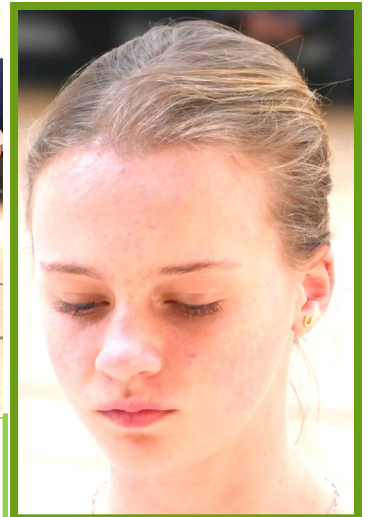
ERED IN THE SOCIAL SEASON
