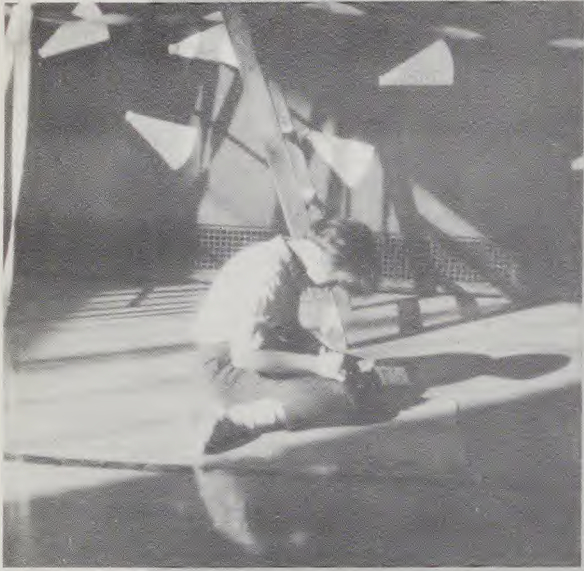

Eulogy by SENATOR MIKE MANSFIELD

At the Bier of President John Fitzgerald Kennedy

The Rotunda—U.S. Capitol—Washington, D.C.—November 24, 1963

There was a sound of laughter; in a moment, it was no more. And so she took a ring from her finger and placed it in his hands.

There was a wit in a man neither young nor old, but a wit full of an old man's wisdom and of a child's wisdom, and then, in a moment it was no more. And so she took a ring from her finger and placed it in his hands.

There was a man marked with the scars of his love of country, a body active with the surge of a life far, far from spent and, in a moment, it was no more. And so she took a ring from her finger and placed it in his hands.

There was a father with a little boy, a little girl and a joy of each in the other. In a moment it was no more, and so she took a ring from her finger and placed it in his hands.

There was a husband who asked much and gave much, and out of the giving and the asking wove with a woman what could not be broken in life, and in a moment it was no more. And so she took a ring from her finger and placed it in his hands, and kissed him and closed the lid of a coffin.

A piece of each of us died at that moment. Yet, in death he gave of himself to us. He gave us of a good heart from which the laughter came. He gave us of a profound wit, from which a great leadership emerged. He gave us of a kindness and a strength fused into a human courage to seek peace without fear.

He gave us of his love that we, too, in turn, might give. He gave that we might give of ourselves, that we might give to one another until there would be no room, no room at all, for the bigotry, the hatred, prejudice and the arrogance which converged in that moment of horror to strike him down.

In leaving us—these gifts, John Fitzgerald Kennedy, President of the United States, leaves with us. Will we take them, Mr. President? Will we have, now, the sense and the responsibility and the courage to take them?

I pray to God that we shall and under God we will.

SIR GEORGE CARTERET

Sir George Carteret, after whom the Borough of Carteret is named—and thus our school—was a most noteworthy person, according to Samuel Pepys, the famed diarist.

As a British naval captain he had gained a heroic reputation in his campaign against North African pirate strongholds, liberating English, Dutch, French, and Spanish captives.

He had fought against the Parliamentarians under Cromwell, yet sought the aid of Parliament when royalty wished to sell the Isle of Jersey to the French.

He became a knight and a baron. In February 1649 Charles I was executed. Carteret ordered Laurens Hamptonne to proclaim Charles II as King. When the King rode in state into London on the day before his coronation, Carteret was with him.

In 1664 King Charles II granted to his son, James, Duke of York, land in the New World. James, in deeds of lease and release on June 23, 24, 1664, gave the land now New Jersey to Sir George Carteret and John Lord Berkely.

They published "The Concessions and Agreement of the Lords Proprietors of the Province of Nova Caesarea or New Jersey," granting to the inhabitants representative government and religious freedom.

Sir Philip Carteret was appointed the first colonial governor.

