




# **EDITOR'S NOTE**



We have had experiences, both good and bad, that have helped us become mature individuals with our own interests and ideas.

We began our freshman year in September, 1975. At this time, we were introduced to our class advisors, Miss Dorothy Goyena and Mr. William Dague, who have dedicated their time and services to us for the past four years. We elected Ed Benson as class President, Dina Sibilia as Vice President, Cathy Liguori as Secretary, and Marianne Spinelli as Treasurer. To raise money for our class, we sold football buttons and engaged in our first car wash. Both activities provided a successful financial start for our class.

Sophomore year came, and we re-elected our freshman officers, with the exception of Lori Nelson as President. Apart from selling football buttons, we sold football bumper-stickers and stationery, and held our second annual car wash.

#### PRINCIPAL KING AND PRESIDENT KING

Mr. Douglas King, Principal of Carteret High School, was recently elected President of the New Jersey State Interscholastic Athletic Association, or NJSIAA. Mr. King succeeds Leonard Westman of Camden and will serve as President for the 1978-79 school year.

The NJSIAA regulates all athletic programs of its member schools. If you belong to any CHS sports program, from football to baseball to cross-country, your ground rules and regulations were made by the NJSIAA. In addition, Mr. King and the 42-member Executive Committee he presides over must settle disputes among the schools, which never fail to arise. "We're the 'highest court', so to speak, in hearing cases of the individual member schools," Mr. King commented. Almost all senior high schools, including CHS, most private and parochial schools, and some junior high schools are members of the NJSIAA.

When the NJSIAA was compared to an association like the NFL or the NCAA, Mr. King replied, "It (the NJSIAA) is somewhat like the NCAA, the NCAA regulates all college sports activities, and we regulate the high school athletic programs in the state. We do however, belong to the National Federation of High School Associations, which makes rules and regulations for all the state organizations like the NJSIAA."

Mr. King not only presides over the monthly meetings of the NJSIAA Executive Board, but is required to serve on all the sub-committees such as finance and membership. "Every time someone wants to make a change in our by-laws, the Executive Committee has to vote on it. We have 15 people working in our offices full-time. It's a big job," Mr. King observed.

Mr. King is especially proud of the fact that he is the first person from Middlesex County to be elected to the post of President. Previously, he had served as an executive board member for six years. When his term expires in 1979, he will become what is known as an "ex officio" member, that is, after his term expires, he will be able to return to the executive committee.

We at CHS wish Mr. King the best of luck in his new position, and we are confident that he will guide the NJSIAA to another year of success.

#### LATE SEASON TURNABOUT

The 1978 Football season for Carteret High School was clearly a story of courage. Often outmanned, out-sized, and out-muscled, the Ramblers overcame their adversities to finish the year with a 4-4-1 mark and a fifth place finish in the Middlesex County Conference. More importantly, Carteret did a remarkable late-season turnabout. The team rebounded from a 1-4-1 record after six games to end the season with three consecutive victories, a sound reminder of the solid Carteret foootball tradition of the past.

The courage that enabled this change to come about came solely from within. Outstanding leadership, not only by the captains but by all of the seniors, helped the Ramblers improve with each game. In addition, the dynamic play by a number of juniors was a key ingredient for the team's late-season success. Quite plainly, it was the courageous efforts of the forty-eight members of the team, not any mystery or magic, that resulted in a successful season.

The courage of four particular seniors, Captains Dave Frolich, Ed Benson, Brian Kelman, and All-County tackle John Keating, was a classic example for the other seniors to follow. On defense, it was Rick Calogero, Tom Craven. Kevin Irving and Paul Pompeo who were among those who solidified an emotionally-charged wolfpack unit. They gang-tackled their

way through the season and finished up with three outstanding efforts, the culmination being a shutout against a fine Perth Amboy team. On offense, quarterback Jerry Bruss passed his way into the record books behind the blocking of tackle Steve Hydzik. Bruss threw seven touchdown passes during the season, with a school best 98-yarder to Karl Slivka against Edison. Senior wingback Doug Shanley also made his share of catches and fullback Jerry Bare ran and blocked for some critical yardage as the Ramblers scored 76 points in their last three victories.

Perhaps the greatest expression of the courage of these players was the presentation of the Raymond E. Kinch Memorial Award at the Rambler Club banquet. It is given to the senior who best exemplifies "... the overall courage required to excel in athletics, and in life." This year's recipient was linebacker Rick Calogero.

With the graduation of these seniors, the leadership of the 1979 squad rests with those courageous underclassmen who will return. There will be adversities for them to overcome; they too may be outmanned, out-sized, out-muscled. But they have been shown what courage is and have indeed experienced its rewards.











#### **VARSITY WRESTLING**

Although wrestling is both a team and individual sport, the emphasis is placed primarily on the individual. As a result, Mr. Yustak, the head coach, emphasized principally those wrestlers whom he felt were outstanding. All four were nominated for the All-Conference team.

Mike Pysniak, a junior who wrestled at 108, finished the season with a 14-6-2 record. He took first place in the Carteret Wrestling Tournament, and captured third place in the county tournament, in which twenty-two teams participated.

Gerry Penna, who wrestled at 122 lbs., was a senior with a record of 14-4-1. He had two first place trophies to his name, from the Carteret and Clark tournaments. Gerry also placed fourth in the county tournament.

Joe Anselmo had a record of 17-4-1, and was a junior who wrestled at 129 lbs. He placed second in the Carteret tournament. Joe also captured a second place in the district tournament which was held February 23-24.

Another wrestler who did extremely well was senior Joe Kopin (170 lbs.). Unfortunately, he was injured halfway through the season. Before being hurt, he had a record of 9-2, with first places in both the Clark and Carteret tournaments. After being out for a month, Kopin made an outstanding comeback and took second place in the district tournament, and finished with a record of 12-4. Both Anselmo and Kopin qualified for the regional competition which took place in Union on March 2-3.

Relatively few people attend wrestling matches, yet the wrestlers deserve much more credit. Due to the nature of the sport, the athletes must struggle individually to achieve their goals. The wrestlers must also maintain strict diets to remain at their specified weights. If the wrestlers do not maintain their proper weights, they cannot compete. Because of the strict program that must be followed, Mr. Yustak has referred to wrestling as a "twenty-four hour a day, seven day a week" sport.


