Tania Anderson – President

Tania has been involved with men's netball for 40 years. Her experience at all levels of the game including Mixed Netball, NNZ age groups, Premier Women's, and NZ Indoor Netball brings an unmatched level of experience to her role as President.

Having been successful at a National and International level, Tania has been a committed and dedicated coach, contributing to our sport for many years. She has been involved in a number of International Series and NZMMNA Teams, most recently defending the Trans Tasman Mixed Title.

The success within her association, Waikato-Tainui, continues to be a focus and passion for her but more importantly upholding the mana of the legacy, passed down by those who stood before her, their life members.

Board updates

Board wānanga

The Board held a two day wānanga in Wellington. Following the working group recommendations accepted at the 2024 AGM, the Board has agreed to a number of actions to implement in 2025. Two meetings will be held, one at Mixed Nationals and another at Men's National's 2025 to implement key decisions.

Board subcommittees

The Board has agreed to establish the following subcommittees:

- Finance and funding - Chaired by the Treasurer and tasked with identifying greater funding opportunities for the association and ensuring that the financial affairs of the association are in order.
- National Tournaments - Chaired by the Secretary and tasked with overseeing Mixed and Men's Nationals.
- High-performance - Chaired by the President, to oversee the high performance programme and approach. The Board will act as the High-performance subcommittee until further notice.

Strategic plan refresh

The Board has committed to developing a new strategic plan and vision for NZMMNA. A consultative process will begin in early 2025 with opportunities for our member associations, life members, players, and broader communities to provide input into this process. A draft plan will be presented at Mixed Nationals 2025.

Member communications

The Board will be communicating through a formal mail out each quarter. A new delegate page has been established, overseen by the member's representative. Life members will also be engaged more regularly for their views and input into the affairs of the association.



Board updates

2025 high performance approach

Following the completion of the 2024 international season, the Board has agreed to undertake a full programme review and refresh in 2025. The intention is for a new approach to high-performance to be developed across 2025 and announced for launching in 2026. While this work is underway, the Board will maintain oversight of the high-performance programme and have agreed to a number of immediate changes including the establishment of two high performance squads for 2025.

These squads will be:

- **Open Men's Squad** consisting of the top 24 athletes from across the country. This pool of athletes will be eligible for selection to the Net Blacks, the New Zealand Mixed team, and any age teams if eligible. The open men's squad will be selected following a selection camp in early March 2025. Up to 40 triallists will be invited in early January to this selection camp. Final decisions on the squad will be made on recommendation of the coaches of the Net Blacks, New Zealand Mixed, and Fast 5.
- **Youth Men's Squad** consisting of 48 of the top youth athletes, numbering 16 athletes identified for each of the age group brackets (Under 23's, under 20's, and under 17's). The youth men's squad will be selected following a selection camp in early March 2025. All existing age eligible players will be invited to trial at this selection camp. Final decisions on the squad will be made on recommendation of the coaches of the under 23's, under 20's, and under 17's coaches .

As a consequence of these decisions, there will not be a New Zealand A team selected for the 2025 season.

The Fast 5 tournament for 2025 has not been announced, and the approach to this team will be confirmed once details of the 2025 tournament are finalised.



Board updates

Entry fee increases 2025/2026

Following a review of entry fees for our national tournaments, we are announcing an increase in entry fees from 2025 onwards. These increases reflect the higher costs to hire venues, the greater number of courts required to host tournaments as participation has increased, and general increases in costs due to inflation and other pressures.

Accordingly, from Mixed Nationals 2025 onwards, the following increases will be applied:

- Opens and Masters teams: \$600 per team (2025), \$650 per team (2026)
- Unders teams: \$400 per team (2025), \$450 per team (2026)
- Associate members/invitational teams: \$750 per team (2025), \$975 (2026)

Mixed Nationals – positioning changes

The Board has agreed to make a change to the existing gender positioning rules for Mixed Nationals 2025 as a trial. This change will mean that each team in each grade will be able to determine whether they wish to field four male, or four female, identified players in line with the Diversity and Inclusion policy. This is a change from the existing rules which allow for a maximum of three male players only. NZMMNA is agnostic as to whether a team chooses to play three or four male or female identified players.
