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Introduction

Rev. Dr. Jayme Mathias

For over four years before his retirement from active ministry at the end of 2020, Father Roy Gomez led a weekly bible study and rosary here at Holy Family Catholic Church in Austin, Texas. Father Roy is no stranger to the rosary: Our St. Francis of Assisi Joy Group, a parish ministry to the elderly, homebound and bereaved that Father Roy helped lead through the years, had prayed over 1,000 funeral rosaries by the time it celebrated its silver jubilee nearly five years ago!

I refer to the prayer experience that he shared at the conclusion of our weekly bible study as "Father Roy's Rosary." I'm an admirer of Father Roy's Rosary for many reasons:

- It is scriptural. Catholics are not famous for knowing the bible, but Father Roy's Rosary shares a line of scripture before every prayer, allowing us to grow in our acquaintance of scripture.
- It is meditative. By introducing more scripture into the rosary, Father Roy fuels our Catholic imagination with more sources for prayer and meditation from Jesus' life and words. If you're praying Father Roy's Rosary alone, you might consider pausing for some seconds or even minutes after each scriptural reference, simply to reflect on the deep meaning of the words of scripture.
- It is participative. The Second Vatican Council (1962-1965) emphasized that Catholic prayer should encourage the full, conscious and active participation of all involved. Father Roy encouraged lay participation by teaching people to lead the rosary; he also invited each participant to lead two Hail Mary's at a time in an established order, so that all voices would be heard throughout the rosary.

As you pray Father Roy's Rosary, I challenge you to exercise mindfulness. As Catholics, we too often fall into the trap of mindlessly rushing through the parroted words of memorized prayers.

The rosary is *not* a race: I challenge you to slow down and take your time as you meditate and "chew on" the words of each scripture and prayer.

Praying the rosary is *not* an exercise in reading: Though this rosary is expressed in written form, I challenge you to allow the words of each prayer to emanate from your heart. Pray the rosary; don't parrot it.

The rosary is *not* a contest: If you pray Father Roy's Rosary with others, I challenge you to be mindful of how your words and actions affect the prayer of others, to pray together with "one voice," and to avoid the cacophony created by praying the same words at different paces.

The words in this book are simply a guide for prayer. Please adapt them in a way that helps you and others to better pray and grow in your relationship with God. Feel free to add prayers, omit prayers, or modify prayers. Make the praying of this scriptural rosary a personally-meaningful experience for you and others!

Finally, feel free to personalize this book. Write your name on the cover. Jot notes throughout the work. Record your prayer intentions inside the front cover. Dog-ear the first page of each set of mysteries. As a meditative practice, color all the illustrations by Kristen Rabideau in this work, or share them as a catechetical lesson with your children or grandchildren, inviting them to color and autograph the illustrations for you—so that you'll be reminded to pray for the artists every time you say the rosary!

In the gospels of Matthew and Mark, Jesus suggests that the greatest prescripts of the Hebrew law are love of God and love of neighbor (Mt. 22:37-39, Mk. 12:30-31). May Father Roy's Rosary help us all to grow in our relationship with God and with all those beautiful, diverse people with whom and for whom we pray!

Before You Pray

Before you pray the rosary, consider the environment in which you're praying. Turn off your phone and television, remove distractions, place visual reminders of prayer before you: a cross, a bible and/or the images of saints. Dim the lights. Burn incense as a symbol of your prayer rising to God. Light a candle as a symbol of your prayer intentions, and ask God to illuminate your heart and mind—as well as the darkness in our world.

Pause and prayerfully consider how you are in God and how God is in you. Take a deep breath and imagine breathing in God's life-giving Spirit. Exhale and recall the responsibility we have to share God's life-giving Spirit with those around us. Breathe in and praise God for the marvelous gift of life. Breathe out and release the stress from your body, the preoccupations from your mind, and the burdens from your heart.

Call to mind the intentions for which you'd like to pray.

For the following prayers, all instructions are italicized. If you pray with others, the leader says all words in regular font, and all others respond with the words in bold.

The Joyful Mysteries

We pray the Joyful Mysteries on Mondays and Saturdays and during the Advent/Christmas season.

On the cross or crucifix:

+ In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. **Amen.**

I believe in God the Father Almighty, Creator of heaven and earth; and in Jesus Christ, His only Son, our Lord; who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died and was buried. He descended into hell. On the third day, he rose again; he ascended into heaven, and sits at the right hand of God, the Father Almighty; from thence he shall come to judge the living and the dead. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Holy Catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and life everlasting. Amen.

