





Class History

The Class of 1972 experienced the traditional events during their four years at Carteret High School, but they were also exposed to numerous changes.

We entered the halls of Carteret High as freshmen in September, 1969. Soon, the leaders of the Class of 1972 were chosen: Mike Kaskiw, President; Bruce McDonald, Vice President; Patti King, Secretary; and Grace Scheno, Treasurer. The same year we sponsored a dance with the theme "Aquarius." The first change we experienced as a class was the promotion of Mr. Salvatoriello from teacher to administrator.

Our Sophomore year opened with the election of Bruce McDonald as Class President; Howard Holder, Vice President; Mary Ann Mushalla, Secretary; and Grace Scheno, Treasurer. Activities included a zip code book sale and the Valentine's Day dance. Change came in the form of a revision of the detention system—no more after school periods. We now had the demerit. There was also a "change" in advisors—Miss Politowski became Mrs. Knutowicz.

Change marked the beginning of our Junior year. Mr. Kindzierski replaced Mr. Serson as advisor. As Juniors, we elected Mike Kaskiw, Mike Mesavitz, Eileen Oakley, and Peggy McGrath. One major event was our Sadie Hawkins Dance. On December 10 and 12, 1971, the Class of 1972 proved their acting abilities in "You Can't Take it With You," under the direction of Anthony Spaldo. The arrival of our Junior rings signified our status as upperclassmen. April brought warm weather and the Junior Prom, "We've Only Just Begun," held at the Seven Arches in Perth Amboy on April 12, 1971. Revision of the dress code was evidence of the changes which occurred. Change also appeared in the curriculum with the addition of new English electives.

Our long awaited Senior year dawned in the fall of 1971. The officers chosen to lead us to graduation were Mike Kaskiw, Donna Abrunzo, Barbara Coons, and Peggy McGrath. We sponsored the Halloween Dance and had the annual Senior Candy Sale. The musical "Guys and Dolls" was held on February 25 and 26, and on March 3 and 4. Under the direction of Anthony Spaldo, we realized that change was once again upon us. No longer could the Seniors call a play their own — it was a Junior-Senior production. On March 8, 9, and 10, the Seniors invaded Washington for three memorable days. On March 24, the Seniors met the Faculty in the annual Student-Faculty game. The Senior girls downed the women faculty 36-3. The boys lost a close battle to the men — 43-42. On June 1, 1972, the Senior Dinner Dance was held at the Shore Casino. One more significant event remained for the Seniors ... GRADUATION.
