CLASS HISTORY

Firmly planted among our "Flash Gordon" lunch boxes, shoulder strap book bags and bobby socks, we arrived at CHS in September, 1962, to begin the first phase of our high school education. After the initial shock of not finding the pool and the elevator and realizing that the tickets sold by the seniors were for non-existent activities, we finally adjusted ourselves to our new social standing- the lower of the lower.

Knowing that each class must have its leaders, we elected officers (late, but we did elect them). Better late than never, for John McGowan, Mary Ann Di Paolo, William Sanderson, and Deane Page proved capable of accelerating the wheels for the Class of '66. eyes of the upperclassmen.

September, 1963, was the dawn of change. our bobby socks were replaced with stockings and we exchanged our lunch boxes for a seat at Donnie Dec's and Audrey's. Class elections held October 14 (a wee bit earlier this year) yielded a quartet who all had seats in Mrs. Kobrin's homeroom. Kenneth Kovacs, Joyce Cheslak, James Byleckie and Deane Page were faced with the task of preparing the Halloween Harvest dance a mere fifteen days after their election. Attempting to get on the better side of the upperclassmen, we sponsored the first CHS car wash the day before the Junior Class Prom. Aware of the expenses of the oncoming year, we galloped into our last social event, a second dance. Western Rhythm on May 22. We did it again! It was the first time casual dress was allowed at a school function.

The war was on-Nicky versus Collegiate. Our mode of dress was now categorized; you were either high rolls and shades or levis and desert boots. Although our mode of dress was divided. we signed a truce and joined forces to make the

class functions successful.

Junior year, the polls revealed a total female slate Deane Page, Joann Kiesling, Valerie Erceg, and Veronica Sirockman, who led us through the numerous activities of the year

Again we staged our dance Macabre on Halloween Eve. Later in the year, we were finally initiated





as upperclassmen when our Junior rings arrived on

With the Diary of Ann Frank, April 2 and 3, we were afforded the opportunity to display our talents on the stage. Proving to be a thespian in her own right, Marilyn Brown will long be remembered for her title role.

They said it couldn't be done, but we did it! The Junior Prom was held out of town. The rays of the "Hawaiian Sunset" cast ther shadow on the Elizabeth Carteret Hotel, May 21.

On September 13 school began for 322 anxious seniors who stepped not only into the last phase of their high school careers but also into a new building. Now, at last, we had earned our right to sell tickets to the swimming pool; however, these inanities no longer interested us. The seniors who walked into the school that fateful September 13 were no longer the children of 1962, for along with the gaining of twenty-two classrooms and almost as many courses, the seniors had gained an air of dignity.

Putting first things first, Allen Jackson, Andrea Hıla, Jo Ann Tomasulo, and Frank Versegi were elected to lead us through a year of momentous

decisions.

Again on the eve of Halloween, the class sponsored the first activity, Halloween Hullaboolu.

December saw the birth of the senior class production "Once Upon a Mattress" starring "daunt-less" Joe Klehan and "dainty" Mary Jane Kowal-

The consummation of our high school years, the Washington Trip, was made possible mainly through the success of the December 4 candy sale.

We returned from three days in Washington and soon found ourselves thrust into practice for

commencement exercises.

As we went through the motions of graduation (over and over and over again), our thoughts reverted to the memories of the dinner dance held only a few weeks previous and of our various

accomplishments.

On June 15 were were no longer pretending: the day had come when we were to take leave of the institution which had been our home for four years. However, we were not looking back. With diploma in hand, we look toward the future. . . .
