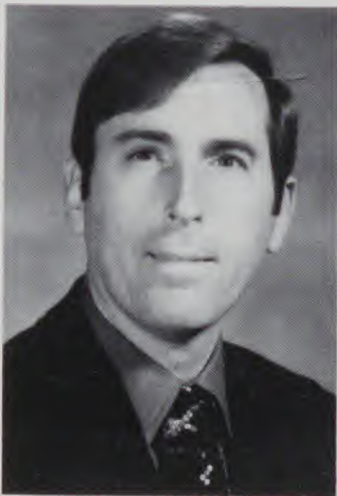


ONLY TIME WILL TELL

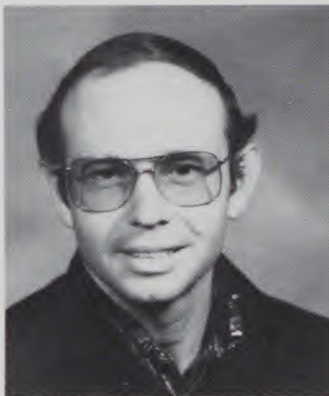
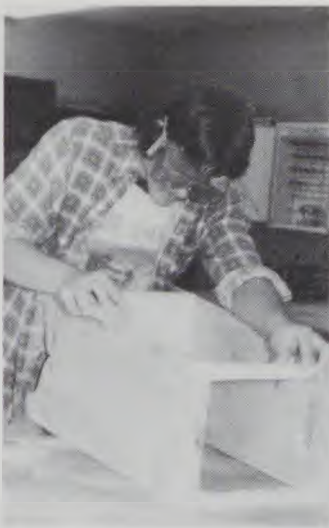
HITTING THE NAIL ON THE HEAD

The faculty conducting these classes are aware of the students' different needs and employ their knowledge to benefit the students.

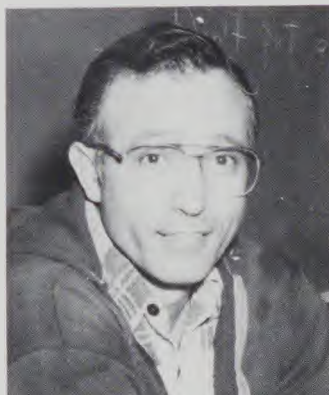

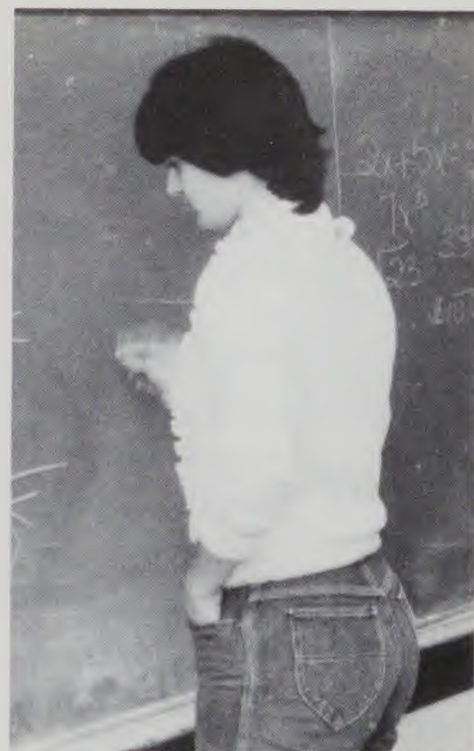
FROM CALCULATORS TO COMPUTERS

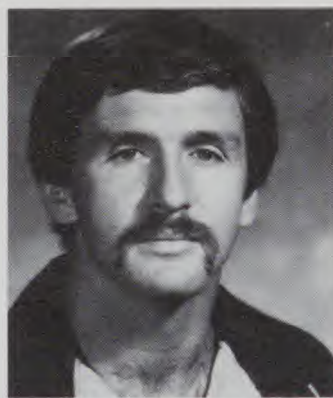
Driver Education courses equip the students to become careful, responsible drivers in teaching them to abide by the laws and regulations of the road.

The Health Education Department offers a specialized family living course which readies the students to become responsible parents in their future lives.

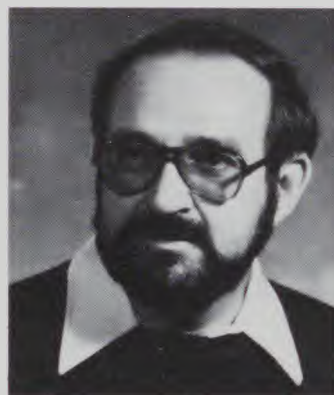
Finally, the Carteret High School C.P.R. crash unit was organized to give immediate assistance to students and staff in the event of cardiac arrest.

