Winning Season Without Home Games

The 1979 Carteret High School Rambler football team began the season with the anticipation of a championship year. But key injuries and the loss of a few players, led to a semi-disappointing season for Coach Robinson’s Ramblers.

The season opened on a high note as the Ramblers went to Madison to take on the pre-season favorite Spartans. Behind the running of Keith Tharrington and Shawn Stewart, the Ramblers were easy victors, 22-3. The next opponent was arch rival Woodbridge and the Ramblers bowed in a defensive struggle by the score of 2-0.

The next game was against Sayreville and behind the running of Pat Ryan and the 40 yard interception return of Glen Meisner, Carteret rolled over the Bombers, 20-0. The Ramblers enjoyed tremendous publicity

following their 7-2 victory over J.P. Stevens. The loss snapped Stevens 20 game winning streak in the conference. The team was led by Mike McNulty who intercepted two key passes ending the Hawkes chances of scoring.

In a game in which Carteret seemed to have won, finally ended in disappointment as Jim Mazola’s first two field goals were called back because of penalties. The third attempt was good and the Ramblers had to settle for a 7-7 tie with East Brunswick.

The Ramblers then traveled to Union to face the eventual state champs. It was a very physical contest as the Ramblers held on to trail by only one point at halftime. Union eventually took command and scored late touchdowns in the game to come away with a 33-11 win.

Not willing to concede the season, the

Ramblers came away with back to back thrashings over Cedar Ridge, 34-8 and Edison, 20-6. Two reasons for these victories was the running of Keith Tharrington and Shawn Stewart. The Edison game was especially gratifying for Shawn as he scored three touchdowns.

The season ended in a wild Thanksgiving Day contest with Perth Amboy. In an offensively dominated game, Carteret lost, 26-20.

Although the 5-3-1 mark was less than the team expected, the post season brought good news as Glen Meisner, Steve Nelson and Bob Orr were selected to the All-County squad and Pat Ryan received Honorable Mention.

Success is wished to the returning players and coaches in 1980.

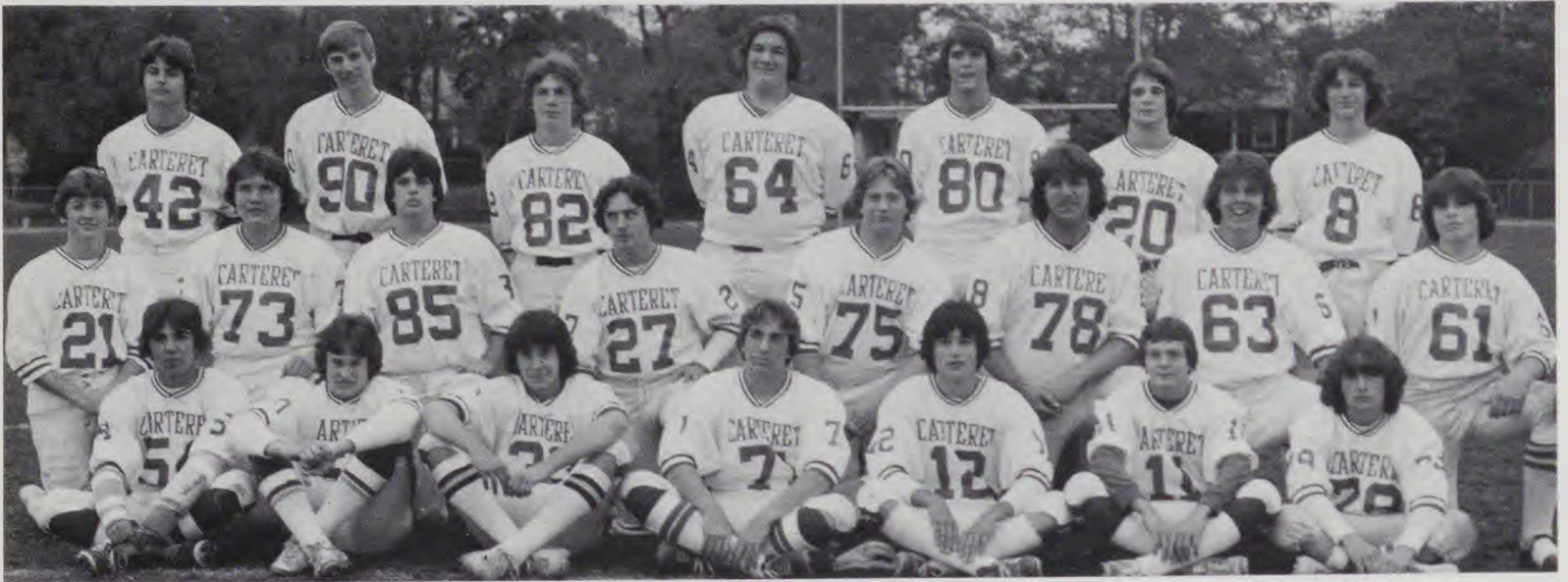

Ramblers Net Winning Season

The 1979 soccer season was one of ups and downs, but Coach Cowan's varsity team showed spirit and class the entire way. Led by senior captains Joe Anselmo, Bill Dewitz, and Dan MacDonald, the team finished with a season of 8-6.

Starting the season off well, the Ramblers defeated Union, 3-2. Scoring for the Ramblers were seniors Dan MacDonald, Len Masse (from an impressive 35-yards out), and junior Cheon Yim.

Another win was added to Carteret's record when Colonia forfeited due to a teachers' strike.

After losing the next three games to Edison, 3-0, J.P. Stevens, 2-1, and South Plainfield, 2-1, Carteret rebounded to win the next two games.

In the game against Perth Amboy, Carteret won 3-2 in double-overtime, with junior Dan Maldonado scoring all three goals. His penalty shot in the double overtime gave the Ramblers the victory.

Carteret's skill was demonstrated once again when they beat Piscataway, 4-1. Dan MacDonald scored twice for the Ramblers, while juniors Ted Palumbo and Dan Maldonado each added a goal.

A loss to Madison by the slim score of

1-0 did not shake the Ramblers' confidence. They won their next game against Cedar Ridge, 3-1. Ted Palumbo, Dan Maldonado, and Dan MacDonald each scored a goal to give the Carteret team the victory.

After losing to South Brunswick, 5-0, Carteret's class and spirit were displayed as they went on to win three out of the remaining four games.

In the next game, Cedar Ridge came out on the short end of a 3-2 Carteret victory. Ted Palumbo scored for the Ramblers while Dan MacDonald added two goals to give the Ramblers the victory.

J.F. Kennedy proved to be no match for the Ramblers as they won by the score of 4-1. Dan MacDonald, Joe Anselmo, Len Masse and Ted Palumbo each kicked in a goal for the Ramblers which proved to be too much for the Kennedy defense.

After losing to Woodbridge by the slim score of 4-3, Carteret won their last game of the regular season to Sayreville, 3-0. Penetrating Sayreville's defense and scoring goals were Ted Palumbo, Dan Maldonado and Mike Pysniak. Senior goalie Billy DeWitz enjoyed his first shutout of the season. This win ended the regular season.

In the first round of the County

Tournament against J.P. Stevens, Carteret won in overtime, 3-2. Ted Palumbo and Danny MacDonald scored the first two goals. In the second over-time, Carteret won on corner kicks. Unfortunately, the Ramblers lost in the second round to Metuchen, 1-0.

Carteret won in the first round of the State Tournament against Perth Amboy, 2-1. John Millan and Danny MacDonald scored for the Ramblers. Carteret lost in the second round, 2-0, to Freehold Township, thus ending the 1979 season.

