It allows Morrigan's gentle nature to bring consolation to kids in stress, children learning to read, store workers on break, & senior citizens living alone or struggling with varied challenges.

For us, as co-owners, work & play with Morrigan is a concerted effort to give her a full, happy & balanced life. Peter & I also enjoy seeing her represent the breed; likewise, we both feel humbled & privileged to teach others about the wonders of the Standard Schnauzer, as well as to be supportive & offer encouragement for those on their own Standard Schnauzer journey.

Morrigan is a true companion. She is welcoming, playful, adaptable & requires daily mental stimulation. She is successful in performance-based sports due to her athleticism & eager-to-please attitude helping her learn new activities easily.

Morrigan enjoyed Barn Hunt for a full year going quickly up to a Master level. She runs enthusiastically with a steady pace & has persevered through ninety-four (94) 100yard dashes earning her **FCAT4**.

Trick Dog "Elite Performer"

To say the least, we were very excited about Morrigan getting her Trick Dog "Elite Performer" title. It amazingly represents the culmination of at least 50 tricks, each increasing in difficulty as we advanced in its ascending titles. The final "Elite" title involves an approved AKC written story script & video in which Morrigan acts out the storyline along with human characters, specific required & creative props.

AKC confirmed that Morrigan is the 5th Standard Schnauzer in the USA to win this title! We were really overjoyed thinking about all the rapport-building, mutual love & work gone into it all! Morrigan looked forward to practice each morning for the video & she still does today. She anticipates doing a host of tricks each morning about 10am...but not all 50!

Certified Farm Dog

The Farm Dog (FDC) title perfectly befits all Standard Schnauzers as a working breed originating from the lush Bavarian landscape during in the Middle Ages. The Certified Farm Dog title may seem like a simple feat to earn with 12 exercises typical to a farm environment. It can prove to be a challenge to retrain & learn new reactions to other animals. However, I encourage all to give it a go!

Morrigan was a former "pheasant herder" prior to being re-homed to us in 2018. We had to teach her to exhibit new benign behaviors in front of feathered creatures. Additionally, Morrigan had to remain perfectly still & obedient to commands in front of nearby horses, walk through a gang of noisy chickens, serenely pass by a large working tractor, wait silently & patiently in a locked stall, as well as maneuvering over a variety of unusual surfaces such as plastic, metal grating & uneven wooden boards. Quite an accomplishment on her part!

Our training adventures to various farms in the year leading up to the trial was another opportunity to love, build trust, create task-oriented activities, as well as share Morrigan with many admirers while in training. These are all values & commitments we had vowed, in 2018, to Margaret Haar when Morrigan was entrusted to us.

AKC Legislative Alert

US Congress: Animal Rights Groups Are Lobbying for More Restrictions on Dog Broaders Congress Needs to



Breeders. Congress Needs to Hear Your Voice Too.

What is happening?

- This week, animal rights/ "protection" groups are actively lobbying Congress to restrict & limit the activities of dog breeders.
- They are making unsupported claims that there are "tens of thousands of puppy mills" in the United States, & asking members of Congress to advance arbitrary, one-size-fits-all mandates that could require small hobby breeders to place their dogs in industrial, commercial-style kennels & undermine quality breedbased care.
- Though labeled as commercial breeding regulations, the one-size-fits-all requirements also apply to some small hobby breeders.

- Your action is urgently needed to stop the animal-rights supported Puppy Protection Act (H.R. 1624) & Goldies Act (H.R. 1788).

Dog Event Etiquette

DOG EVENT ETIQUETTE

Compiled so you can have more fun and less stress with your dog

Please remember you represent a breed and fellow fanciers of that breed

Get there early enough but not too early so you are not in anybody's way

Be polite to everyone you come across even if they are not nice to you

Pay attention to your surroundings and announcements

Check your ring for any posted announcements about time or judge changes

Do not block ring entrances or aisles

Remember you are not the only exhibitor that is entered do not be a distraction

You and your dog are no more important than any of the others entered

Do not have a conversation with your judge prior to your competition

Read the premium list for every event that you plan to enter

Read the AKC rules for every event you plan to enter

If you do not like the rules then do not enter but if you do then you must abide by the rules whether you agree with them or not

Understand that there are certain protocols and practices that cannot be easily changed

Always have control of your dog on a short leash or in a crate where they can rest

If you are unsure of something please ask, never assume anything

When unloading/loading please move your car ASAP so others can move in or out

Never set up your grooming table and crates in a handicap parking spot

Never use a Flexi lead or prong collar at an AKC event

Soft crates are usually not allowed - read the premium list

Never move another exhibitors equipment or chairs without permission

Do not crowd another's space

Do not put or allow children in a crate at a dog event (can cause legal issues)

Never leave a dog alone or unsecured on a grooming table

Never leave your dog in a car with windows closed

Never practice in the rings at any AKC event

Be a gracious winner and a humble loser

Always pick up your dogs poop

Pay attention to what your dog is doing at all times

Never let your dog lift it's leg on another's property

Do not let your dog jump on anyone

Do not let your dog approach another dog without permission

Do not practice your exercises near anyone else or near a ring

Do not eat your food at ringside

When picking up your number never say your dogs name, just ask for the number

Do not throw bait in the ring unless you pick it up

Always leave space between you and the exhibit in front of you

Keep your squeaky toys and voice to a minimum

Ladies please wear undergarments and clothes that keep you presentable

Remember that you may need to bend over

Never wear high heeled shoes or sandals in the ring

Please try to avoid wearing hats in the ring, it can scare some dogs

Clean up the hair and trash from your grooming area before you leave