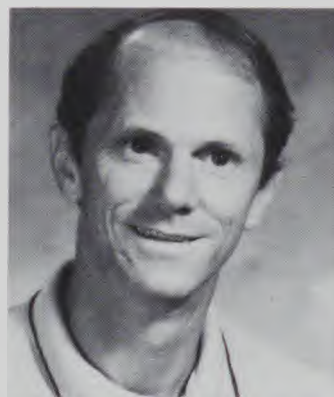

ALTERNATE SCHOOL

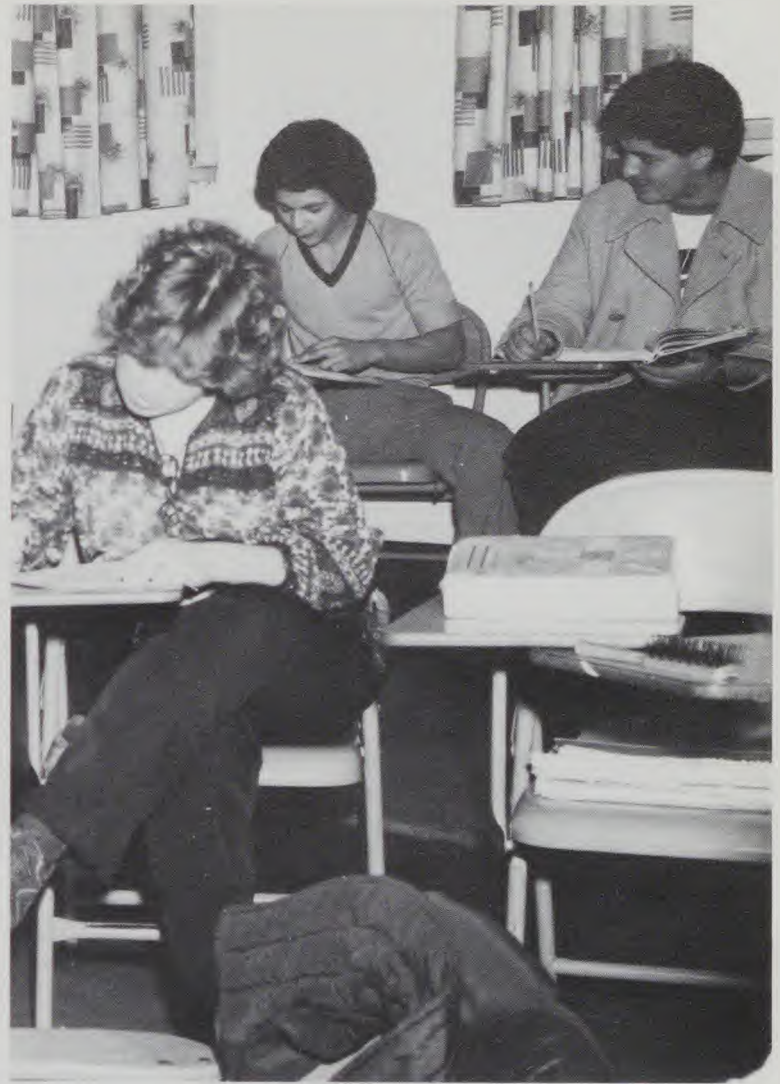


The Alternate School creates a successful learning environment for students who have a negative attitude towards school. It is a program that caters to the special needs of approximately thirty students.

As a result of The Alternate School program, there has been a definite improvement for the students in academic achievement and attendance.



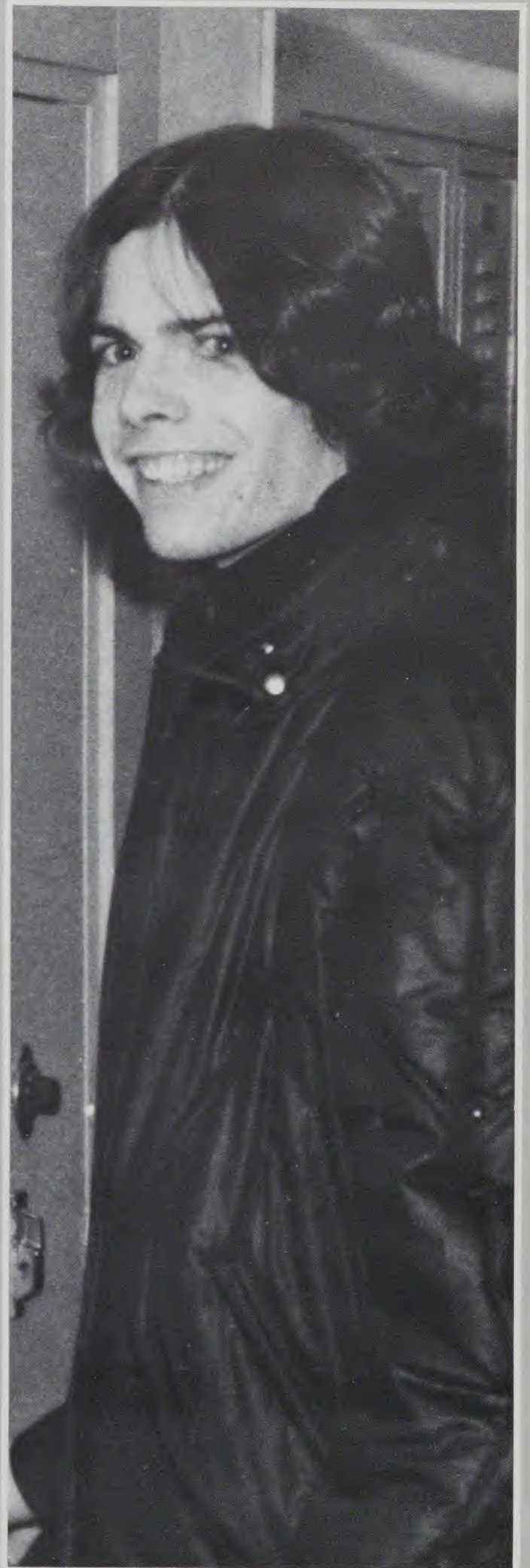
