Now we rememher all those little things that mean so much to us, as we are leaving. We look back and recall with sadness the death of Alfred Guimond in our freshman year. We note the diminishing ranks of our boy students as they file out for war and war education. We remember friendship and thoughtfulness, obedience and disobedience, laughter and tears. And as we say goodbye to our teachers, desks, rooms, hooks, and friends, each says with all his heart, "I wish I were a freshman!!!"

By definition, an ohstacle course is a device which huilds up the hody, develops the muscles, trains the mind, and hardens the constitution; hut to the senior and junior hoys of C. H.
