




THE STORY OF THE ARROW




Freshmen: Now

Reflecting: As Sophomores











The team spent much time practicing and preparing for the games. Not only did they practice on the field but they stayed late on Fridays watching tapes and building strategies for the game on the following day.



Q: What do you feel are the best qualities of a football player?







CROSS COUNTRY HAS UP AND DOWN SEASON

The 1986 Boy's Cross Country team, under the guidance of Head Coach Arthur Shadell, finished the season with a record of 4 wins and 5 losses.

Cross Country is an extremely difficult sport that involves a lot of dedication and hard work. The '86 Ramblers had these qualities, but despite their efforts, fell short of a winning season. After a roller coaster season of victory and defeat, they missed their goal by a single point.

Rather than dwell on the statistics, the harriers aimed toward post season competition instead. These final meets proved to be the best as the Ramblers, led by Lescinsky's 11th place, took 15th in the County Championships. Then, one week later, they came to Holmdel Park to run for the State Sectionals. Carteret took 10th place as a team and Lescinsky finished 7th overall. This was the highest ranking by Carteret in several years and Junior Jim Lescinsky has become the 1st Rambler to qualify for the state group meet since 1973.

Of special importance is the record set by Big Dan Aurelio and Big John McCrae in the Group II State Relay Championships. Their record of 104 feet combined distance was quite a feat.

The girl's Winter Track team was almost non-existant. The only members were shot-putters Lynn Marci and Thereza Kahora and high jumper and shot putter Coleen Sheerin.

Our boys are also Individual Group II State Champs. Medal winners in this meet were Aaron Conway, First in high jump; Dan Brucato, Second in High jump; Emile Hampton, Third in high jump, Third in hurdles, and Fifth in 400 M. run; Troy Chapman, Third in 400 M. run; Dan Aurelio, Fourth in shot nut

The season has certainly been a productive one for the Ramblers.







Despite many setbacks, the C.H.S. production of "I Remember Mama" was delightfully successful due to the hard work of a very strong cast.



Q: How do you feel about violence in today's society?




More Than Just An Ad
