


OFFICE OF THE SUPERINTENDENT






Is there life before Senior Year? For many, that seems like a good question. But ask any underclassman and he'll be quick to admit there is.





The restriction is necessary due to the valuable information provided by the course, which is essential in devising a methodological and analytical technique to perform an effective environmental research. Thus, the ERCies not only learn about their environment, but are also exposed to valuable laboratory experience.

CHEMISTRY OLYMPICS

This year the annual Chemistry Olympics Competition was held in April at New Jersey Institute of Technology. High schools from all over New Jersey were welcome and over twenty high schools participated. There were five categories and the CHS team participated in all five. The members did an extraordinary job in the following: Experimental Analysis; Project and Research Paper; Environmental Research; Computer Research; and Creative Lab Experiment. Mrs. Masterson and the Chemistry Olympics team upheld the winning tradition, just as in the past years.

THE PROJECT CLUB

A newly founded club, the Project Club, consists of a group of talented students interested in doing projects and entering them into competitions. The students (advised by Mrs. Masterson, Mr. Grobe, and Dr. Hricko) entered their projects in the Middlesex County Science Fair competition that was held on May 11, 1987. C.H.S. students did outstandingly well, placing first and second in each age group. It was definitely a landmark in the history of C.H.S. students' science awards.

With the guidance of Mrs. Masterson, Eun-Sook Ko presented a research paper and project on the cause and effects of toxic red tides. Melissa Vonah showed how sugar crystals grow in a gelatin mold. Joseph Bufano analyzed the effects of acid rain on vegetation. Kerry Rhodes tested the effect of certain compounds on steel. Larisa Hayduk and Pamela Healy compared the PH factor and chloride content of two different brands of shampoo. Anu Mehra experimented with various brands of toothpastes. Ares Silvero produced methane gas from inorganic matter. David Turco demonstrated the best conductor of electricity in a battery. And Tommy Chapman exhibited his entymology samples.

Under the aid of Mr. Grobe, Deserie Kelly showed how music affects the growth of various plants, and

Rosemary Polanin displayed her model of a DNA molecule as it appears in the cell nucleus.

Finally, supervised by Dr. Hricko, Kathy Healey modified a person's weight by an appropriate nutrition program. Kim Sullivan analyzed human emotions. 
THE INTERNATIONAL TRAVEL CLUB

The program will be hosted by Congressman Robert G. Torricelli.

The Model Constitutional Convention is part of our state's bicentennial celebration of New Jersey's ratification of the United States Constitution. The entire program has been funded by the New Jersey business community.








However, Carteret came back strong with a 34-6 win, just falling short of their magical margin of victory when they walked all over St. Pius.





My own personal goals entering the 1987 cross country season were to be undefeated in dual meets, win the GMC Title, and make it to the Meet of Champions.


Do you have any plans of furthering your running career?



I started playing basketball when I was about 7 at the clinics held in the grammar shools. As I grew older, I started to become more invilved in team playing and began to set my goals for the future.





What is your main philosophy as head coach?

What are your opinions about the team?










"LOCKER DECORATIONS"






