CELEBRATIONS ABOUND AT OLH

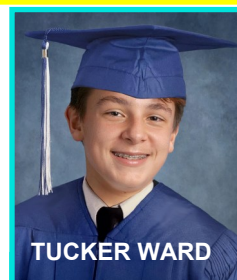

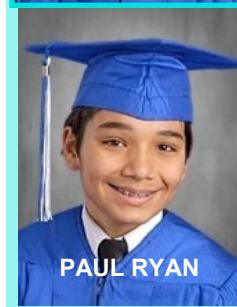
