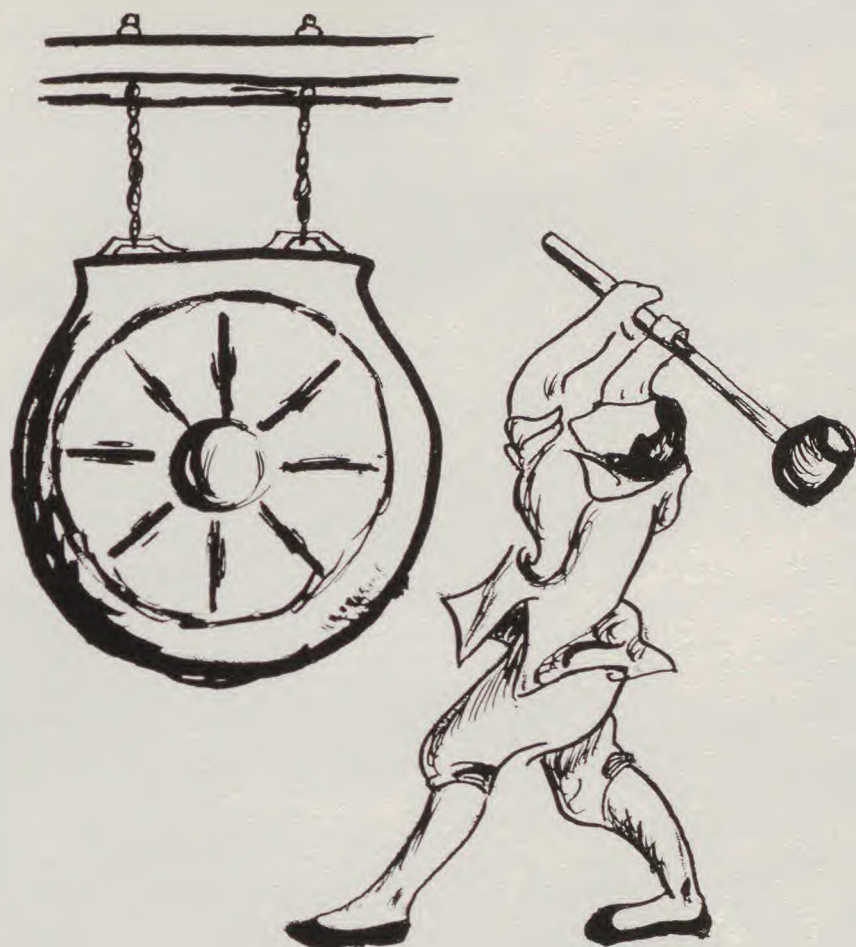

Foreword

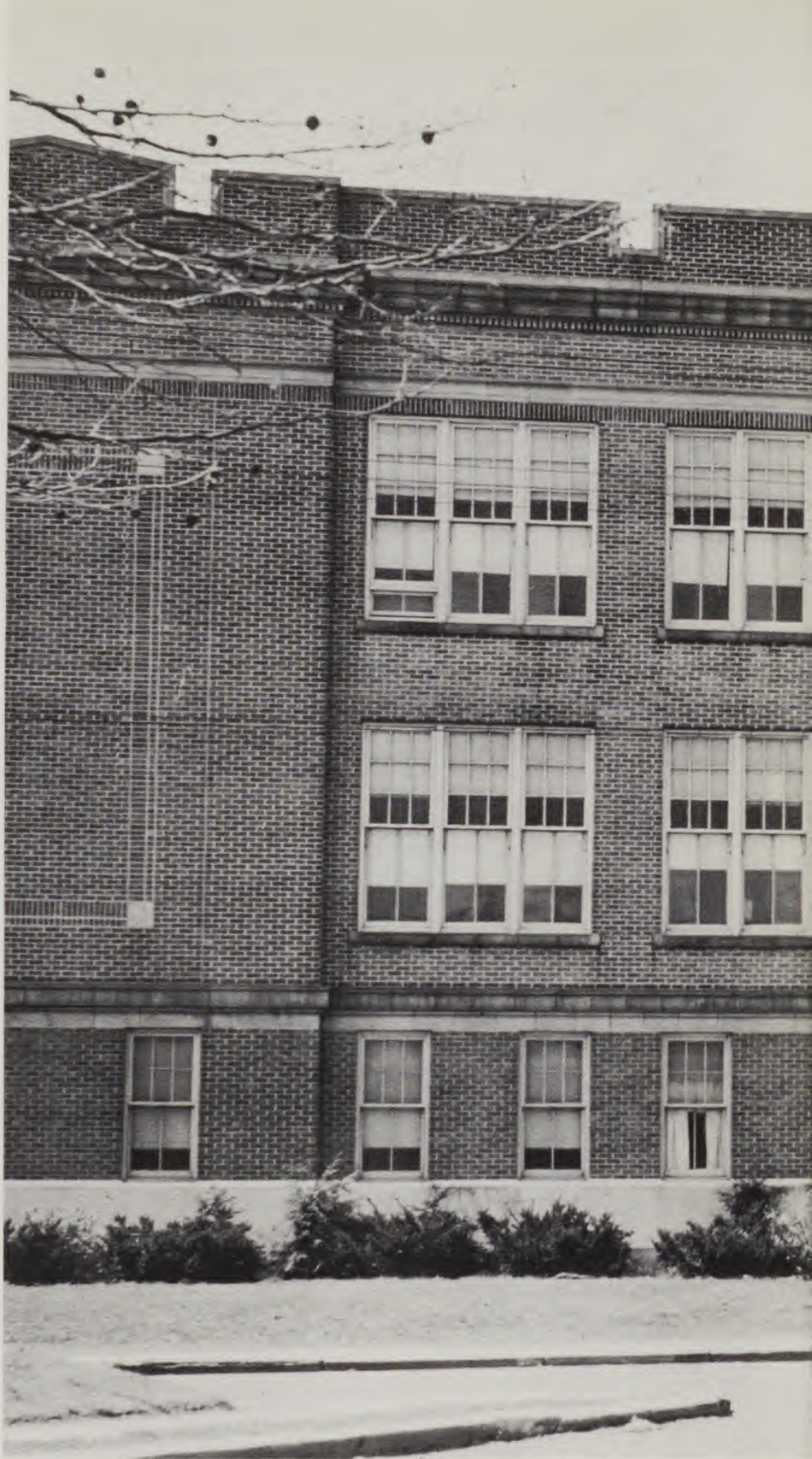
A JOURNEY TO THE FAR EAST

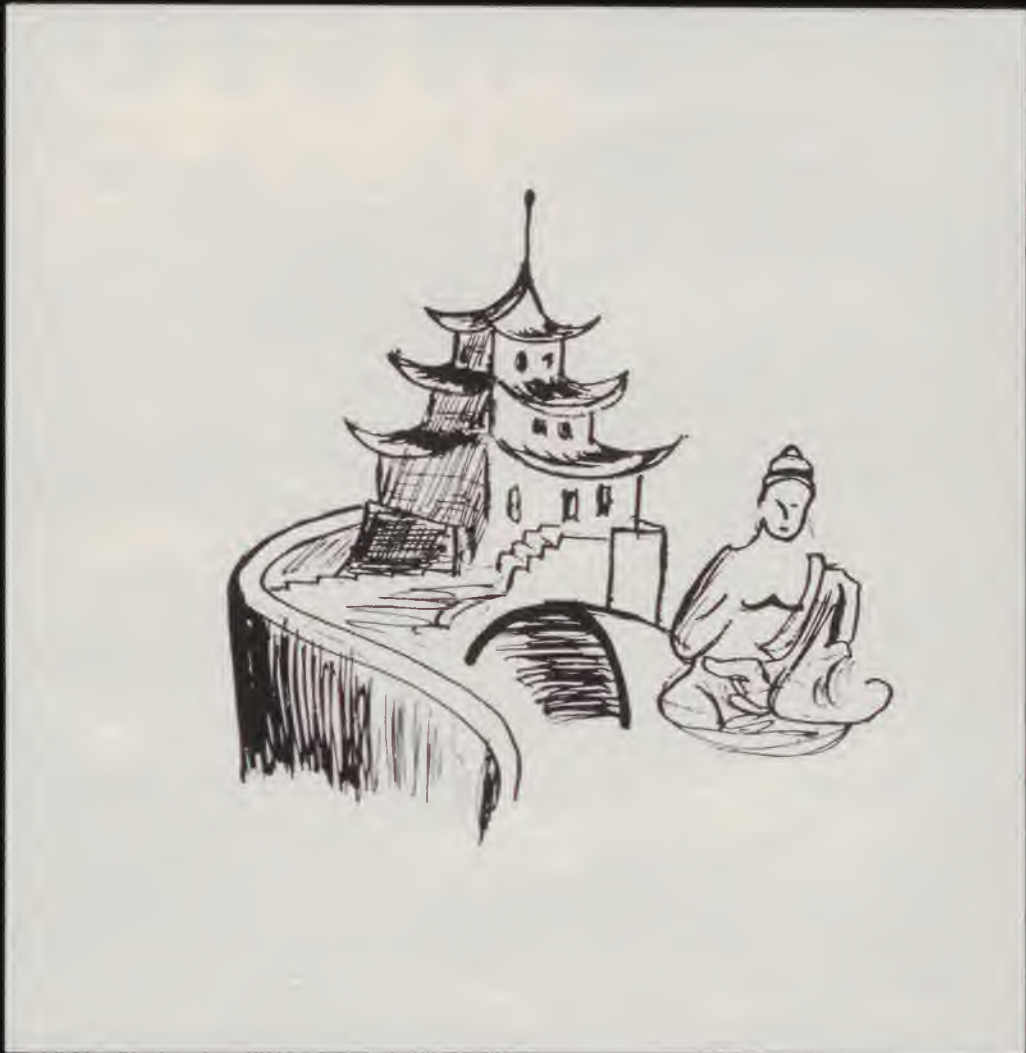

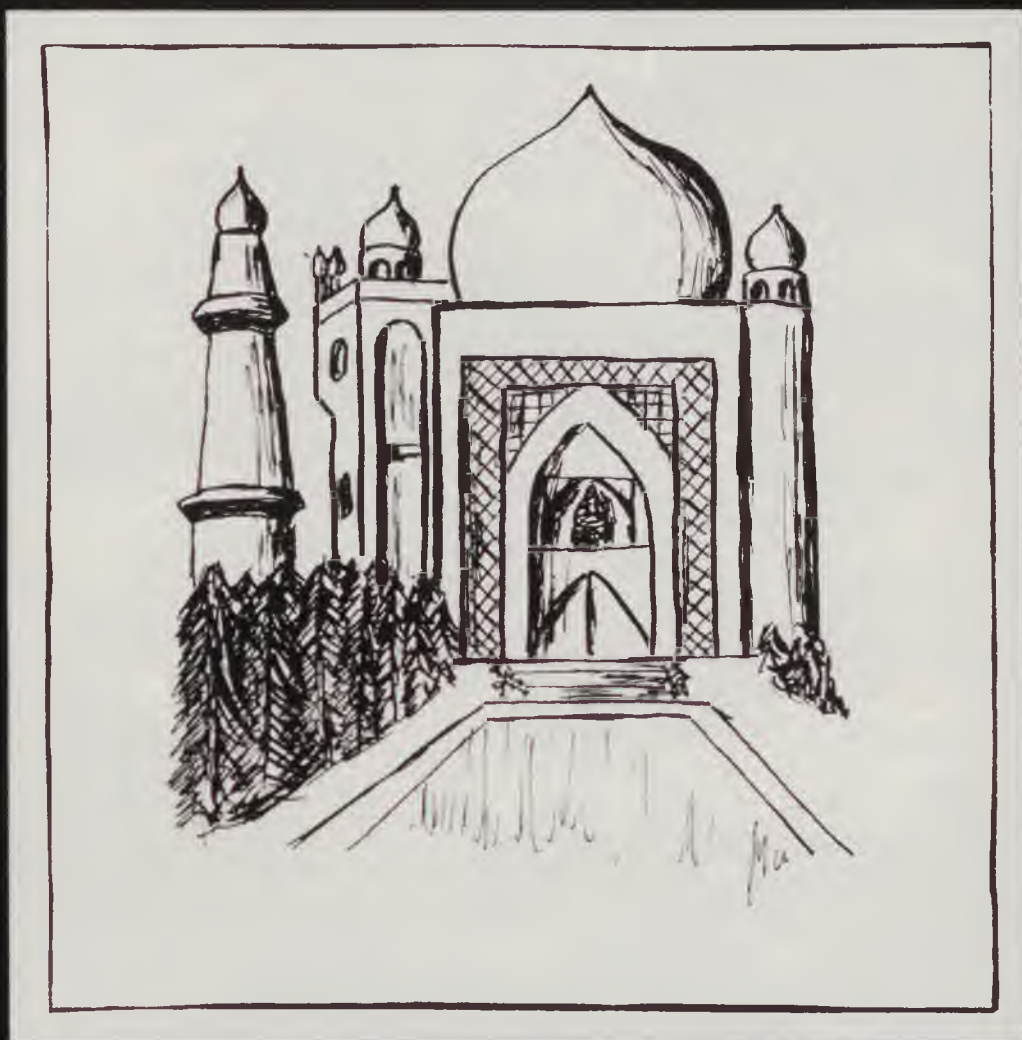

The only unhappy event in our senior year occurred in December. The tragic death of Mr. Riedel, our former class advisor, brought sadness to all of us.

When we were measured for our caps and gowns in January, we sadly acknowledged that we were nearing the end of our exciting journey. Remembering the words of Confucius, "Wherever you go, go with your whole heart," we wholeheartedly made the most of the last few months of our journey, which brought our Senior Trip, Dinner Dance, Baccalaureate, and, finally, Commencement.

We realize that our journey to the Orient comprised four of the happiest years of our lives, but we also know that the conclusion of one journey leads to the beginning of another. We must now embark on a rougher, but far more rewarding journey—the journey through life.
