We learned grief with the passing of two classmates. We learned anxiety as we awaited college board scores. We learned exultation as we passed our drivers' tests. We learned friendship as time grew shorter. We worked; we sought; we matured . . . and we became seniors.

The hour was twilight. Joined by a definite, yet undefinable bond we proclaimed Mr. President, Alan Sumutka, as the unanimous leader of the Class of '68. Joel Albert, Nancy Deverin, and Marlene Varga were elected to help Alan activate our every last minute.

Our October 27 "Halloween Hullaboo" will never cease to haunt C.H.S. with memories of the last dance of the Class of '68.

On a rain-soaked November afternoon, we became the first class to win the Powderpuff title twice when we defeated the juniors 21-8.

"Class with the most school spirit"—we were the first class so named, as we influenced the entire student body at pep rallies and sporting events in the year of the Rambler.

Mr. John Sotak once again harnessed the talents of the Class of '68 in "Only an Orphan Girl," an old-time melodrama, on December 7 and 9. Innocent Loraine Yapczenski, villainous Joel Albert, heroic Glenn Turner, and gilded-caged Kathy Walsh will long be remembered for their performances.

With the profits from our senior candy sale, we boarded five buses to Washington, D. C., on March 5, 6, and 7. And when we returned, we were suddenly aware of the passing time.

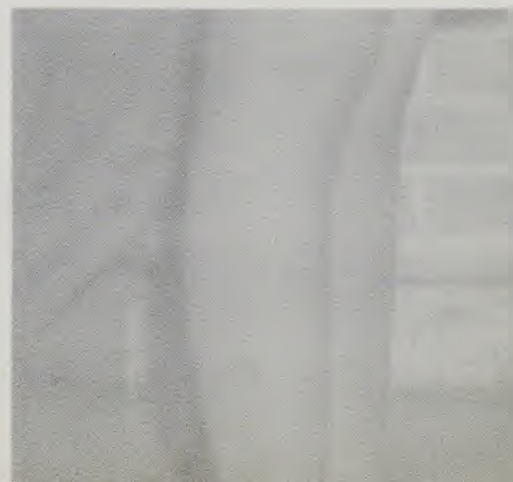
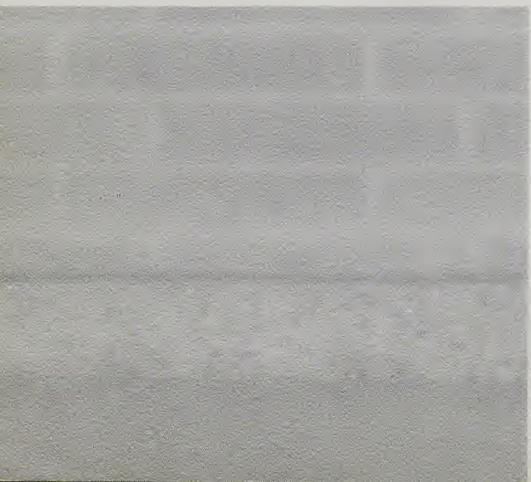
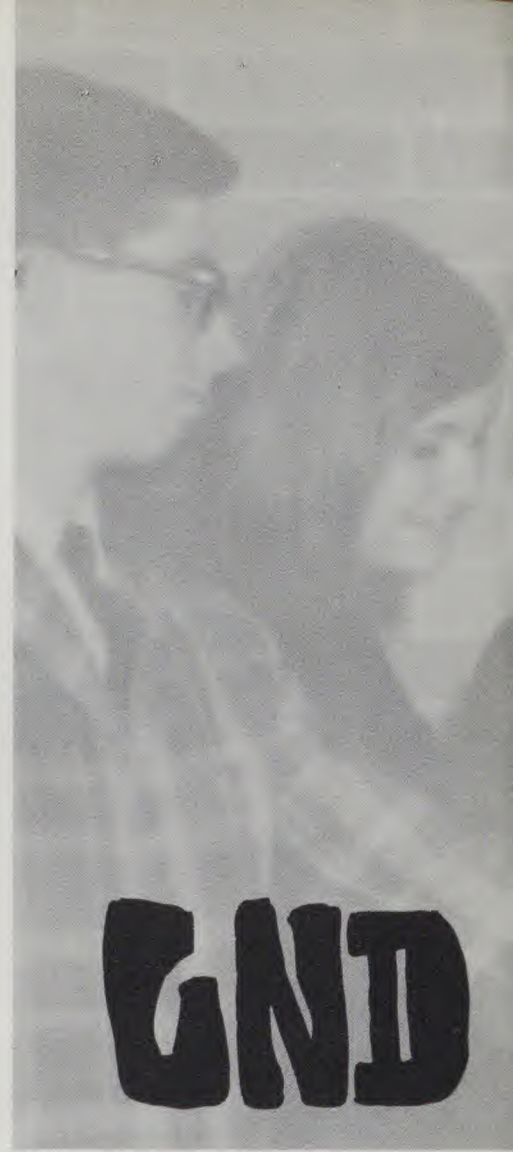
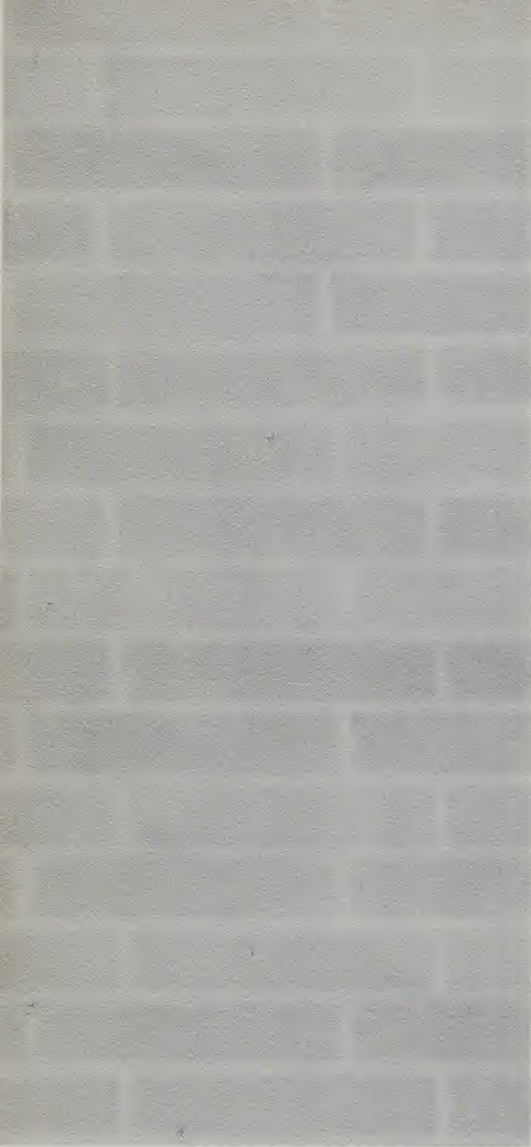