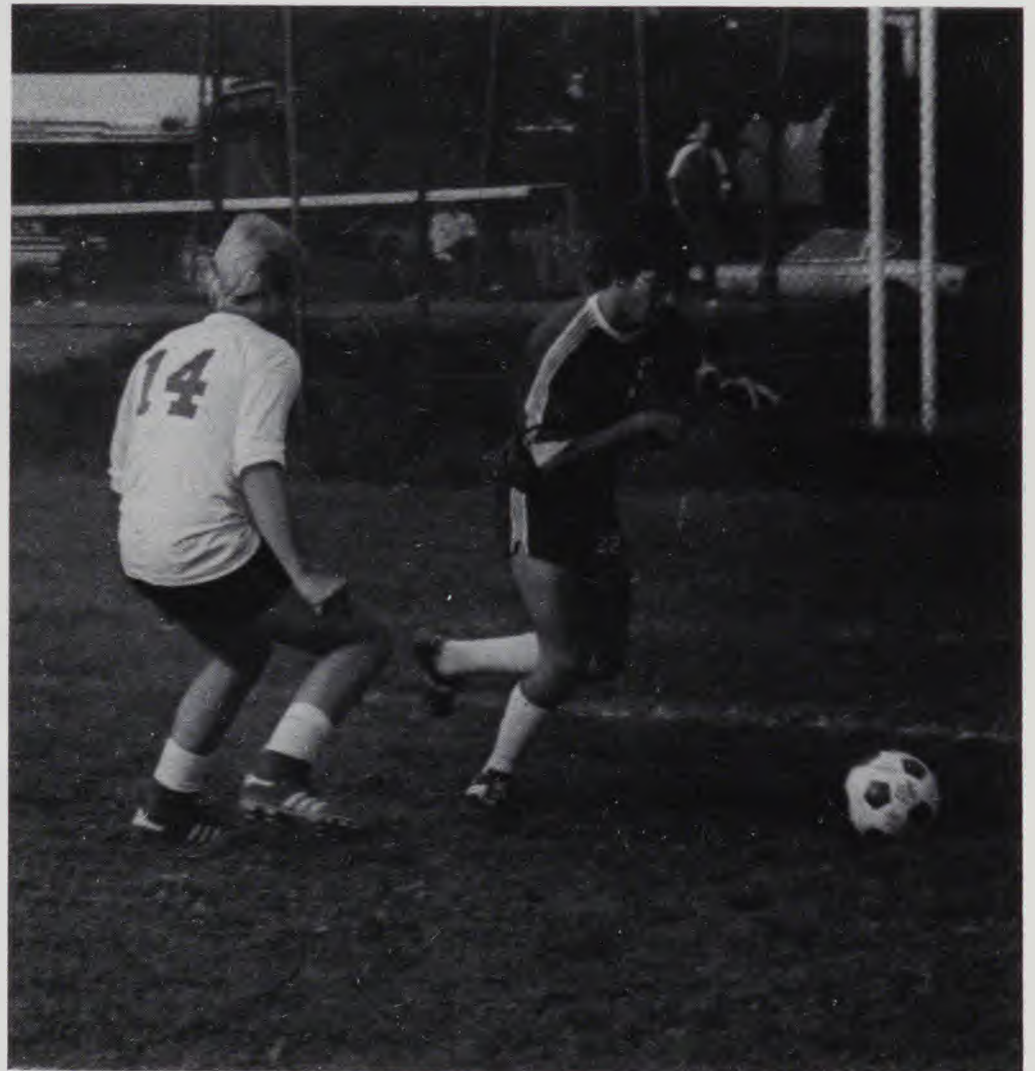

Returning for the boys will be Kenny Testa, Joe Dunne, Bob DeFederico, Steve Bonino, Alan Bongiovanni, Kevin Fields, Ed Nelan, Ted DeKarski, Ed Procopio, Frank Boyle, Vince Medvetz, Dave Osborne and Rodger Boncelet. Also returning will be Jerry Windos, who finished twenty-ninth in a field of 120 competitors with a time of 18:32 at the State Invitational at Warencio Park.

The Lower Score Wins?

In most sports, the team who scores the most points wins. This, however, is not the case in cross-country.

The object of running cross-country as a team is to get the lower score. Scoring is simple. Each team has seven varsity runners in a race. At the finish of the 3.1 mile run, the place each runner finishes corresponds to the number of points he receives. The first five members of each team to cross the finish line receive points. The sixth and seventh runners of each team act simply to hold a place and therefore increase point values behind them. The points are added up and the team with the lower score wins.

Ramblers Lose Gracefully

Perfection — all of us strive for it, to be near it. In athletics, the term is often used loosely. People often speak of the "perfect play" or a "perfect strategy." In gymnastics, the word is not applied so freely. The gymnast is constantly watched by two or three judges. She performs alone, thus the slightest error immediately becomes evident. Any break in form — a stumble, fall, or even a slight wobble — results in points being deducted from the competitor's score.

There are four events in girls' gymnastics: the vault, the balance beam, the uneven parallel bars, and the floor exercise. Four girls from each team compete on each event, the three highest scores counting towards the team score.

Each event requires a specific strength or skill. Vaulting requires strong shoulders to push off the horse. A somewhat aggressive approach is needed. The gymnast must pound off a springboard with her feet and then land and push off the vaulting horse with her arms. On vaulting, the Ramblers had Therese Kindzierski, Laura Yustak, Mary Kepich, and Jennifer Selvaggi. Jennifer achieved the highest scores for the team on this event.

The balance beam, if not the most difficult piece of apparatus to master, is certainly the most dangerous. The gymnast performs four feet above the ground on a wooden beam only four inches wide. The object is to perform stylized exercises as smoothly as on the floor. The competitor should dance, tumble, and move across the beam with confidence. Competitors on the beam included Karen Kinnenburgh, Jule Healy, Joy Humphrey, Mary Kepich and Laura Yustak. Laura regularly earned the

highest in this event for the Ramblers.

To perform successfully on the uneven bars requires great arm and abdominal strength. Throughout a bars routine, the gymnast supports her body weight with her arms and controls her leg position through her abdomen. The entire routine must "flow" with a minimum of breaks and stops. Performers on the unevens included Sue Leonard, Josie Mastroviti, Patty Lynch, Joyce Whittet, Mary Kepich and Therese Kindzierski. Therese consistently scored the highest for the team in this event.

The floor exercise is often the favorite of the spectator. In this event, the gymnast performs to music. She dances and executes tumbling passes, covering the entire area of the exercise mat. The goal is for the athlete to express herself through her personal style and technique. Thus, the routine is often transformed into a personal essay through which the gymnast speaks to the audience. The girls who competed in this event included Jule Healy, Joy Humphrey, Lynn Portugal, Mary Kepich and Laura Yustak. Laura usually succeeded in achieving the team's highest score in this event.

To perform on all four pieces of apparatus successfully demands a skill that few possess. This year, Carteret had one all-around performer in Mary Kepich, a sophomore. She competed regularly on all four events.

The Ramblers are losing only three seniors this year — Jennifer Selvaggi, Joy Humphrey, and Laura Yustak. With the majority of the team returning, the gymnastics team is looking forward to a bright future. They will continue to strive for the exclusive goal — perfection.

