ELEMENTS of ART

Line

Line is a path made by a moving point. Lines can be straight, zig-zag, curved, thick, or thin. They define shapes, suggest movement, and create texture.

Shape

Shape is a flat, two-dimensional, enclosed area created by lines.

Value

Value refers to the range of lightness or darkness within a color, object, or image. It indicates how light or dark something appears and helps to build the illusion of depth, making flat shapes appear three-dimensional.

Space

Space is the area in and around objects within a composition. It can be positive or negative and helps create the illusion of depth.

Form

Form is created by adding length, width, and depth to two-dimensional objects. It occupies space and adds volume.

Texture

Texture describes how something feels or looks like it would feel. It can be real or implied.

Color

Color helps us notice and identify objects within a space. It evokes emotions, sets the mood, and creates harmony and contrast.
