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BACKGROUND

The MI 505 Flint/Genesee County Continuum of Care (CoC) is charged by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) to submit a community-wide application for homeless assistance funds.

The CoC Program is authorized by subtitle C of title IV of the McKinney-Vento Homeless Assistance Act (42 U.S.C. 11381–11389) (the Act), and the CoC Program rule found in 24 CFR part 578 (the Rule). The FY 2024 funds are authorized by the Consolidated Appropriations Act, 2024 (Public Law 118-42, approved March 9, 2024). The noncompetitive or competitive renewal or replacement of Youth Homelessness Demonstration Program (YHDP) grants under the CoC program, and HUD's authority to issue a 2-year NOFO are authorized by the Consolidated Appropriations Act, 2024 and any FY 2025 funding will be authorized by FY 2025 Congressional Appropriation. MISSION and PURPOSE

The mission of the Flint/Genesee County CoC is a community working together to achieve access to safe and affordable housing for all residents of Genesee County.

The Flint/Genesee County CoC is a broad-based coalition of housing and homeless service providers, persons with lived experience of homelessness, advocates, and government representatives who work together to shape countywide planning and decision-making around housing and homelessness.

PROJECT APPLICATIONS

The Flint/Genesee County CoC (MI 505) is soliciting agencies to submit new, renewal, expansion, DV bonus, and CoC Bonus project applications. The Flint/Genesee County CoC supports prospective applicants and projects that address historic inequities for marginalized communities of color and other underserved and underrepresented communities in the CoC and produce high-quality services and housing opportunities that enable persons to remain and thrive in their communities. The Flint/Genesee County CoC strives to fund eligible applicants proposing to meet this goal with a project proposal that addresses the specific needs of marginalized communities of color, created in collaboration with community partners and persons with lived experience which support the Flint/Genesee County CoC plans and strategies.

The Flint/Genesee County CoC encourages applications from applicants that have never previously received CoC funds as well as from applicants that are currently receiving or have in the past received CoC funds. A single, consolidated submission of all selected projects in the Flint/Genesee County CoC will be submitted to HUD by the Greater Flint Health Coalition (GFHC), as the Collaborative Applicant representing Flint/Genesee County CoC. Greater Flint Health Coalition (GFHC), the Collaborative Applicant, which oversees the NOFO application process, will provide technical assistance to ensure that the process is accessible to all eligible applicants, including those who have not received CoC funds in the past for Continuum of Care Homeless Assistance funding from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD).