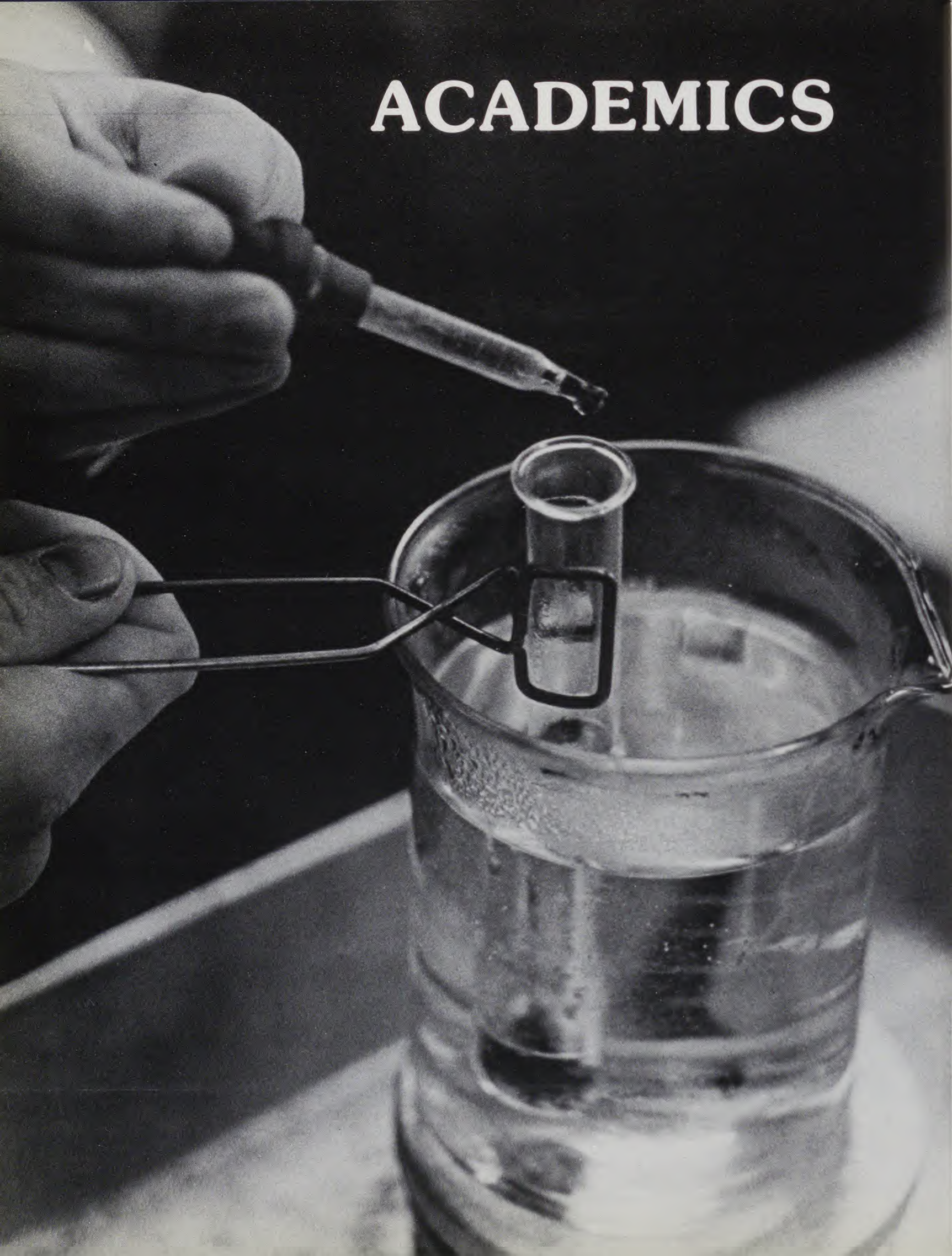

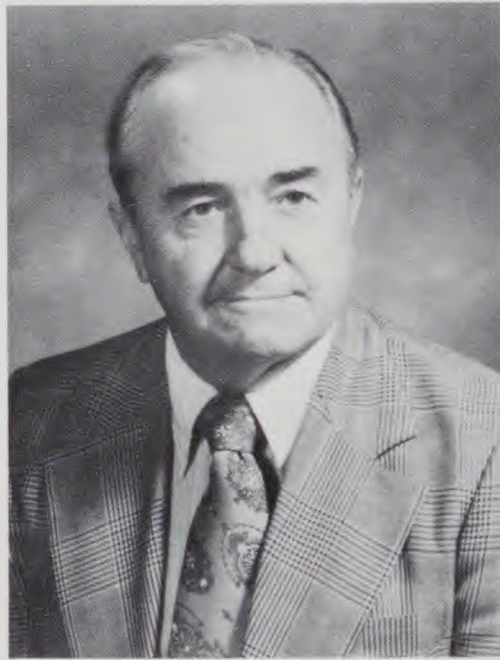

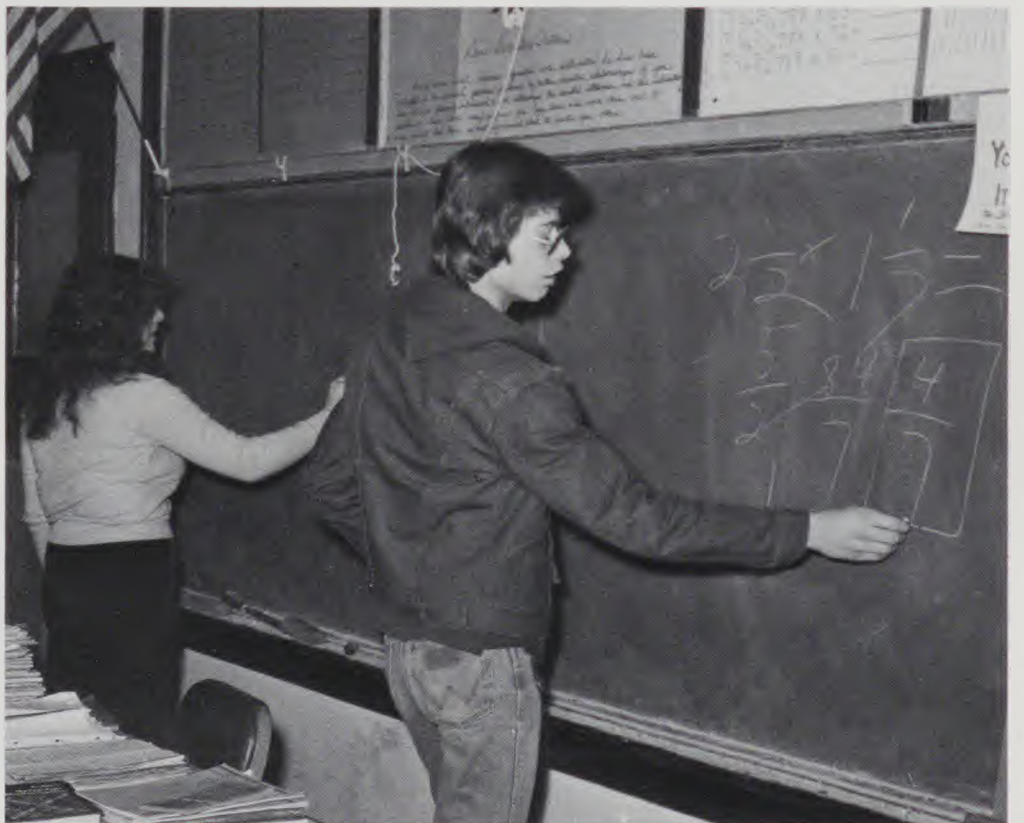

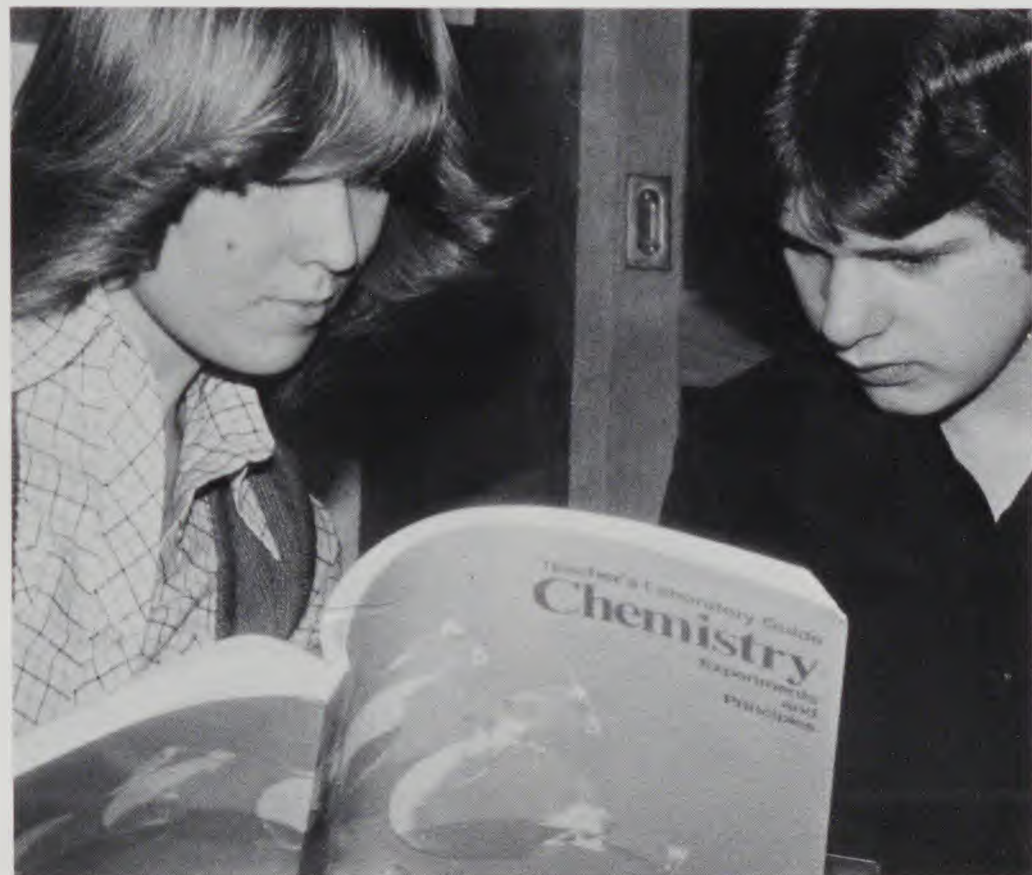

Science: More than Test Tubes

Students can read about science in their text books, but the real experience is seeing words come to life in the laboratory. The science labs are divided into the following sections:

Earth Science: consists of freshman, their experiments involve the testing of rocks, the atmosphere, and the make up of the planet. They also learn several theories on the world and its creation.

Biology: This class of sophomores, use the microscope extensively to study forms of life from simple to complex. As the year continues the students dissect different species ranging from the worm to the pig.

Chemistry: Caution is a must, in this junior year science, since they are dealing with dangerous chemicals. The students not only study certain circumstances, they visualize and create the reaction themselves.

Marine Science: This new lab's experiments are not always performed in class. At times, the students will work with samples taken from trips to the ocean and nearby waters.

Physics: The students must apply their knowledge of algebra to scientific experiments. Emphasis is placed on theory as well as problem solving.

Advanced Science: This science's relation is to anatomy. The students learn about their own bone structures by studying the structures of other animals. There are many terms and theories the students must understand fully in order to perform their experiments.

