Dear Well-wishers,

2023-24 marks a new beginning for us at Samprabhav Foundation. It's a year of new beginnings and new hope. We registered Samprabhav Foundation as a Section 8 company to build resilient communities and organisations for the betterment of humanity.

The first project we implemented had a great thought process behind it. We focused on the foundational learning years, the child's first five years, which form the basis for a responsible and productive future citizen. Allowing learning with requisite resources is a first step in a child's learning, and this was achieved by donating teaching and learning materials to needy Anganwadi centres in Tribal areas of Kadur and Tarikere Block, Chikmagalur District, benefiting 130 children to attain their developmental milestones.

This first intervention resonates well with the organisation's vision of creating a self-sustainable environment where communities and organisations coexist and strive toward transformative development.

We are confident that the future holds a great opportunity for the organisation to strive and contribute towards a better society.

Early Childhood Education

As part of the capacity building of the local not-for-profit organisations and collaboration as a key to development, Samprabhav Foundation, in collaboration with Vikasana, a pioneering not-for-profit organisation based out of Chikkamagalur District, Karnataka State, implemented this project.

The government of India, through its National Early Childhood Care and Education (ECCE) policy, 2013 strongly emphasises the need for the provision of inclusive, equitable, and context-specific opportunities for children below 6 years of age to promote optimal learning and growth development. National Education Policy (NEP, 2020) also emphasises addressing the learning continuum among children.

With the collaborative effort from Vikasana, six Anganwadi centres were identified in the Kadur and Tarikere Blocks of the Chikmagalur District. These Anganwadi centres had old infrastructure, inadequate learning material, limited or no mural painting on the Anganwadi centre walls, old sleeping mattresses, etc. These centres had Anganwadi workers and helpers.

Following support was extended to these centres to enable a conducive learning environment, Baby Chairs, Soft Toys, Alphabet and Domestic Animal Charts, Play Material, Mattresses, etc. It is expected that this teaching and learning material will provide an opportunity for the Anganwadi worker to engage children meaningfully in preschool learning.
