Your four years in Carteret High School have marked a progress of growth and development leaving you with a firm foundation to venture forth into a challenging future.



ALTERNATE SCHOOL


The Alternate School creates a successful learning environment for students who have a negative attitude towards school. It is a program that caters to the special needs of approximately thirty students.

Mr. Nelson hopes this year's experience will prove valuable and make Carteret a contender for the championship next year!