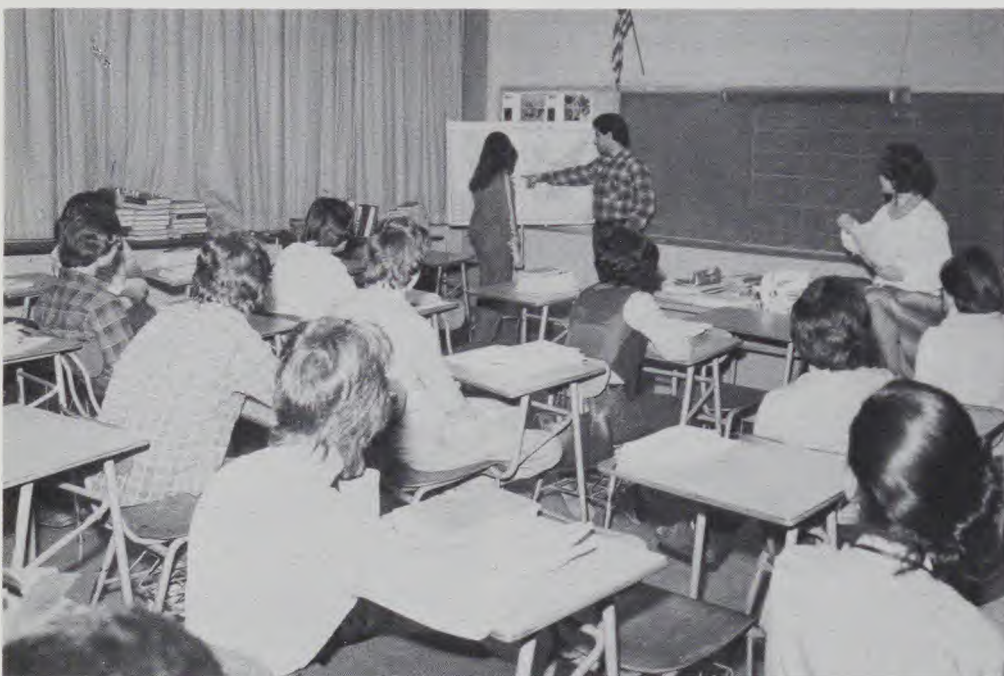
Social Studies

The Social Studies Department consists of ten teachers and nineteen courses. There are, of course, many required classes. 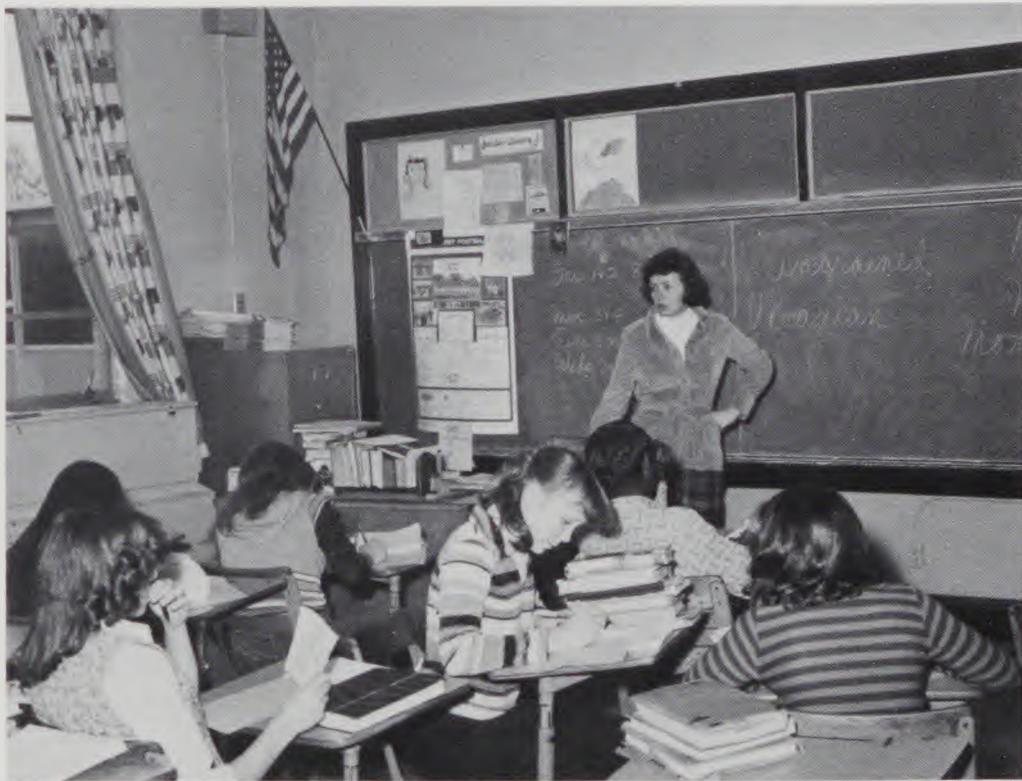

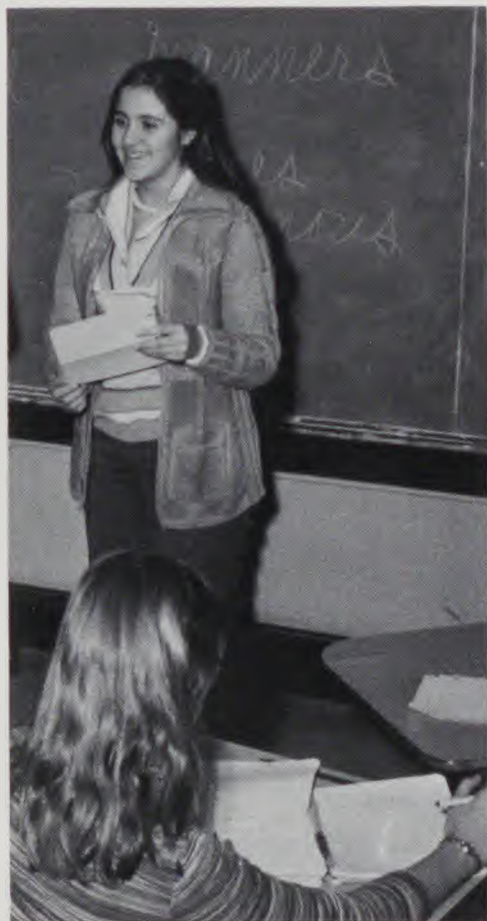


English

The English classes are diversified programs that cover the four communication skills; reading, writing, listening, and speaking. In a four year period the students study literature, drama, speech, media, and composition. Each discipline is basically studied at certain levels of high school.

For example, a Freshman will study Literary Genres, a Sophomore will study Oral and Written Communications, a Junior will study Expository Writing, and a Senior may study Shakespeare and Shaw.

Languages: A New Approach

The language classes in this school are French, German, and Spanish. The courses are available to all students from Freshman year through Senior year.

The values are cumulative. Even after a brief foreign language study, students can understand the basic structure of the language.

However, advanced study produces effective skills with the refinement of language and insight into a language and culture.

One of the basic objectives is for students to have an understanding and appreciation of another peoples' way of life, literature, and civilization.

Physical Education

Physical Education class is required for all four years in high school and also incorporates Driver's Theory (for juniors and seniors) and Health. These classes help to build coordination, strength, and ability in the student.

Home Ec.

The Home Economics classes are divided into several sections and levels; Home Ec. 1 & 2, Foods 1 & 2, and Single Living. Each class teaches the theory and skill that goes into creating healthy, appetizing food and fashionable clothes.

Home Ec. 1 & 2: are based on cooking, meal planning, food preparation, and kitchen safety. In sewing class a student must complete two projects and learn the basics of sewing and sewing safety.

Foods 1 & 2: In Foods 1 the students must give a report on nutrition and learn how to plan and prepare full meals. Foods 2 is the most independent and sophisticated of all the courses. Here emphasis is placed upon international cooking.

Single Living: This class basically involves learning survival skills and living on your own. Emphasis is placed on nutrition and the food groups and how it relates to physical fitness.

Band: The Music Lives

In Mr. Torissi's band class, students learn more than how to develop their instrumental skills. They learn how to have a greater appreciation of all music, which includes classical, rock, jazz, and Broadway themes. Students learn to express individualism through their instruments and yet keep in time by learning teamwork and following all hand directions. All this gives the student a well balanced understanding of music and how it is played.

Industrial Arts shops are not operated in the classical, structured, academic areas of Carteret High School. In the shops, the individual ability of the student is stressed. There are norms to which we must adhere, but, they are the minimum requirements of functional performance. "Hands-On" ability is not the only factor in measuring performance. The ability to interpret written instructions and informative material is necessary.

In the Industrial Arts shop areas, individualized instruction is of primary consideration. No two students have the same level of ability. Therefore, after a lecture/

demonstration of a particular function to be learned in handling a tool or a machine, the instructor must apply himself more to the slow learner. When teaching basic tool handling and machine operation, the technique does not vary. It must be simple, concise, and complete.

In the future, we hope to have an Industrial Arts major similar to the College Prep and Business Education. The students will be permitted to take two to four periods per day of Industrial Arts courses, with double periods in the eleventh and twelfth grades to better prepare them for jobs in industry.

Business

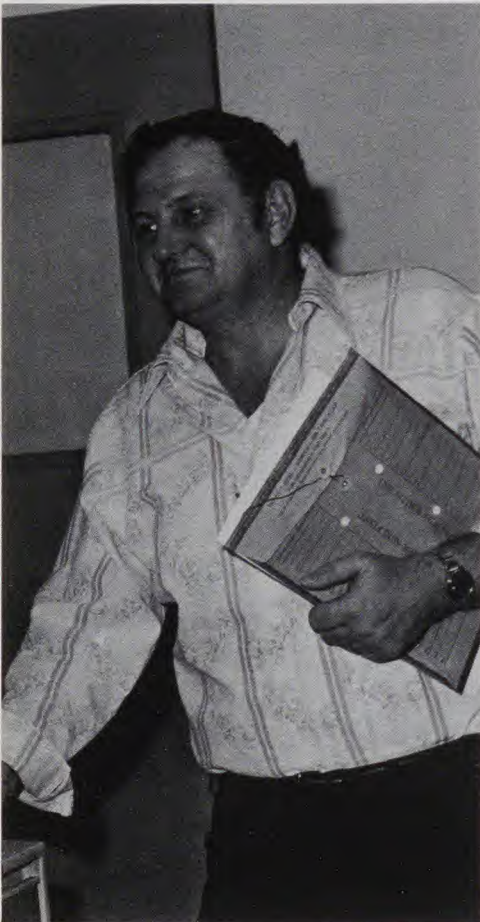
There are many classes offered that are diversified programs dealing with the technical skills of the business world such as

typing, steno, and consumer work. The student's classroom experiences range from typing letters and taking dictation in steno, to learning business management, consumerism and office work.

Examples of the classes include Exploratory Business, a class in which the student is introduced to steno and phone techniques; Basic Business I, where a student learns basics such as consumerism; Basic Business II, where the basics are expanded and the study of consumerism is more in depth; Typing I, where students learn the basic skills of typing; Typing II, where the students expand their skills and where a greater emphasis is placed on the speed and accuracy; and Business Law, where a student learns the laws of the business world and how to apply them. S.O.P. (Secretarial Office Practice), D.E. (Distributive Education), and C.O.P. (Clerical Office Practice) are classes designed for the student to be "at work" with the skills they've learned.

