PERSONAL INTERVIEWS are required of prospective families with both the pastor and the principal prior to March 1 for consideration for September enrollment.

Appointments for late registration are also possible if space is available.

Registration for the school yearwill take place during the first week in March. On the

day of registration, we ask that you please bring with you:

- the required verification of your pastor
- a copy of the child's birth certificate
- O a copy of the child's baptismal certificate
- O a copy of the child's immunization record
- O a check, payable to OUR LADY OF THE HAMPTONS SCHOOL in the amount of \$250 TWO HUNDRED-FIFTY DOLLARS. This is a non-refundable one-time fee and is not applicable toward tuition.
- O For Grades, 1-8 a copy of the student's latest report card is required.

Early Childhood Education at OLH

Pre-school for ages three and four is held at St. Rosalie's Parish Center in Hampton Bays.

Four year olds have the option of 3 or 5 full day instruction each week. Class population is limited in size, and two teachers instruct each group.





Kindergartners begin their studies at the OLH building in Southampton. Early childhood parents are encouraged to participate fully in all activities of the greater OLH community. In a curriculum based on readiness, social interaction, basic communication skills and physical development, early childhood classes prepare children for the full curriculum at OLH.

First-Eighth Grade classrooms are in the main OLH building in Southampton. All parents are encouraged to participate fully in all activities of the greater OLH community, including volunteer work within the school, and helping to maintain a community based facility.

The latest new construction was complete in 2014, with the building of a full gymnasium with running track, three classrooms, interior student lockers, a Prep Science Laboratory, Preparation Presentation rooms.
