#### School History

Fifty years ago, the thirty students of Carteret High School's first graduating class received their diplomas. The school this class attended was much different than what it is today. The building, for instance, was appreciably smaller—the Louis Street wing and the Herman Avenue wing were not yet constructed. Curriculum provided less of a choice of subjects to the students. In addition, both the principal, Ann Scott, and the coach of the football team, which was called the "Macmen", were women.

Even the Loudspeaker was different fifty years ago. It was, in fact, the school newspaper. This paper was distributed four times a year with the final issue running a single group picture of that year's graduating class. Eventually, the book developed into the pages of memories that preserve for a lifetime four years of high school.



The waning years of World War II witnessed many changes within Carteret High School. The football stadium was built in 1937, the Louis Street wing was added in 1939, new courses of study were introduced, and new faculty members were employed to meet the needs of a growing student body. Robert J. O'Donnell was hired as an English teacher and Douglas King became a science teacher.

A baseball field and tennis courts — added in 1940 — further supplemented the high school's apperance by occupying the space presently taken by the Herman Avenue wing.



As the years went by, further modifications were evident. The school building was enlarged with the Herman Avenue wing in 1965. The same year Mr. King, science teacher, became Mr. King, Principal, and Mr. O'Donnell became Superintendent of Schools in 1966. The newspaper changed its name to the *Ann Scott News* and the *Loudspeaker* became the school yearbook.

In fifty years of graduating seniors, many changes have occurred within Carteret High School. It is these alterations that have transformed a small, newly-formed school into the institution that graduated the class of 1976, consisting of 385 seniors. In the years ahead there are sure to be many more changes in the school, for new thoughts, ideas, and people are always emerging.

The 1975 Rambler Football season, which had its beginnings in the grueling heat of early September and its ending in the late November cold, was one which will be remembered for many years to come. In the half-century of Rambler football which preceded it, few teams approached the level of excellence achieved by the 1975 Ramblers, nor have many seasons generated the excitement and enthusiasm which characterized the 1975 season.

The Ramblers' first game, against Madison Twp., typified the season that was in store for the team. After taking a hard-fought 20-18 victory, the Ramblers went on to defeat both Kennedy and Cedar Ridge. Unfortunately, the Ramblers went on to lose their next game to Colonia, in conditions that were better suited to skindiving than to football. In true Rambler tradition; however, the team came back to win their next three games and qualify for the state playoffs. This final game was a fitting end to a memorable season, and to the memorable careers of the graduating seniors. The seniors leave behind a record of winning unmatched in fifty years of Rambler football, being the only team to win sixteen games in two seasons.

As for the seniors, they first extend their appreciation and gratitude to the fans, the band and bandfront members, and finally the cheerleaders for their enthusiasm and support which helped the team through the season's rough spots. Second, they wish to thank the sophomore and junior Ramblers who helped make this past season possible and to wish them great luck and success in the coming seasons. Finally, and most importantly, they wish to thank the coaches, without whom the 1975 season would never have happened. These men, through their work and dedication, gave the seniors the building blocks for a winning season, and more importantly, for a successful life. The seniors, then, leave Rambler football with three thoughts: Good-bye, Good luck, and Thank you.

The team was enthusiastically led by captain Sherri Leonard



history of Girls Basketball.




Besides leading the league and conference, Kathy Freeman also finished in seventh spot out of 270 bowlers in the State Tournament.


Young and Talented