On each large bead:

Our Father who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name: Thy kingdom come, thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread, and forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. Amen.

We pray for an increase in the virtues of faith, hope and love.

On the three subsequent small beads:

Faith is the assurance of things hoped for, the conviction of things not seen. (Heb. 11:1)

Hail Mary, full of grace, the Lord is with thee. Blessed art thou among women, and blessed is the fruit of thy womb, Jesus. Holy Mary, Mother of God, pray for us sinners, now and at the hour of our death. Amen.

My hope comes from God. (Ps. 62:5) Hail Mary...

Three things will last forever—faith, hope, and love—and the greatest of these is love. (1Cor. 13:13)

After each set of Hail Mary's:

Glory be to the Father, and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit. As it was in the beginning, is now and ever shall be, world without end. Amen.

O my Jesus, forgive us our sins, save us from the fires of hell, and lead all souls to heaven, especially those in most need of thy mercy.



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The First Joyful Mystery The Annunciation

The angel Gabriel appeared to Mary, telling her that she would conceive by the Holy Spirit and bear God's Son. Our Father...

- 1. Six months after Elizabeth became pregnant, God sent the angel Gabriel to Nazareth, to a young lady named Mary. (Lk. 1:26-27) Hail Mary...
- 2. The angel entered her home and greeted her, saying, "Hail, you who are favored by the Lord! The Lord is with you!" (Lk. 1:28) Hail Mary...
- 3. Startled by the angel, Mary wondered what this greeting meant. (Lk. 1:29) Hail Mary...
- 4. The angel said, "Do not be afraid, Mary. You have found favor with God. You will become pregnant and give birth to a son, and you will name him Jesus." (Lk. 1:30-31) Hail Mary...
- 5. "He will be great. Indeed, he will be called the Son of the Most High!" (Lk. 1:32) Hail Mary...
- 6. "The Lord God will give him the throne of his ancestor David, and his kingdom will never end." (Lk. 1:32-33) Hail Mary...
- 7. Mary asked the angel, "How can this be, since I have had no relationship with a man?" (Lk. 1:34) Hail Mary...

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The Second Joyful Mystery The Visitation

Mary visited her relative, Elizabeth, who proclaimed that Mary would always be remembered. Our Father...

- 1. Mary hurried to a city in the mountains of Judah, where she entered Zechariah's home and greeted Elizabeth. (Lk. 1:39-40) Hail Mary...
- 2. Elizabeth heard Mary's greeting, felt the baby in her womb kick, and was filled with the Holy Spirit. (Lk 1:41) Hail Mary...
- 3. Elizabeth cried out in a loud voice, "Blessed are you among women, and blessed is the fruit of your womb!" (Lk. 1:42) Hail Mary...
- 4. "Who am I that the mother of my Lord has come to me? Blessed are you for believing that the Lord would keep his promise to you!" (Lk. 1:43 & 45) Hail Mary...
- 5. Mary said, "My soul proclaims the greatness of the Lord, and my spirit finds joy in God, my Savior, who looked favorably on me, a humble servant." (Lk. 1:46-49) Hail Mary...
- 6. "From this day forward, all people will call me blessed, for the Almighty has done great things for me, and holy is God's name." (Lk. 1:48-49) Hail Mary...
- 7. "God has shown mercy to all who fear God." (Lk. 1:50) Hail Mary...
- 8. "God has shown strength, scattering the proud, pulling the mighty from their thrones, and lifting up the humble." (Lk. 1:51-52) Hail Mary...
- 9. "God has filled the hungry with good things and has sent the rich away empty." (Lk. 1:53) Hail Mary...
- 10. "God has come to the aid of Israel, remembering the promise made to our ancestors: to Abraham and Sarah and their descendants." (Lk. 1:54-55) Hail Mary... Glory be... O my Jesus...



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The Third Joyful Mystery The Nativity

Mary gave birth to her son, Jesus. Our Father...

