How to take pictures for your color consultation project

It's important to follow some important guidelines when photographing your home for the color consultation project. I've learned the hard way that there is a little more to consider than just taking a snapshot.

Tips for taking pictures

Take photos during the day between 9-3 in natural light without flash or any artificial light for indoor shots. Same with exterior. Try to take your photos so that the street is not in the picture or too much of the driveway.

Move any cars out of the driveway.

Do not send a picture that shows the exterior in part sun and part shade. Indirect natural light is best especially if you'd like a rendering done of the house whether it is indoors or outdoors, front door, cabinets or a room.

When you receive your color sheets look at them during the day and at night with artificial light as they will look different.

Put them next to key pieces of fabrics, furnishings and floors. If you stick them onto the wall over the existing color (unless it's white or unpainted) it will not read correctly. Our eyes are affected by the colors when put right next to other colors. The new color will not represent itself correctly.
