





SENIORS

CLASS HISTORY

1946

In June, 1942, the faculties of the various grammar schools of Carteret conferred together and came to a momentous decision. At this conference a plan was brought to light that was designed to make the perfect high school class. The plan, boiled down to mere facts, is herein described.

Take one pinch of the cream of Nathan Hale School, mix with a spoonful of Columbus School's finest, sprinkle with the best of the parochial schools, age for four years, and serve with generous helpings of Bugo's and White Cloud's humor. Result—the class of 1946, the finest in the history of Carteret High.

In September, 1942, the future class of '46 entered the auditorium with a great show of confidence and bravado. The seniors, in ten minutes, deflated our ego and left us babbling wrecks. When Coach saw the freshman boys reporting for practice, he called for help. Among the boys were Buck Elko, Joe Duggan, Andy Karacki, Rich Donovan, Buddy Jardot, Sammy Holowatch and Charlie Fazekas. Richy Albrecht went out for second string waterboy and made it.

The boys were active in all sports, but the girls were not to be outdone. Matilda Seaman, Audrey Catri, and Jean Overholt made the cheering squad, and the girls were satisfied.

Our advisers were Mr. Lubern and Mr. Spewak. Only two strong men could keep our class in line.

Before we knew it we were a year older and a promotion came our way. We were now to be called sophomores, not lowly freshmen, but high and mighty sophomores.

Success went to our heads. We elected Samuel Holowatch to guide us and to assist him, Alberta Clark, vice-president; Jean Overholt, secretary; and Richard Donovan, treasurer. While we were at it, we chose Regina Adams to represent us in the Athletic Association. As a final measure, we placed Helen Shutello in the Student Organization. Now we had our own girls to look at.

One of our teacher advisers decided that life might be easier in the army, so Mr. Lubern answered the call to arms. Mr. Spewak was transferred to Columbus School, and Miss Monahan and Mrs. Desmond were chosen to look after our affairs.

The war was becoming more and more realistic to us all the time. Joe Duggan, Pete Toth, Buddy Jardot, and Herkie Cherepon had already left for the service. More and more special assemblies were called to bid farewell to some member of the student body who was leaving for the service. The stars on our service flag became more numerous. We who were left joined the Victory Corps and took special courses to prepare ourselves for our apparent future, the armed forces. Coach put up an obstacle course to condition us for military careers.

Our junior year was the one that we had been anticipating with great joy. Our play, "One Mad Night," was a tremendous success. Chuck Riedel out-Dracula-ed Dracula.

Our senior year officially began when we elected Charles Riedel, president; Sophie Shumny, vice-president; Rita Brechka, secretary; and William Wilgus, treasurer. Charles Fazekas and Helen Shutello represented us in the S. O.

After counting our profits from this theatrical venture we decided to give the seniors a prom to remember. It was a gala affair. We were especially happy because, just before the prom. Germany had given up and some of the war's tension could be forgotten just for a moment. We still wondered about the future because we believed Japan to be a bigger and greater adversary than Germany. Our school activities continued to lean toward war preparation.

During our summer vacation, Japan gave up via the atom bomb. The boys and girls felt that a great load had been lifted from their shoulders.

Nevertheless, Victory took a heavy toll from our class. Bugo and Whitecloud were drafted. The morale of the school dropped fifty per cent.

Our officers for this eventful junior year were Steven Timko, president; Helen Shutello, vice-president: Regina Adams, secretary, and Charles Fazekas, treasurer. Richard Donovan represented us in the Student Organization.

Our play, "Spring Green," a great success, and our Senior Dance were the first peacetime affair.

In return for the induction of Whitecloud and Bugo, the government gave us two discharged veterans, Adam Osyf and Thomas Donoghue. We couldn't ask for a fairer exchange.

Now we are leaving dear old Carteret High for the last time. We are the first class in four years to go out into a peaceful world. We have received useful training for war and peace. We have received the finest education available. And to you that stay behind we say, "Take care of Carteret High, because she means more to us now, this year, than ever. Some day you'll know what we mean."