- 1. The Emperor Augustus ordered a census of the Roman Empire, and all people went to register in the cities where their ancestors had lived. So Joseph, a descendant of King David, traveled with Mary to Bethlehem. (Lk. 2:1-5) Hail Mary...
- 2. While they were in Bethlehem, the time came for Mary to have her child. (Lk. 2:6) Hail Mary...
- 3. Mary gave birth to her firstborn son, wrapped him in swaddling clothes, and laid him in a manger—because there was no room for them at the inn. (Lk. 2:7) Hail Mary...
- 4. An angel appeared to the shepherds in the fields near Bethlehem, saying, "Today your Savior, Christ the Lord, was born in David's city. You will find him wrapped in swaddling clothes and lying in a manger!" (Lk. 2:8-12) Hail Mary...
- 5. A large number of angels appeared, crying out, "Glory to God in the highest heaven, and peace on earth to all people of good will!" (Lk. 2:13-14) Hail Mary...
- 6. The shepherds said to each other, "Let us go to Bethlehem and see the newborn King!" (Lk. 2:15) Hail Mary...
- 7. The shepherds found Mary and Joseph with the baby, who was lying in the manger. (Lk. 2:16) Hail Mary...
- 8. The shepherds shared their story, and all who heard it were amazed. (Lk. 2:17-18) Hail Mary...
- 9. Mary treasured all these events in her heart. (Lk. 2:19) Hail Mary...
- 10. The shepherds returned to their flocks, glorifying and praising God for all they had seen and heard. (Lk. 2:20) Hail Mary... Glory be... O my Jesus...




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The Fourth Joyful Mystery The Presentation

Mary and Joseph took the infant Jesus to the temple, to present him to God. Our Father...

- 1. Eight days after Jesus' birth, Joseph and Mary took him to the temple, to be circumcised. (Lk. 2:21) Hail Mary...
- 2. They offered a pair of doves, in accordance with the Law: "Every firstborn boy is to be set apart as holy to the Lord." (Lk. 2:23-24) Hail Mary...
- 3. Simeon was waiting in the temple for the one who would comfort Israel. (Lk. 2:25) Hail Mary...
- 4. The Holy Spirit had told Simeon that he would not die until he had seen the messiah. (Lk. 2:25-26) Hail Mary...
- 5. When Mary and Joseph brought the child Jesus into the courtyard, Simeon took the child into his arms and praised God. (Lk. 2:27) Hail Mary...
- 6. Simeon said, "Lord, let your servant go in peace, for my eyes have seen the salvation that you have prepared in the sight of your people." (Lk. 2:29-31) Hail Mary...
- 7. "He will be a light revealing your salvation to the nations, bringing glory to your people, Israel." (Lk. 2:32) Hail Mary...
- 8. Then Simeon said to Mary, "Your child will cause the rise and fall of many in Israel, and a sword of sorrow will pierce your heart." (Lk. 2:34-35) Hail Mary...
- 9. Anna, a prophetess and widow, praised God and spoke of Jesus to all who awaited the liberation of Israel. (Lk. 2:36-38) Hail Mary...
- 10. After doing what the Lord prescribed, Joseph and Mary returned to their hometown of Nazareth in Galilee, and their child grew strong and was filled with wisdom—and God's favor was with him. (Lk. 2:39-40) Hail Mary... Glory be... O my Jesus...



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The Fifth Joyful Mystery The Finding of Jesus in the Temple

Mary and Joseph found Jesus in the temple, discussing his faith with the teachers and elders. Our Father...

- 1. When Jesus was twelve years old, his parents took him to Jerusalem for the festival of Passover, as was their custom. (Lk. 2:41-42) Hail Mary...
- 2. When the festival was over, Mary and Joseph left for home, not knowing that Jesus stayed behind in Jerusalem. (Lk. 2:43) Hail Mary...
- 3. They looked for Jesus among their relatives and friends. (Lk. 2:44) Hail Mary...
- 4. Not finding him, Joseph and Mary returned to Jerusalem, to look for their son. (Lk. 2:45) Hail Mary...
- 5. Three days later, they found Jesus in the temple courtyard, sitting among the teachers, listening to them, and asking them questions. (Lk. 2:46) Hail Mary...
- 6. Everyone was astonished by Jesus' understanding and answers. (Lk. 2:47) Hail Mary...
- 7. Mary said to Jesus, "Son, why have you done this to us? Your father and I have been worried sick looking for you!" (Lk. 2:48) Hail Mary...
- 8. Jesus replied, "Why were you looking for me? Didn't you know that I would be here in God's temple?" (Lk. 2:49) Hail Mary...
- 9. Mary and Joseph didn't understand what he meant. (Lk. 2:50) Hail Mary...
- 10. Jesus returned with his parents to Nazareth, where he grew in wisdom and maturity, gaining favor in the eyes of God and people. (Lk. 2:51-52) Hail Mary... Glory be... O my Jesus...

