

# Anne Drew Scott

For twenty-three years, Anne Drew Scott directed the policies of Carteret High School. Under her brilliant and resourceful leadership, Carteret High School became recognized as one of the most progressive secondary schools in the state, and Miss Scott herself enjoyed a statewide reputation as an educator of scholarly attainments.

A wise, tolerant, far-sighted leader, an inspiring and understanding teacher, a generous and loyal friend, Miss Scott guided the destinies of hundreds of Carteret boys and girls. Nor did her interest in them cease when they were graduated. Alumni were frequent visitors at the school, and they were always assured of a gracious welcome.

Had Miss Scott not chosen to devote her life and talents to the education of youth, she might have won fame in the literary world, as she was gifted with creative power. She was the inspiration of the first *Loudspeaker*, published by the class of 1926, and school publications were always among her favorite activities.

Miss Scott's untimely death is a great loss to the school, to the community, and to hundreds of loyal and devoted friends upon whose minds and hearts she has left the imprint of a great personality.

With affection and gratitude, the class of 1947 dedicates this book to her memory.
