and who has helped to raise almost \$1,000,000 for the Clown Doctors program,

that supports children in hospital.

President Ross is thanking Paul here, for his informative talk: Paul became involved with the Clown Doctors around 1998 through their founder Dr Peter Spitzer aka Dr Fruit-Loop.

From 1999 to 2018 Paul ran the Clown Doctor's "Ball "at Mittagong RSL. He Joined Mittagong and Bowral Rotary Club in 2010.

Our guest speaker this week is Catherine Fritz-Kalish

Catherine Fritz-Kalish AM is Managing Director of Global Access Partners, an independent non-profit institute for active policy that initiates strategic debate on the most pressing social, economic

and structural issues facing Australia and the world today. Using the GAP Second Track process, GAP runs multidisciplinary taskforces, forums, workshops, and consultative committees which

move conversations from ideas to recommendations to implementable action.

She is also a Director of the International Centre for Democratic Partnerships which works to develop long lasting, meaningful relationships between entrepreneurs across the Australia and the

Pacific Island Nations. The programme focuses specifically on women led enterprises.

Catherine's family has had properties across the Southern Highlands for most of her life. Her grandfather started the wine growing industry in the region, starting with vineyards at Eling Forest.

Today her family has a property in Robertson. Catherine is Director of the Fritz Family Foundation which aims to improve early childhood education opportunities for Australia's young families. It funds a playgroup in Mittagong which meets 3 times a week, supporting 60 families per week to attend it's inclusive, facilitated early childhood education program.