English



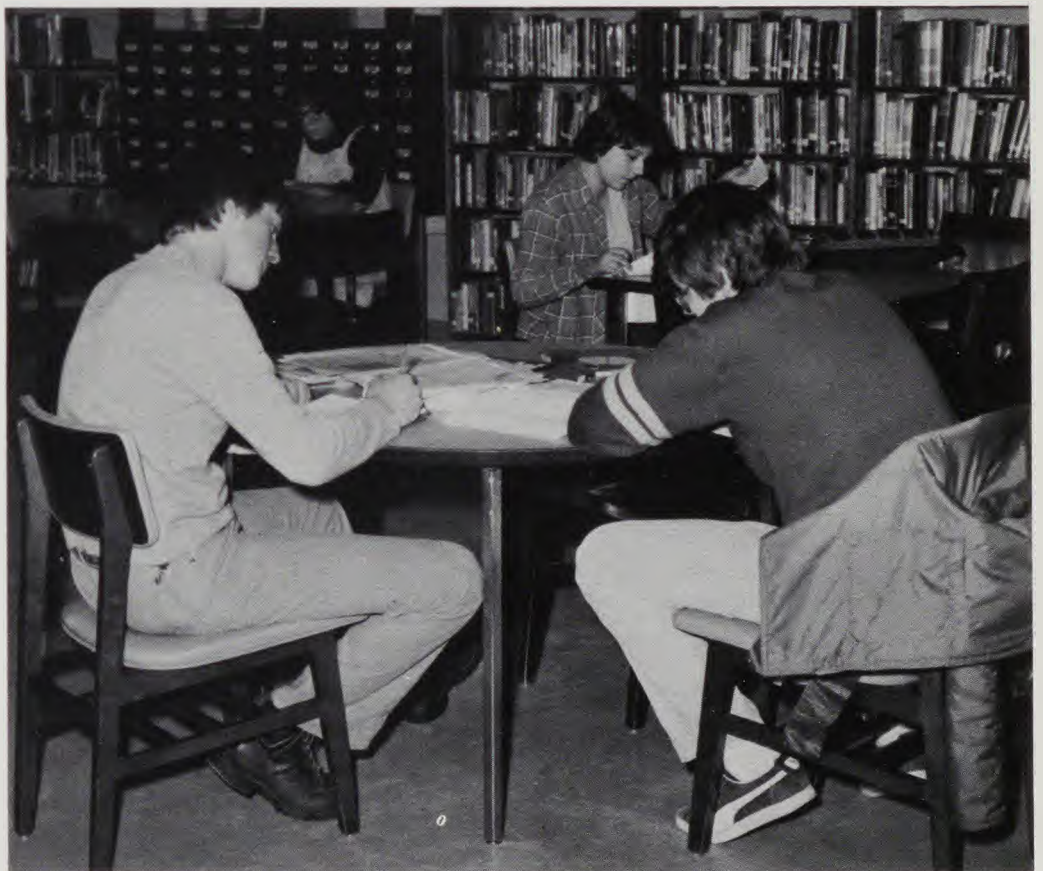

Aside from the English classes offered for students of all courses, we also have classes for students enrolled in business courses. These English classes teach skills that are necessary in the business field, such as proper grammar and letter writing. An emphasis is placed on spelling and punctuation, especially when learning letter writing.

The classes offered are Business English I, wherein students learn the fundamentals of grammar and writing; Business English II, wherein the teaching of the fundamentals is expanded, Business English III, in which the techniques of letter writing are developed and Business English IV in which the students utilize their skills which have been developed within the past three years.

General Studies

There are those students, who, as they enter high school, are undecided as to which course of study they wish to pursue. The availability of the General program provides these students with the freedom to delay this decision. Under the General program, a student may enroll in courses from both the business and college preparatory programs. This freedom becomes an advantage if the student decides to attend college, he has behind him an adequate foundation for further study. If an individual wishes to enter the business world, he often has learned the skills necessary to break into a field. The General program thus parallels the liberal arts programs of many colleges in that a student gains knowledge in a variety of areas.

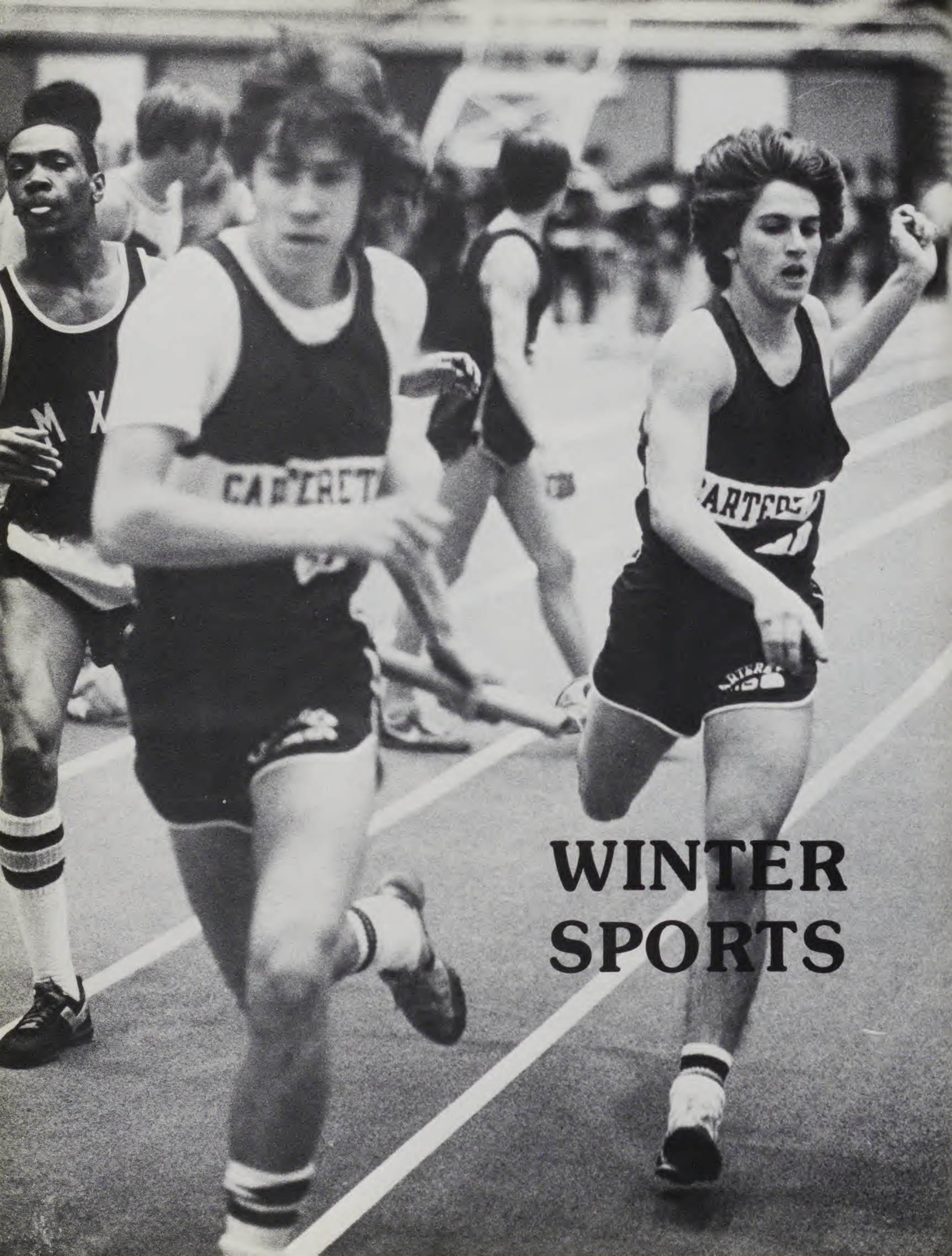

Vesey and Jerry Martinez each had 17 points while Tom Bindos tossed in 11 for the winners.

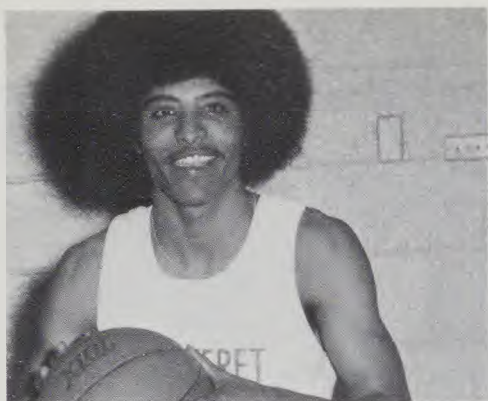

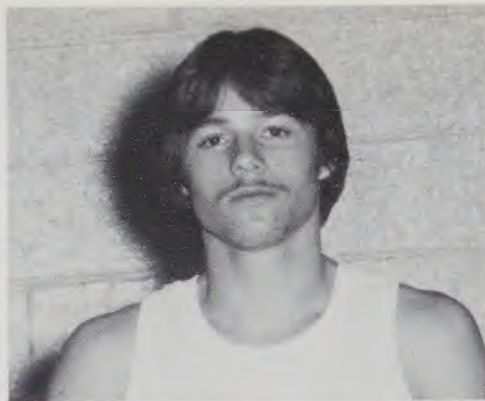
Woodbridge was the next opponent for Carteret and the Ramblers handled them easily by winning 52-42.

The Ramblers lost the last two games of the season to Perth Amboy, 60-48 and Colonia, 68-46.

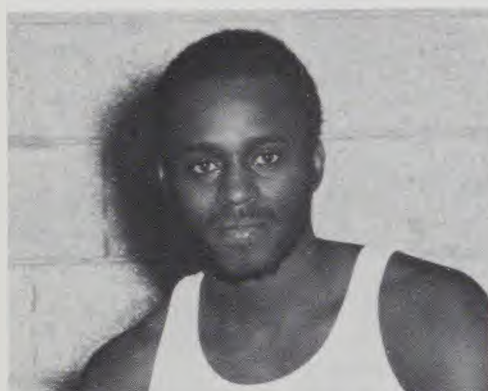
The Ramblers will greatly miss the departing seniors but an experienced team will return next year to bring the Ramblers another winning season. Best wishes to these players and Coach Karatz.