Concluding Prayers

After reciting all five decades, recite the following prayers.

Hail, Holy Queen, mother of mercy; our life, our sweetness, and our hope. To thee do we cry, poor banished children of Eve. To thee do we send up our sighs, mourning and weeping in this valley of tears. Turn, then, most gracious advocate, thine eyes of mercy toward us. And after this, our exile, show unto us the blessed fruit of thy womb, Jesus. O clement, O loving, O sweet Virgin Mary.


Pray for us, O holy Mother of God, that we may be made worthy of the promises of Christ.

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The First Luminous Mystery The Baptism of Jesus in the Jordan River

Jesus was baptized by John the Baptist and was revealed as God's beloved Son. Our Father...

- 1. Jesus came from Galilee to be baptized by John the Baptist in the Jordan River. (Mt. 3:13) Hail Mary...
- 2. When John saw Jesus, he said, "Behold the Lamb of God, who takes away the sins of the world!" (Jn. 1:19) Hail Mary...
- 3. John continued, "This is the one of whom I have said, 'The one who comes after me ranks ahead of me, for he was before me." (Jn. 1:30) Hail Mary...
- 4. John told Jesus, "I need to be baptized by you, and yet you come to me?" (Mt. 3:14) Hail Mary...
- 5. Jesus answered him, "Allow it for now, for thus it is fitting for us to fulfill all righteousness." (Mt. 3:15) Hail Mary...
- 6. When Jesus was baptized, the heavens were immediately opened, and the Spirit descended on him in the form of a dove. (Mk. 1:10) Hail Mary...
- 7. A voice from heaven said, "This is my beloved son, with whom I am well pleased." (Mt. 3:17) Hail Mary...
- 8. John testified, "I have seen and have borne witness that this is the Son of God!" (Jn. 1:34) Hail Mary...
- 9. John said, "For this I came baptizing with water: that he might be revealed to Israel." (Jn. 1:31) Hail Mary...
- 10. Jesus was then led into the wilderness, to be tempted by Satan. (Mt. 4:1) Hail Mary... Glory be... O my Jesus...



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The Second Luminous Mystery The Wedding at Cana

At the request of Mary, Jesus performed his first miracle. Our Father...

- 1. Four days after meeting Andrew and Simon, Jesus and his disciples were invited to a wedding in the city of Cana in Galilee. (Jn. 2:1-2) Hail Mary...
- 2. Jesus' mother was there, too. (Jn. 2:1) Hail Mary...
- 3. When the wine was gone, Jesus' mother said to him, "They're out of wine." (Jn. 2:3) Hail Mary...
- 4. Jesus said to her, "Why did you come to me? My time has not yet come." (Jn. 2:4) Hail Mary...
- 5. Mary told the servers, "Do whatever he tells you." (Jn. 2:5) Hail Mary...
- 6. There were six stone water jars for Jewish purification rituals, each holding 18 to 27 gallons. Jesus told the servers, "Fill the jars with water." (Jn. 2:6-7) Hail Mary...
- 7. Jesus told the servants, "Pour some, and take it to the steward in charge." The servers did as they were told. (Jn. 2:8) Hail Mary...
- 8. The steward tasted the water that had become wine. (Jn. 2:9) Hail Mary...
- 9. The steward called the groom and said to him, "Everyone serves the best wine first, then, when people are drunk, they serve cheap wine but you have saved the best wine for now!" (Jn. 2:9-10) Hail Mary...
- 10. This was Jesus' first miracle, where he made his glory public, and his disciples began to believe in him. (Jn. 2:11) Hail Mary... Glory be... O my Jesus...




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The Third Luminous Mystery The Proclamation of the Kingdom

Jesus called all people to conversion and service to God's kingdom. Our Father...

