

## **MEASURABLE GOALS**

- The Advisory Committee spent most of the October meeting reviewing measurable goals for each issue statement being represented in the plan.

- Some questions brought up from the committee were centered around the types of models being used for cropland, role of waste water processes, and how we should be setting goals that focus more around best practices. - During the review process, it was discovered that most of the measurable goals the committee recommended, in previous meetings, were more related to specific actions. As a result, the Advisory Committee reworked the measurable goals and actions for each issue statement, while using "desired future conditions" as the foundation.