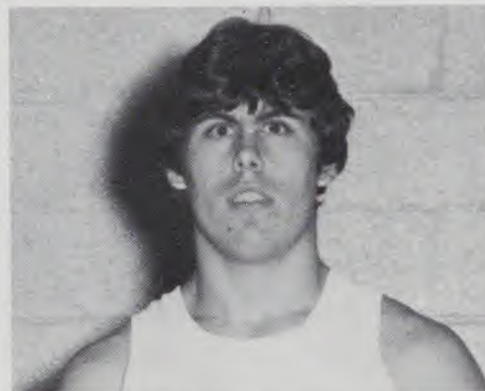

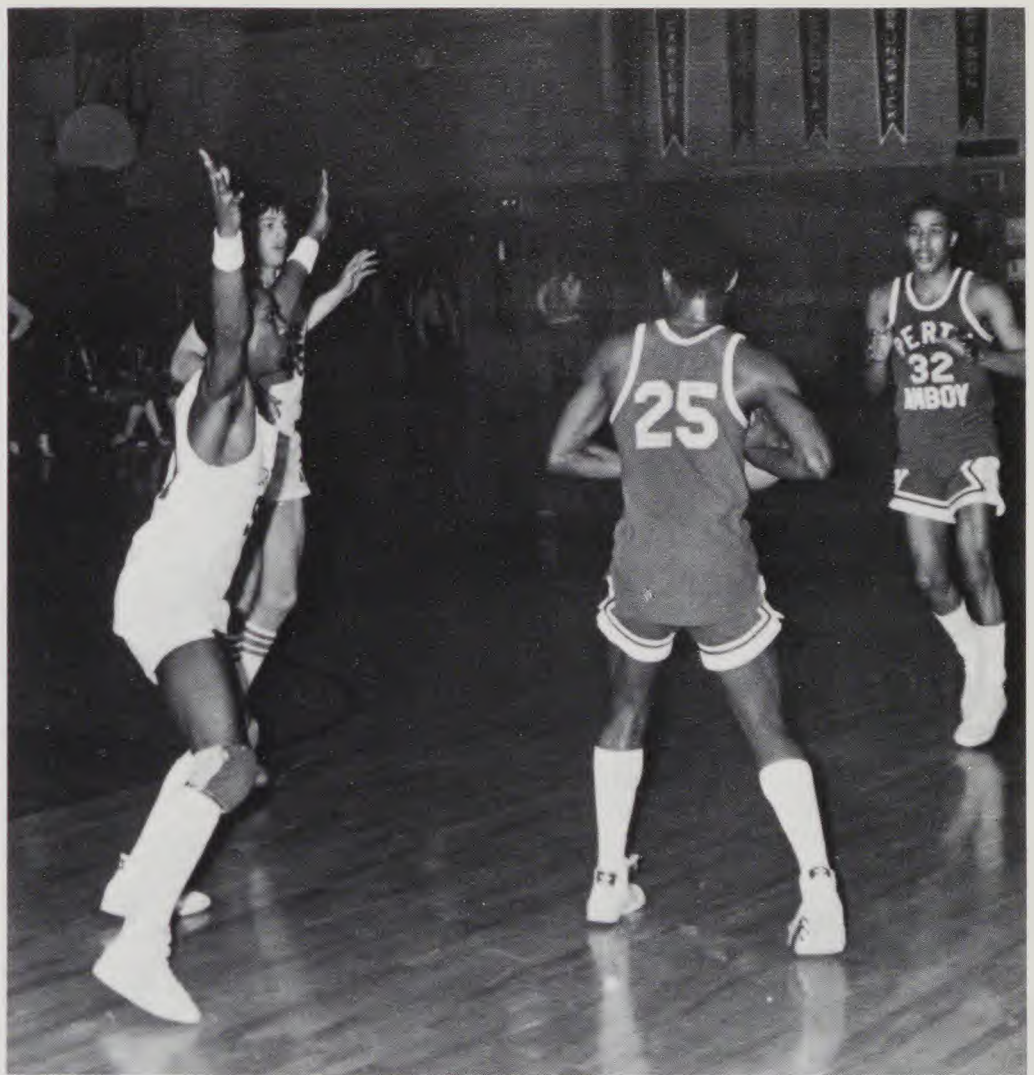

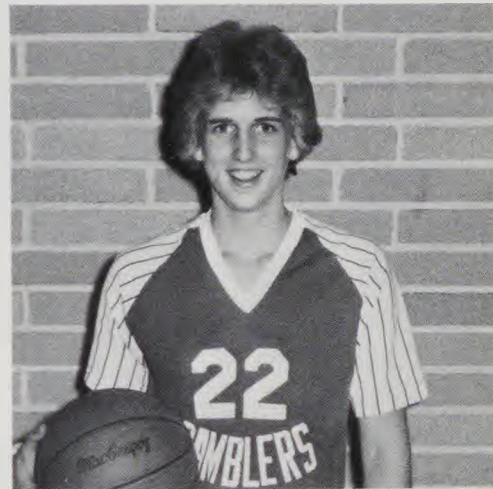

Success is wished to Coach Simon and the returning bowlers.

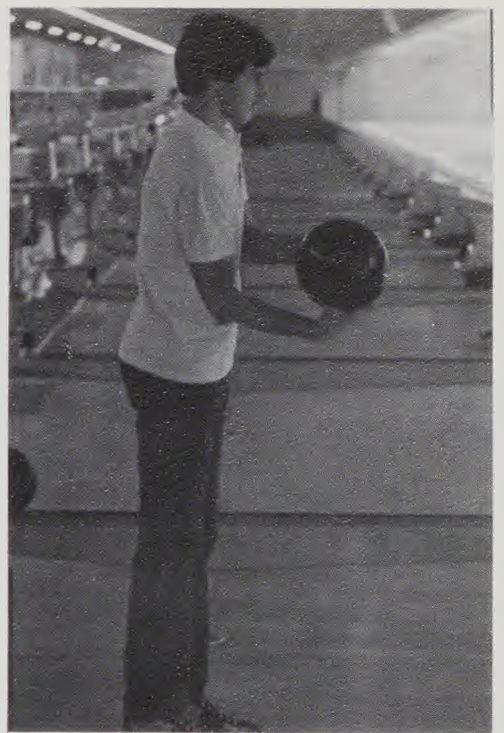

This is the first year in which the Student Life section has appeared in the Loudspeaker. Their comic foul-ups lead to the break up of the couple. However, all works out and the couple is reconciled.