- 1. In those days, John the Baptist preached in the wilderness of Judea: "Repent for the kingdom of heaven is at hand!" (Mt. 3:1-2) Hail Mary...
- 2. Jesus left Nazareth and lived in Capernaum by the sea, so that the words of the prophet Isaiah might be fulfilled. (Mt. 4:13-14) Hail Mary...
- 3. "The people who sat in darkness have seen a great light!" (Mt. 4:16) Hail Mary...
- 4. From that time, Jesus began to preach, "Repent, for the kingdom of God is at hand!" (Mt. 4:17) Hail Mary...
- 5. Jesus came to his own country and taught the people in their synagogues. (Mt. 13:53-54) Hail Mary...
- 6. The people were astonished and asked, "Where did he get this wisdom and these mighty works?" (Mt. 13:54) Hail Mary...
- 7. "Is this not the carpenter's son? Don't we know his mother, Mary?" (Mt. 13:55) Hail Mary...
- 8. "We know his brothers: James, Joseph, Simon and Judas. His sisters are here with us. Where, then, did he get this wisdom?" (Mt. 13:55-56) Hail Mary...
- 9. The people took offense at Jesus, who said, "A prophet is not without honor, except in his own country." (Mt. 13:57) Hail Mary...
- 10. Jesus laid his hands on the sick and healed them. (Mk. 6:5) Hail Mary... Glory be... O my Jesus...



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The Fourth Luminous Mystery The Transfiguration of Jesus

Jesus was revealed in glory to Peter, James and John. Our Father...

- 1. Jesus took Peter, James and John and led them up a high mountain. (Mt. 17:1) Hail Mary...
- 2. Jesus was transfigured before them, his face shone like the sun, and his garments became white as light! (Mt. 17:2) Hail Mary...
- 3. Behold, there appeared to them Moses and Elijah, talking to Jesus (Mt. 17:3) Hail Mary...
- 4. Peter said to Jesus, "Lord, it is good that we are here!" (Mt. 17:4) Hail Mary...
- 5. "We will set up three tents: one for you, one for Moses, and one for Elijah!" (Mt. 17:4) Hail Mary...
- 6. While Peter was still speaking, a bright cloud overshadowed them. (Mt. 17:5) Hail Mary...
- 7. A voice came from the cloud, saying, "This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased. Listen to him!" (Mt. 17:5) Hail Mary...
- 8. The disciples fell on their faces, filled with awe. (Mt. 17:6) Hail Mary...
- 9. When they lifted their eyes, they saw no one, but Jesus alone. (Mt. 17:8) Hail Mary...
- 10. As they came down the mountain, Jesus commanded them: "Tell no one of the vision until the Son of God is raised from the dead." (Mt. 17:9) Hail Mary... Glory be... O my Jesus...



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The Fifth Luminous Mystery The Institution of the Eucharist

Jesus shared a loaf of bread and a cup of wine as his last meal with his friends. Our Father...

- 1. Jesus said, "If you eat my flesh and drink my blood, you will live in me, and I in you." (Jn. 6:56) Hail Mary...
- 2. When it was evening, Jesus sat at table with the twelve disciples. (Mt. 26:20) Hail Mary...
- 3. Jesus said to his disciples, "I have earnestly desired to eat this passover with you before I suffer." (Lk. 22:15) Hail Mary...
- 4. Jesus rose from supper, laid aside his garments, girded himself with a towel, and began to wash the disciple's feet. (Jn. 13:4-5) Hail Mary...
- 5. After he washed their feet, he said, "If I, your Lord and Teacher, have washed your feet, you, too, should wash one another's feet." (Jn. 13:14) Hail Mary...
- 6. As they were eating, Jesus took bread, blessed it, broke it and gave it to his disciples, saying, "Take, eat, this is my body." (Mt. 26:26) Hail Mary...
- 7. He then took a cup, gave thanks, and gave it to them, saying, "Drink of it, all of you. This is my blood of the covenant, which is poured out for you." (Mt. 26:27-28) Hail Mary...
- 8. "I will not drink again of the fruit of the vine until I drink it anew in the kingdom of heaven." (Mt. 26:29) Hail Mary...
- 9. The cup of blessing we bless is a sharing in the blood of Christ. The bread we break is a sharing in the body of Christ. (1Cor. 10:16) Hail Mary...
- 10. We are one body, although we are many individuals. All of us share one loaf. (1Cor. 10:17) Hail Mary... Glory be... O my Jesus...

Concluding Prayers

After reciting all five decades, recite the following prayers.

Hail, Holy Queen, mother of mercy; our life, our sweetness, and our hope. To thee do we cry, poor banished children of Eve. To thee do we send up our sighs, mourning and weeping in this valley of tears. Turn, then, most gracious advocate, thine eyes of mercy toward us. And after this, our exile, show unto us the blessed fruit of thy womb, Jesus. O clement, O loving, O sweet Virgin Mary.






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The Third Sorrowful Mystery The Crowning with Thorns




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The Second Glorious Mystery The Ascension of the Lord into Heaven




