Assignment: Reflective Responses to "Voices of Immigrants" Video Series

After viewing the "Voices of Immigrants" video series, students will select **three** discussion questions provided in class and compose thoughtful, written responses. This assignment aims to deepen understanding of anti-bias educational practices and strategies for supporting immigrant families in early childhood settings.

I. Instructions:

- **1. Select Three Questions**: Choose any three discussion questions from the list provided during class.
- 2. Compose Responses: For each selected question, write a response that:
 - o Demonstrates comprehension of the video's content.
 - Reflects on personal insights or experiences related to the topic.
 - Connects to principles of anti-bias education and supporting immigrant families.

3. Formatting:

- Type your responses in a Word document or other word processing format.
- o Use 12-point Times New Roman font, double-spaced.
- o Include your name, date, and course title at the top of the document.
- Label each response with the corresponding question number.

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III. Discussion Questions:

- 1. What were some of the challenges immigrant families described when adapting to preschool systems in North America?
 - How might an early childhood educator help ease these transitions?
- 2. How did families describe their experiences being welcomed—or not—into school environments?
 - What does this suggest about the role of relationship-building in anti-bias care?
- 3. Several families shared stories about misunderstandings due to language or cultural differences—how might this have affected the relationship between the parent and their child's school?
- How can preschool teachers avoid jumping to conclusions when a child or family's behavior seems unfamiliar?
- 4. What strengths and values did immigrant families bring with them to their parenting, and to partnering with their child's teachers and schools?
 - How can educators make sure these strengths are visible and honored in the classroom?
- 5. In what ways did families describe feeling invisible, judged, or misunderstood?
- How can educators challenge their own assumptions or biases to better support every family?
- 6. Some parents shared that their children were the ones helping them learn English or understand U.S. systems.
- How might this "role reversal" affect children emotionally or socially? What support might they need?
- 7. Think about the diverse ways that children are disciplined or guided in different cultures. What are some different guidance/discipline styles that you are aware of?
- How can teachers approach guidance strategies respectfully when working with families who use different approaches?
- 8. What role does trust play in the relationships between immigrant families and educators?
- What are some small but powerful actions teachers can take to build trust with immigrant families?
- 9. The videos included references to feelings of isolation or being "the only one." How does a feeling of isolation affect a parent's relationship with their child's teachers and school?
- How can ECE programs help all families feel seen, connected, and part of a larger school community?
- 10. What did you learn from these families that challenged or expanded your own thinking about parenting, culture, or early childhood care?
 - How will this affect your future role as an educator?
