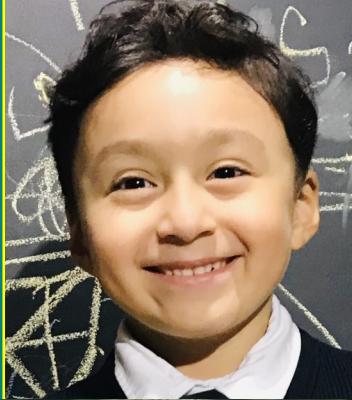
THE BEST-EVER VIRTUAL FIELD DAY

WE'RE THE FUTURE!



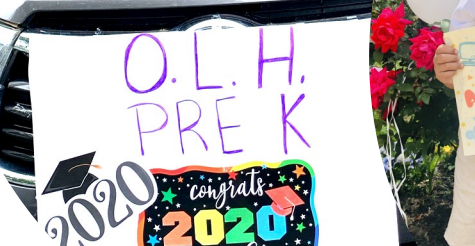

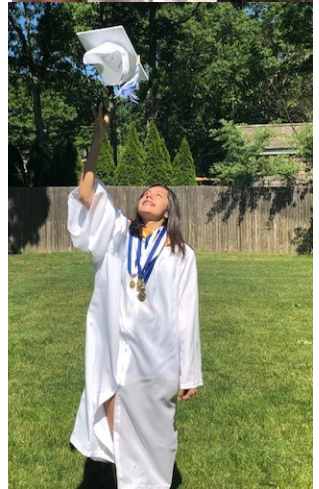
