Our Town Has a Birthday

May 1, 1906, Carteret was incorporated as a borough. Many of the older residents well remember the day. Many remember, too, what Carteret looked like then—a sparsely settled, unattractive, industrial community known as Blazing Star, a name that persisted well into the latter part of nineteenth century. Perhaps the name, Blazing Star, was prophetic of the development of that sparsely settled, unattractive stretch of land into the Carteret of today, a flourishing industrial community with a population of 17,000, an area of six and onequarter miles, and improved highways radiating to all parts of New Jersey. The borough was incorporated under the name of Roosevelt; but a few years later, the name was changed, officially, to Carteret, in honor of Sir Philip Carteret, the first colonial governor of the

The first important industry in Carteret was established in 1881. Two years later, the American Agricultural Chemical Company erected the Liebig Works. Within ten years Carteret was a flourishing industrial center with a rapidly growing population.


This industrial growth was matched by the cultural and educational advancement of the community. The early settlers built churches; by 1921, there were a Presbyterian, a Methodist, a Catholic, and an Episcopalian Church. Today there are more than ten houses of worship.

The early settlers built a one-room school. The one-room school expanded. In 1921 according to the History of Middlesex County, there were "two large and excellently conducted public schools, with Miss Barbara V Hermann as supervising principal and Miss Catherine Hermann, principal of the second school. The two schools employ forty-two teachers, with special instructors in music, manual training and drawing, domestic science and physical training. There were also two parachial schools. Today Carteret has five public schools with a total enrollment of 2290. The faculty numbers one hundred three. In 1926 a new high school building was erected. By 1939, it was no longer adequate, and a sixteen room addition to this high school was built. The annex included well-equipped laboratories, a music room, and a sound-proof band room. That same year, 1939, a beautiful new stadium was dedicated and named in honor of the first Carteret boy who lost his life in World War II, Walter B. Overholt. The parochial schools are now housed in fine new modern buildings.

Patriotism, love of nature, loyalty—these were all characteristics of the builders of our boro. They named the streets and avenues after presidents—Washington, Jefferson, Jackson, Van Buren, and many others; they named streets after trees—ash, willow, spruce, and birch long before they planted any of the species along the streets; they named streets after poets—Byron, Longfellow, Tennyson, noticeably favoring the American men of letters; they named streets after the men who were active in building the community—Thornall, Noe, Savage, Hermann, Lefferts, and others.

The patriotism and loyalty of the people of Carteret did not end with naming the streets after famous Americans. When World War I broke out, hundreds of men rushed to fight for their country in the "war that was to end all wars." They fought on foreign soil, and many of them are buried there. In 1941, their sons responded to another call to arms; this was a global conflict and Carteret was represented in every theater of war. Once again, as in 1918, many did not return. A beautiful monument stands in the park to commemorate the heroic sacrifices of these men, and their names are inscribed on the hearts of their grateful fellowmen. We salute these heroes, and we salute all the brave men and women, living and dead, who worked so unselfishly and so untiringly to make Carteret a good place to live. May they inspire us to follow their example of loyalty and devotion to duty.

To them, we are proud to dedicate the 1956 Loudspeaker.
