862.

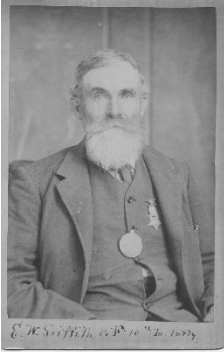
Gordon, Alexander, born in Scotland, May 29, 1823 and departed from this life March 16, 1888. When the war broke out he enlisted in Company C 28th Iowa Infantry Volunteers and served through the war. On April 8, 1864, he was taken prisoner at the battle of Sabin Cross Roads and taken to Tyler, Texas for thirteen months. He was discharged July 7, 1865 in Davenport, Iowa.



Gorsuch, Ezekiel W., born in Delaware County, Ohio, April 17, 1840 and passed away July 25, 1886, Browntown, Iowa. He enlisted in Company B 40th Iowa Infantry, August 14, 1860 and discharged, October 7, 1863 for disability.

Griffith, Benjamin Brook, son of Isaac Newton and Pauline Johnson Griffith, was born September 1, 1837 in Jamestown, Ohio and died October 16, 1921 at Belle Plain, Iowa. On August 14, 1862, he enlisted in Company B 40th Iowa Infantry and discharged by reason of disability on October 1, 1863, Little Rock, Arkansas.

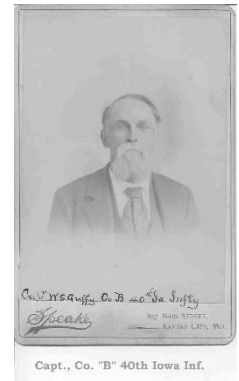

Griffith, Eli W., died at Leavenworth County, Kansas, November 19, 1894. He enlisted with Company C 10th Iowa Infantry. Eli was one of the first to enlist in Montezuma under Captain Head. He went in as a private and came out as a Lieutenant with an offer of a captain but resigned on account of poor health.

Guffy, William S., according to Find A Grave Memorial #4429158, he was born February 20, 1829, McEwensville, Northumberland County, Pennsylvania and died June 27, 1913, Kansas City, Missouri. He is buried at the Old Arcadia Cemetery in Kansas. He served with Company B 40th Iowa Infantry. Ann Elizabeth Broadbrook, his wife, was born near Buffalo, New York, December 9, 1835. She departed from this life at her home Arcadia, Kansas, January 10, 1910. They were married at Brooklyn, Iowa, September 14, 1856. To this union were born eight sons and two daughters.



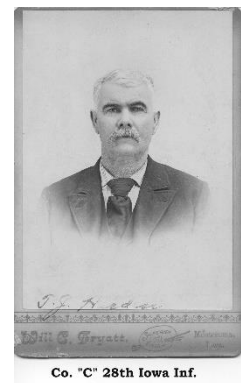

Hall Sr., John, born in County Armah, Ireland, November 18, 1823 and died at his home in Montezuma, Iowa, December 12, 1898. When the war broke out he left everything and enlisted in Company B 40th Iowa Infantry, August 22, 1862. He served through the war and when peace had been declared, he was discharge August 2, 1865 at Fort Hood, Cherokee Nation and return to his farm.

Harden Sr., Thomas J., born in Laurel, Indiana, June 27, 1844 and died September 13, 1924 in Montezuma, Iowa. On August 14, 1862 he responded to the call of President Lincoln for soldiers to preserve the Union, and enlisted in Company C 28th Iowa Volunteers, which was recruited by Captain J. W. Carr in Montezuma, Iowa. On July 31, 1865, at Savannah, Georgia, Thomas with his other comrades received an honorable discharge from the service.