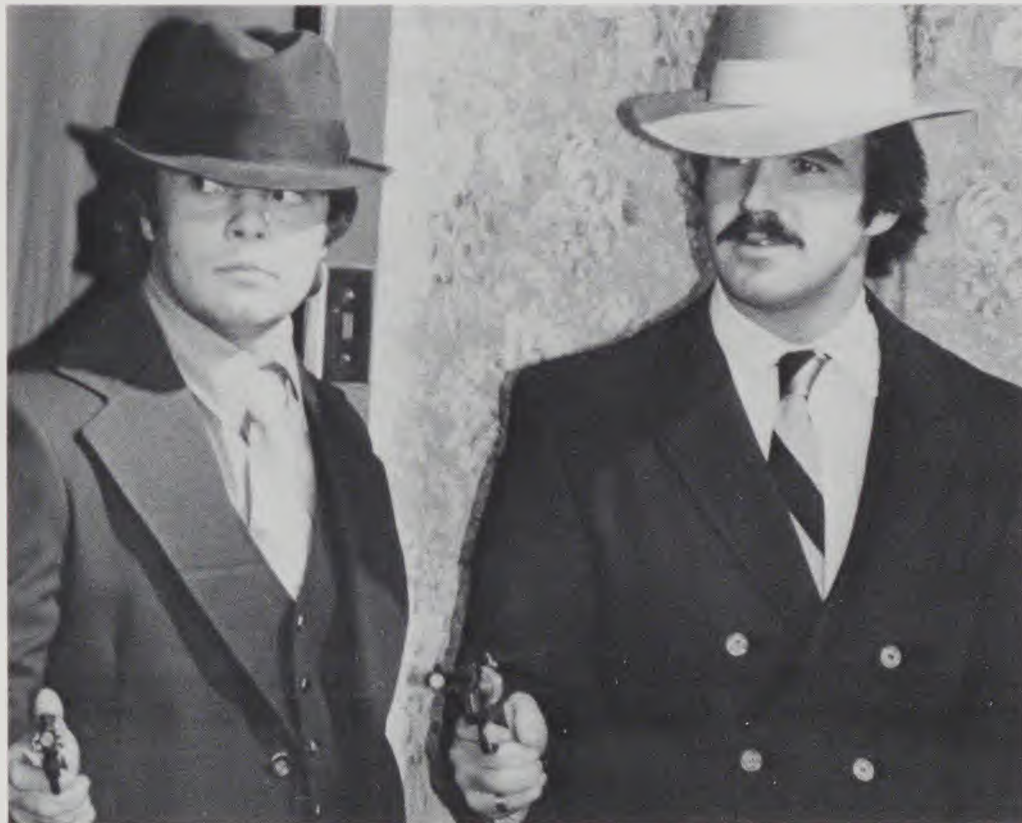

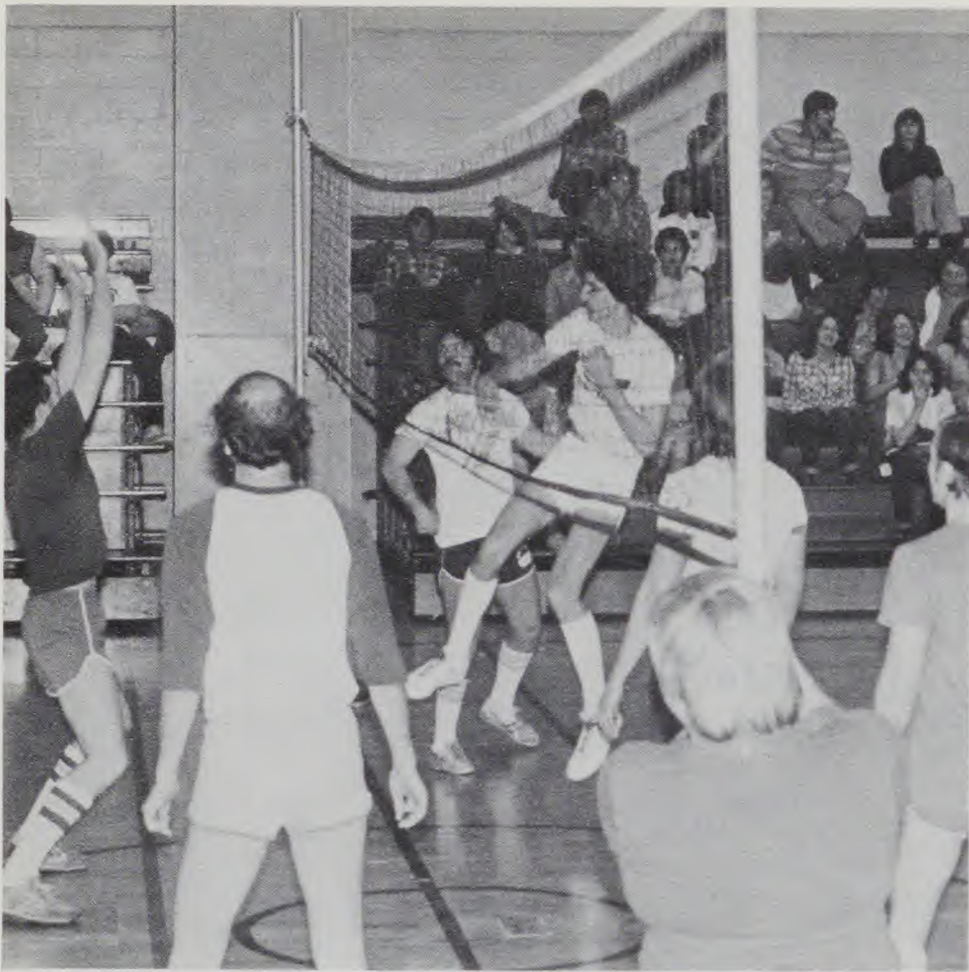

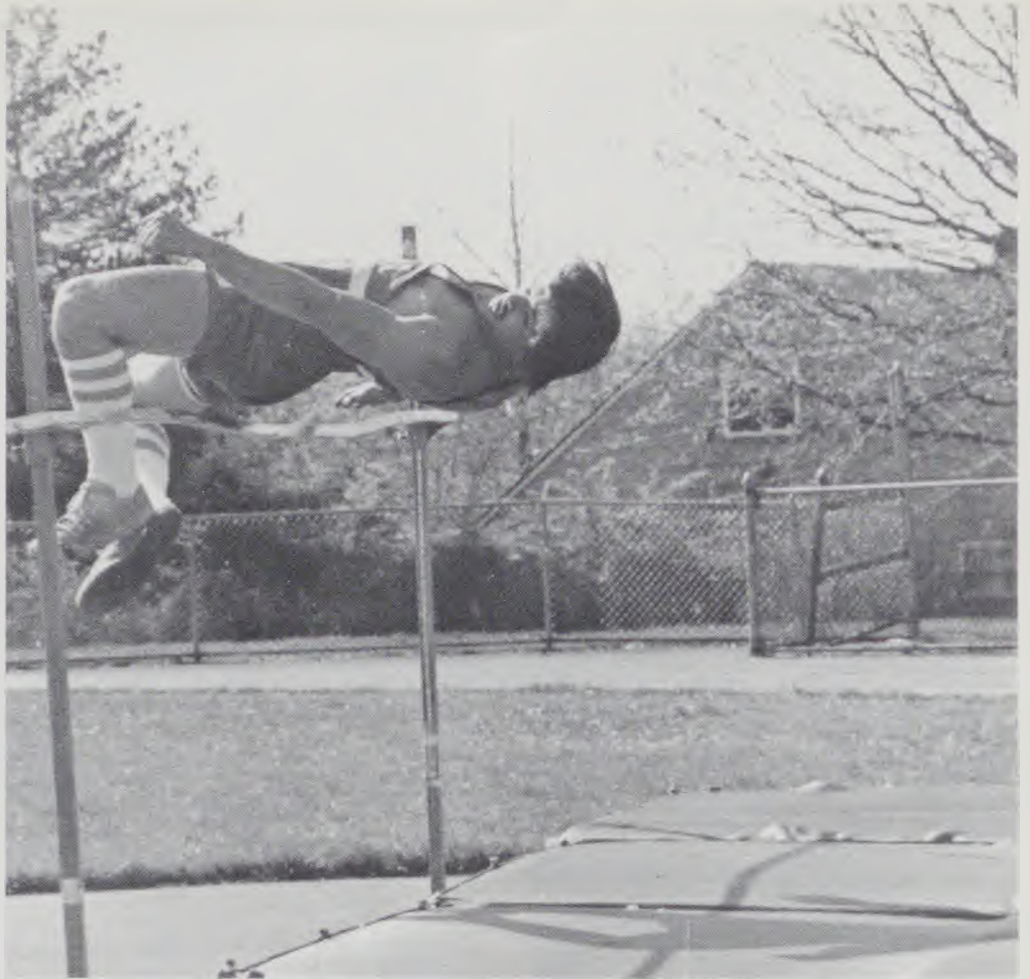

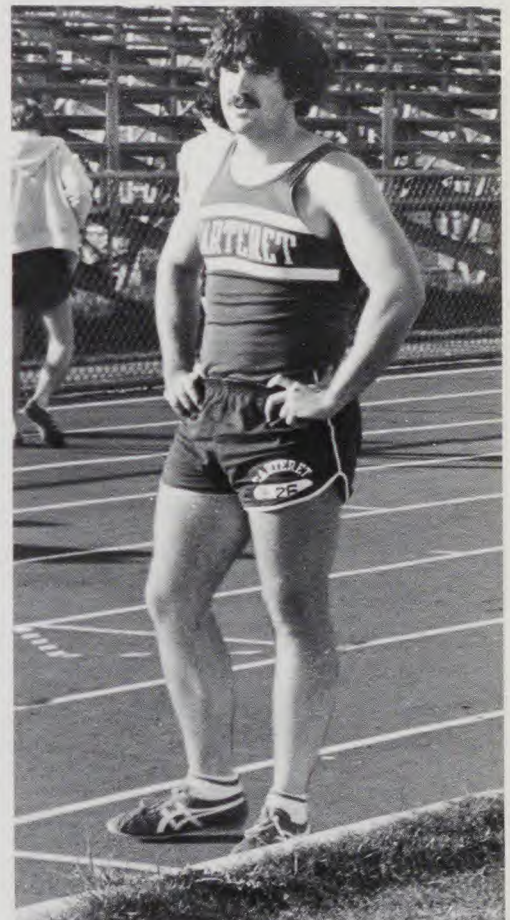

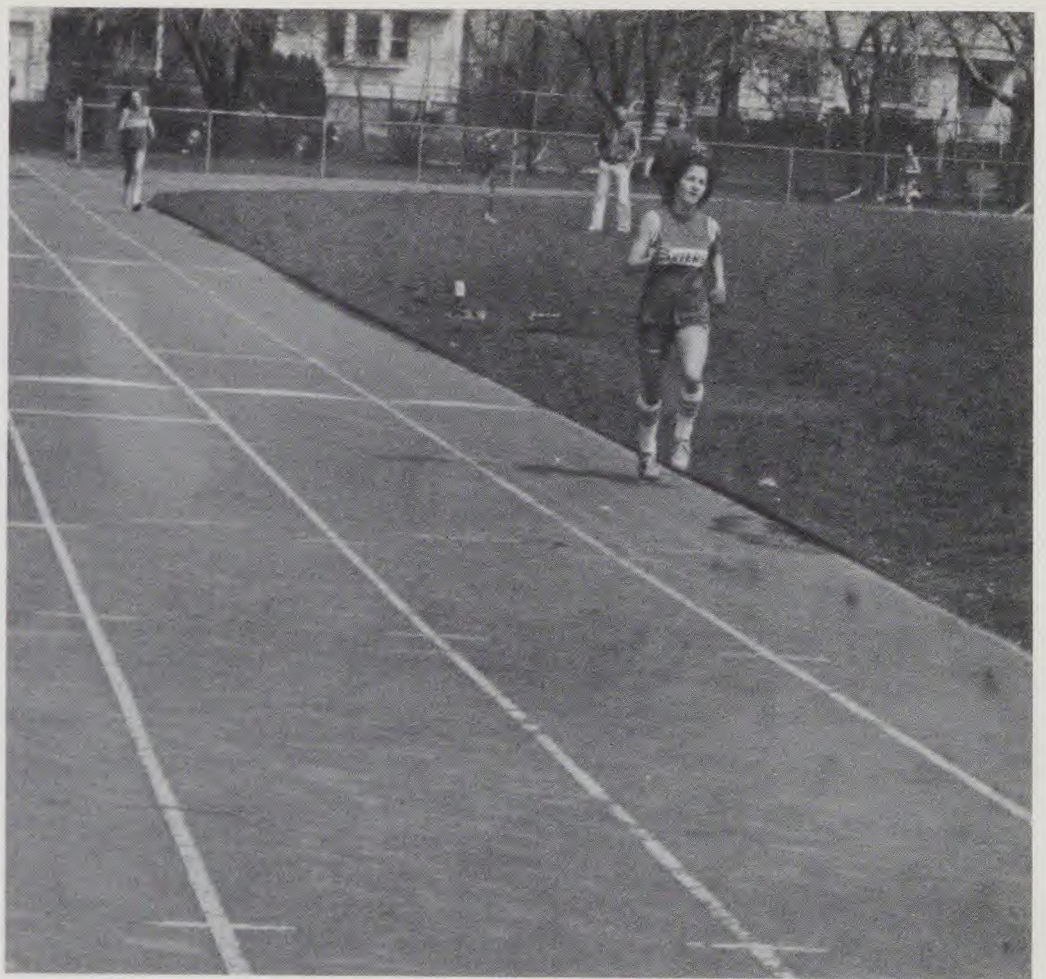

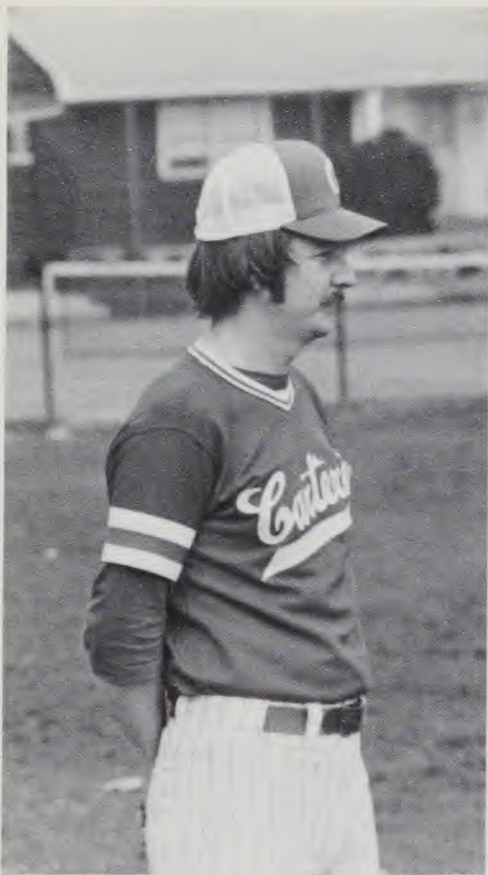

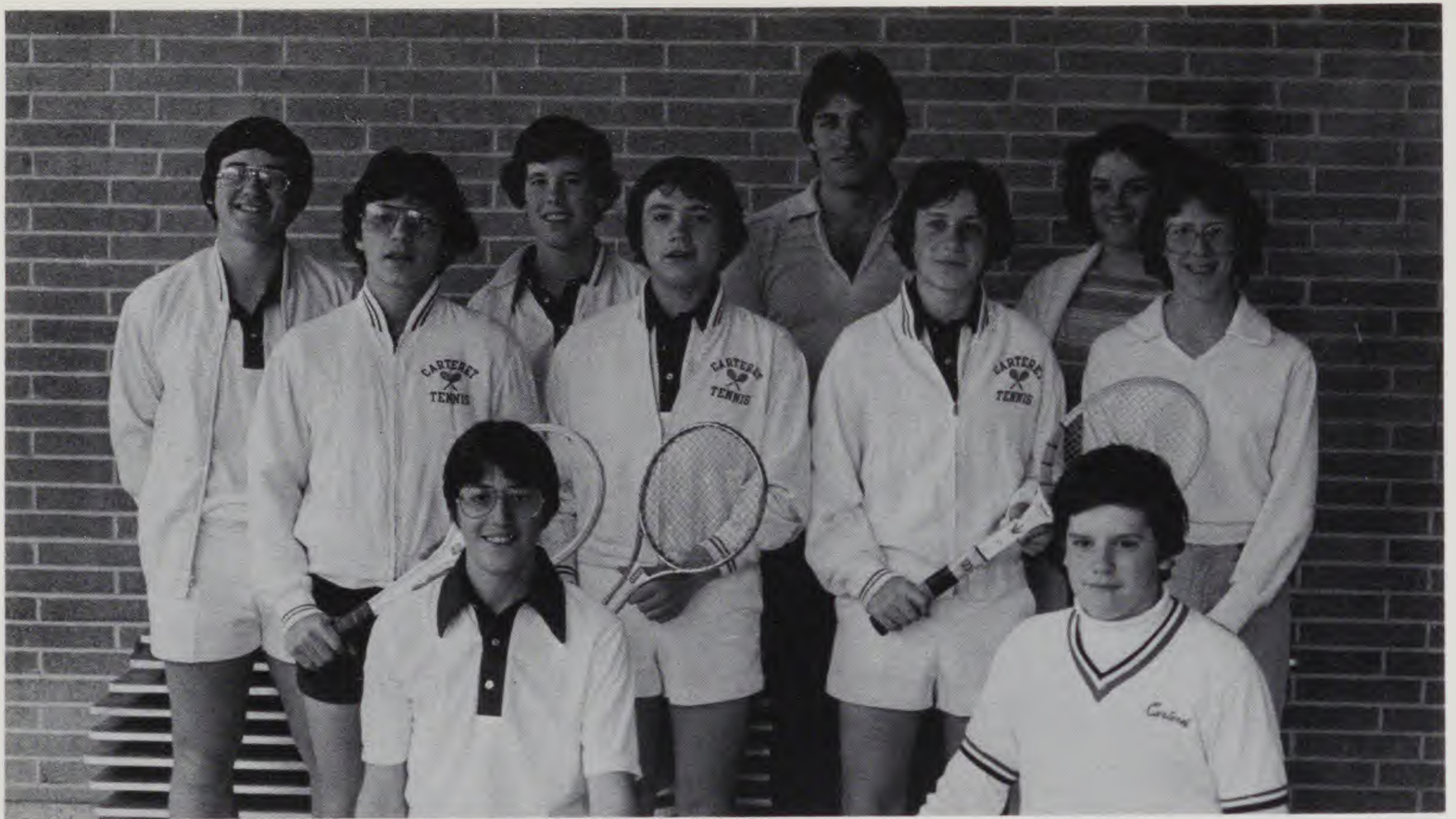

Steve Nelson was a member of the All-County Football Team as a center. He also participated on winter track and was a captain of the baseball team.

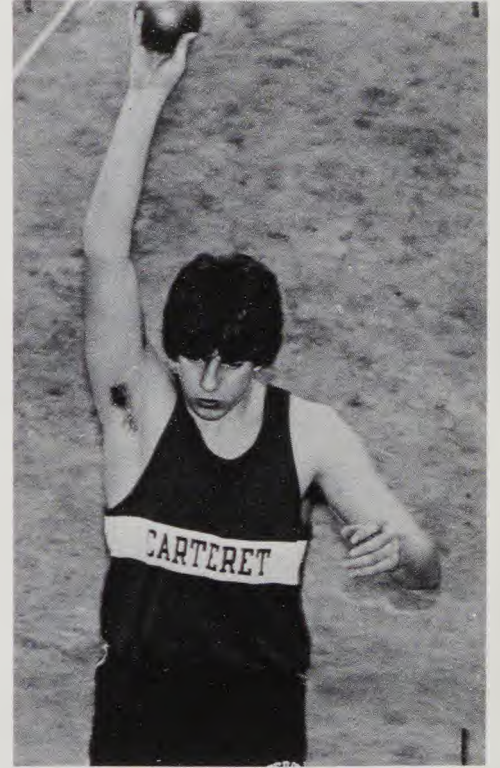

