Use when analyzing/ sourcing documents for DBQs. A could also be I (for intended audience). Choose just one letter, but the "Y" is required every time.

#### **Topic Sentence Explain Evidence** Analysis

Use for Short Answer Questions. Your topic sentence should restate the prompt. Then explain the evidence (content knowledge) and analyze by saying why it is significant.

#### Causation Comparison Contextualization

These are the cognitive operations that you will be required to apply when engaging with the historical thinking skills on the AP exam.



Another formula for answering the Short Answer Question. In your first sentence, include a vocabulary term, then in the next sentence explain it. Last sentence ties it back to the prompt.



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#### Place Author **Significance** Time

Use as an alternative to APPARTS, as a quick way to pull important information out of the source line of a document.

A good strategy for documents connected to MCQs, SAQs and DBQs.