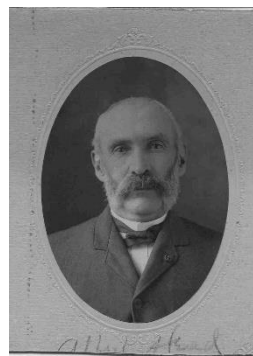

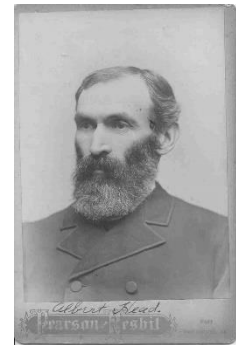

Havlin, Luther C., according to Find A Grave #49688836, Luther was born in New York, May 3, 1839 and died in Norton, Norton County, Kansas, April 5, 1915. He enlisted in Company F 10th Iowa Infantry, December 11, 1863. Not much here on this young man.

Head, Albert, according to Find A Grave Memorial #24052534, Albert was born in Highland County, Ohio November 25, 1838 and passed away October 18, 1922 in Des Moines, Iowa. He enlisted in Company F 10th Iowa Infantry. Albert assisted in the organization of Company F 10th Iowa Volunteers, and was commissioned captain. Albert is the brother of Mahlon Head.

Head, Mahlon, according to Find A Grave Memorial #21017058, Mahlon was born in Marshall, Highland County, Ohio, July 12, 1835 and died January 17, 1920 at Jefferson, Iowa. He enlisted in Company F 10th Iowa Infantry, August 22, 1861. Promoted to Quartermaster Sergeant, September 17, 1861. Wounded severely in the thigh, November 25, 1863, at Missionary Ridge, Tennessee. Mustered out January 17, 1865, expiration of term of service. Mahlon is the brother of Captain Albert Head.

Hedge, Jester, born in Green County, Pennsylvania, February 9, 1829 and departed this life at the home of Mrs. C. H. Harner in Montezuma, Iowa, January 16, 1923. September 3, 1861, he enlisted in Company G 8th Iowa Infantry and served with that organization throughout the period of the Civil War. He was discharged from the service, September 28, 1864, having served three years and twenty-five days.

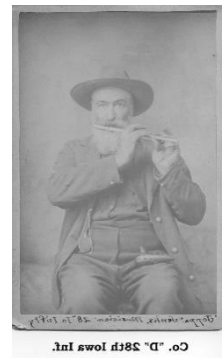
Hestwood, Virgil E., was a native of Ohio and a resident of Newton. Virgil enlisted in Company B 40th Iowa Infantry, May 20, 1863 and mustered out August 2, 1865 at Fort Gibson, Cherokee Nation. Not much here on this young man

Hiatt, James M., according to Find A Grave Memorial #12585475, he was born in New Castle, Indiana and departed this life April 17, 1923 in Des Moines, Iowa. James is buried at the Forest Cemetery in Oskaloosa, Iowa. He enlisted in Company B 40th Iowa Infantry, August 8, 1862 and mustered out August 2, 1865 at Fort Gibson, Cherokee Nation.



Hogan, August M., born in Tepperary County, Ireland, December 25, 1837 and departed this life January 7, 1897 in Montezuma, Iowa. On August 6, 1861, being then a young man of 24 years old, he responded to the call for troops and enlisted in Company H 2nd Illinois Cavalry in McDonough County, Illinois. In 1862 at Holly Springs, he was taken prisoner, was subsequently exchanged and in August 1864 he received his honorable discharge. He was honored and highly esteemed member of Wisner Post 127.

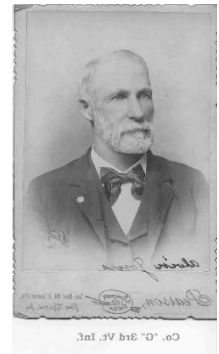
Jenks, Jonathan born in 1840 in Pennsylvania and was nicknames “Joppa”. He enlisted in Company D 28th Iowa Infantry August 8, 1862 as a Fifer. He mustered in September 4, 1862 and was promoted Fife Major on July 1, 1863. He was discharged June 8, 1865 at Hilton Head South Carolina. He served as Regimental Postmaster throughout his service. He moved from Montezuma to Vinton, Iowa.





