
We are our hope. Intelligent and mature individuals, we can break out of the mold, change from within, and use the change to our advantage.




Carteret's success was truly a team effort. With five seniors and four juniors, Coach Kindzierski blended his winning formula.

The Carteret Frosh also completed a successful 13-3 season.




SOCCER








Congratulations to the girls who played exciting basketball and brought recognition to Carteret High. Hopefully many lasting friendships were gained in this new venture.







