### *The Elements and Principles of Art*

**In person class:** \$175 includes all art supplies and four 90-minute sessions

**Tuesdays 2pm – 3pm or 4 – 5pm**

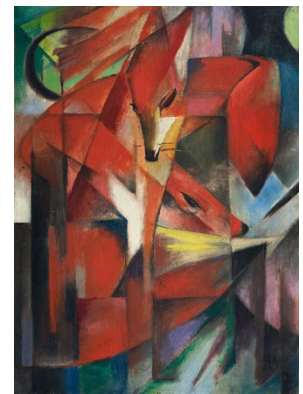
Art supplies are not included in online classes and must be purchased before the first-class date. Upon enrollment, a supply list will be provided.

### Line, Color, and Movement

**In Person: Thursday November 30, December 7, 14, and 21**

**Online: Tuesday November 28, December 5, 12, and 19**

Lines and colors can have a powerful impact on the time a viewer spends looking at our art. In this class we will learn how to move the viewer's eye around our art with the strategic placing of lines and colors. Our work will tell a story to keep our viewer intrigued. German artist Franz Marc will be featured along with the Orphism art movement. The result will be the creation of a fractured animal portrait that tells an intriguing story.



### Emphasis and Balance

**In Person: Thursday January 11, 18, 25, and February 1**

**Online: Tuesday January 9, 16, 23, and 30**

Portraits can tell us much more than what a person looks like. A portrait can reveal the heart and soul of an individual. When an artist emphasizes certain features over others and balances them out with telling tidbits using lines, colors, and shapes in creative ways a truer portrait can emerge. In this class we will look at master portrait artists throughout art history and combine the realistic style with the abstract to discover more than what meets the eye.



### Rhythm, Shape, and Pattern

**In Person: Thursday February 8, 15, 22, and 29**

**Online: Tuesday February 6, 13, 20, and 27**

MC Escher was a master artist who was also a brilliant Mathematician. In this class we will use shapes and patterns to create a rhythmic tessellation that will honor the brilliance of Escher.