Johnson, William born in Maryland. Enlisted in Company E 20th Iowa Infantry on August 13, 1862 and was mustered in on August 22, 1862. He was mustered out July 8, 1865 in Mobile, Alabama. He then moved to Davenport.

Jones, Alvin born May 14, 1826 at Dorchester, Massachusetts and died in Montezuma September 27, 1917. He enlisted May 14, 1861 in Company G 3rd Vermont Infantry and later transferred to Company D. Mustered out July 27, 1864 at Burlington, Vermont. Came to Malcom, Iowa in 1867. He represented Poweshiek County in the General Assembly in 1893 and 1895. He moved to Montezuma in 1904.



Jones, Henry born in Bedford, Lawrence County, Indiana July 31, 1846 and died in Montezuma, Iowa May 3, 1925. He enlisted in Company K 2nd Iowa Infantry when he was eighteen and served until July 12, 1865 when he was discharged at Jonesville, Kentucky. He was with General Sherman on his famous march to the sea

Jonte, Peter born July 23, 1838 in Hamilton County, Ohio and died June 24, 1889 in Montezuma, Iowa. He enlisted September 30, 1861 in Company A 60th Ohio Volunteers and was discharged November 10, 1862. He re-enlisted in Company D 4th Battalion Ohio Calvary August 1st 1863 and mustered out March 4, 1864.





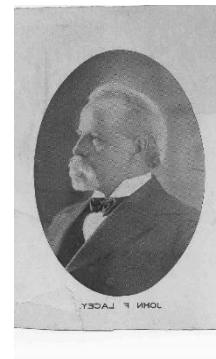
Jordan, Edwin Thomas born in Richland Grove, Mercer County, Illinois Dec. 18, 1843 and died at Montezuma, Iowa November 6, 1924. He enlisted August 1, 1864 in Company C 112nd Illinois Infantry and was transferred to the 16th Illinois Infantry on May 24, 1865. In June of 1865 he was discharged at Springfield, Illinois. He moved to Montezuma in December of 1869.

Kiser, Nicholas born September 1, 1836 in Cleveland, Ohio and died July 3, 1906 at What Cheer, Iowa. He enlisted September 18, 1861 in Company F 10th Iowa Infantry. In May of 1863 at Willikins Bend, Louisiana, he was accidentally wounded on a steamer and was discharged March 12, 1864 at St. Louis, Missouri for disability.



Kisor, Morgan L. born September 2, 1842 in Ohio and died January 2, 1919 in California. He enlisted August 15, 1862 as Second Corporal in Company B 40th Iowa Infantry. Promoted to First Corporal July 18, 1864 and fourth Sergeant March 12, 1865. He mustered out August 2, 1865 at Ft. Gibson, Cherokee Nation. He lived most of his life in Union Mills, Mahaska County, Iowa.

Lacey, John F. born May 30, 1841 in New Martinsville, Virginia and died September 29, 1913 at Oskaloosa, Iowa. He enlisted in Company H 3rd Iowa Infantry and later served in Company D 33rd Iowa Infantry and later reassigned to Company C 33rd Iowa Infantry. He was an 8 term Republican Congressman from Iowa's 6th congressional district.





Larkin, John, according to Find A Grave Memorial #23938212. John was born in Ohio, May 12, 1835 and died July 15, 1913 in Clay County, Nebraska. August 15, 1863, he enlisted in Company B 40th Iowa Infantry and mustered out August 2, 1865, Fort Gibson, Cherokee Nation.

Lawrence, George G, was a native of Ohio and a resident of Montezuma, Iowa. On August 22, 1861, at the age of 18 years old, he enlisted in Company F 10th Iowa Infantry. George mustered out August 15, 1865 at Little Rock, Arkansas. Not much here on this young man.

LeVake, Thomas J., born in Troy, New York, March 22, 1838 and departed this life on January 26, 1903 in Belleview, Ohio. During the war of the rebellion, he enlisted in the Company F 10th Iowa Infantry on September 22, 1861 in Iowa City, Iowa and discharged August 15, 1865 at Little Rock, Arkansas.