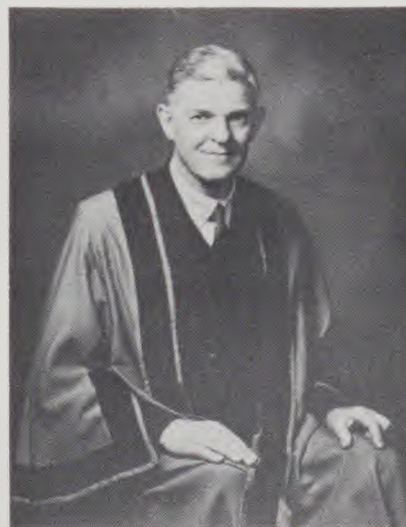
(Excerpts from letters received here)

Carteret, the little town on the West Coast of Normandy, France, is where we originally came from; we were "Lords of Carteret" long before we were "Seigneurs de Saint Ouen." My family's history goes back to the year A.D. 1000, and this home of ours (never bought, never sold, no title-deeds, held direct from the Sovereign) has a history which dates from 1135 A.D.!

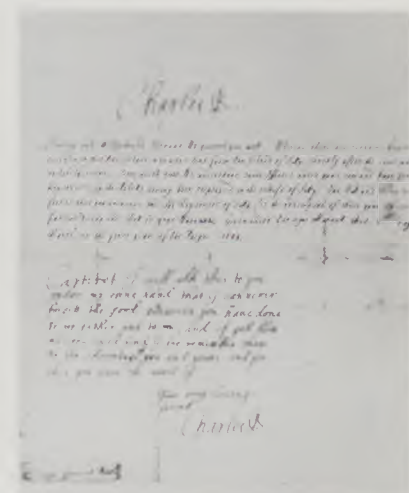

THE KING CHARLES II LETTER
YOUR LOVING FREIND, CHARLES

Dated 1649, this personal letter to Sir George conveys the warm regard of the Royal family to the hero of Jersey.



The similarity of the Coat of Arms of Sir George Carteret and the Seal of the Borough of Carteret is here evident. Standing with the Hon. Patrick G. de Courcy-Ireland, Her Britannic Majesty's Consul, is Allen Comba, Senior Class vice-president. Class President William Walker stands with class advisors Miss Eileen Kennedy and Francis T. Tonczuk. Consul de Courcy-Ireland was principal speaker at the ceremonies of the presentation of the de Carteret Flag to the people of Carteret. (The flag, already flying, is like the shield alone on the Borough of Carteret seal.

THE BOROUGH OF CARTERET

In 1922 the citizens of the Borough of Roosevelt, established by secession from Woodbridge Township in 1906, voted to rename the town Carteret in honor of Sir George Carteret. The name Carteret had long been used and the oldest post office and train station had—before the turn of the century—been identified by this ancient name.

At the founding of Nova Caesarea in 1664, the Amerindians called this land Smokey Point. The Lenni-Lenape, in their farther wanderings, came here to hunt, fish, bathe, relax, hold pow-wows. Oldest extant maps refer to tree orchards, rolling farms, meandering streams, and clean beaches. The coming of the Caucasians did little to change this idyll, for this was the land of peace among Indian and White men.

On the direct route between New York City and Philadelphia, Carteret became a favorite excursion area. It is likely that George Washington traveled over the Blazing Star Trail, the main road through this town in the past centuries. The Woodbridge Township Board of Education identified this area as Blazing Star and in 1882 allotted \$300.00 as the total education budget for the school system.

Situated on the Arthur Kill, Carteret, a national industrial site, grew to its present importance in the ferrous metals, chemicals, petroleum, lumber, and plastics complexes.

In a quarter-century it increased 100 per cent in population; 300 per cent in high school student body.

The New Jersey Turnpike makes it an ideal community of quick access to the larger cities.

Its people are the inheritors of many European cultures and festive days are celebrated in many ways.