In order to be chosen as a "Scholar Athlete," each student must earn a varsity letter during the school year and be in the top ten percent of the class.

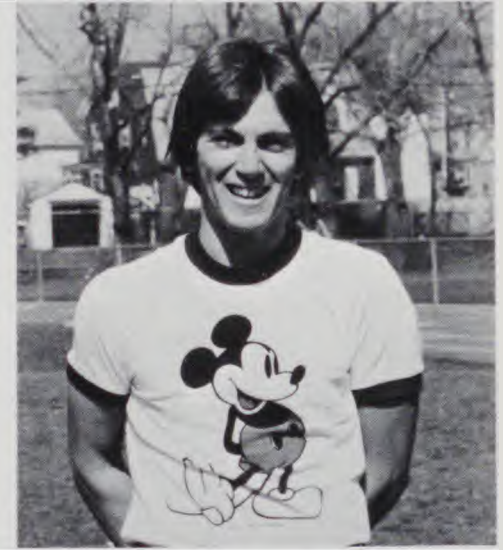

The final page is now being turned as the students in the Class of 1980 await graduation to complete the story. Although the future looms large before us, filled with promises of and hopes for laughter and love, we will always remember the moments spent at CHS. Whether they were good, bad, or just somewhere in between, they were four years of our lives — and sharing them made them very special.
